Carolyn Hine, put up \$480,000 to start favored Skip Away (Skip Trial) in the Classic, was already secondguessing himself. "I'm the first guy who admits I make mistakes and I think I made a mistake coming out (to Hollywood) as early as I did," said Hine, who shipped in Wednesday. "I should have probably brought this horse in Friday morning, galloped him once and run him. Horses don't seem to do well coming from the east to the west." Trainer D. Wayne Lukas, however, displayed his usual confidence. Of his morning-line favorite in the Distaff, Lukas said, "What can I say about her? She's Sharp Cat (Storm Cat)." The consummate Hollywood horseman sends out three in guest of his sixth win in the the Juvenile. He is highest on GI Futurity and GI Moet Champagne winner Grand Slam (Gone West). "We're very optimistic about this one--we love him," said Lukas. "We're going to lead him over with a great deal of confidence in the best race of the day." Trainer John Gosden sends out Decorated Hero (GB) (Warning {GB}) for the Mile: Gosden won the inaugural Mile at Hollywood with Decorated Hero's maternal granddam, Royal Heroine (Ire). But he will have Spinning World (Nureyev), second in the event last year, to beat this time. The Spinning World camp is upbeat. "We feel his chances are better this year because he's a fresher horse," said Alan Cooper, racing manager for the owners, the Niarchos family. "The campaign for a four-year-old isn't as tough as it is at three. He hasn't run since early September, and he runs well fresh." Trainer Pat Byrne, making his Breeders' Cup debut, has the early favorites in the Juvenile Fillies (Countess Diana (Deerhound)), Sprint (Richter Scale {*Habitony}) and Juvenile (Favorite Trick {Phone Trick}). "If I genuinely believe in my horses, and I do, the rest of the day is out of my control," said Byrne. "I'm still here to do my work. It's a busy day for us." The Breeders Cup will be televised live on NBC-TV

Can history repeat? Supplemental entry Wild Again won the very first Classic at Hollywood in 1984. This year's supplement **Skip Away** (Skip Trial), who stepped into the favorite's role with the defection of Gentlemen (Arg), romped in the Jockey Club Gold Cup in his latest. Last year's champion three-year-old has been on the board in 25 of 28 career starts, and first or second in six-of-eight at the Classic distance of a mile and a quarter. The Gold Cup has produced two Classic victors, but the Super Derby has produced three. This year's Super Derby champ **Deputy Commander** (Deputy Minister) is two-for-two at 10 furlongs and is the only horse in the field to race over this track, taking the GIII Affirmed H. in June and running second in the GII Swaps in July.

SINGSPIEL SURGERY A SUCCESS Singspiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}), who suffered a career-ending condylar fracture to his right front cannon bone Thursday, underwent surgery at Hollywood Park's equine clinic Friday morning. Dr. Larry Bramlage headed the surgical team which inserted two screws in the leg during a one-hour procedure. "The surgery and recovery went very well and he's ready to become a fine stallion," said Dr. Rick Arthur, president of the American Association of Equine Practitioners and a member of the team. "(The injury) is the same thing Flanders had. It's a fairly severe fracture...he may lose a little flexion in the ankle, and he may lose some mobility, but (Singspiel) should be fine. How long he stays here depends on where they want to ship him, but if it's back to England he could be here as late as the end of the year." The five-year-old, winner of the Japan Cup and Dubai World Cup, had been slated to make his final start in the Breeders' Cup Turf. He retires with nine wins and eight seconds from 20 starts and earnings of \$5,950,217.

AVERAGE UP AT FASIG-TIPTON KENTUCKY

Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Fall Mixed Sale got off to a strong start Friday as the open broodmares and horses of racing age session saw 128 individuals sell for a gross of \$572,200 and an average of \$4,470, up 18 percent from last year's \$3,801. Friday's highest-priced horse at \$26,000 was **Proudest Wonder** (Great Above), in foal to Binalong. The four-year-old was consigned by Mary Anne Parris (Winning Ways Farm), agent III, and was purchased by Ken Ellenberg's Cypress Farms. The sale continues at 10 a.m. Sunday with sessions including open weanlings, selected weanlings and selected broodmares. The first annual sale featuring mares in foal to Adena Springs Stallions will begin at 8 p.m. Monday.

CAITANO FOR JAPAN CUP; SWAIN OUT The German-trained three-year-old colt Caitano (GB) (Niniski) has been confirmed as a definite starter in the Japan Cup November 23. Trained by Bruno Schutz, who saddles Borgia (Ger) for today's Breeders' Cup Turf, Caitano won both the G1 Aral-Pokal in Germany in August and the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club in Italy October 19 on his last start. While Caitano will be in Tokyo, Godolphin's Swain (Ire) (Nashwan), winner of the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot in July, will miss the race due to a quarter crack which has handicapped his preparation. The five-year-old will winter in Dubai and will return to racing next year.

The star of this year's show was injured two days before the race. Without Singspiel (Ire), this is a wideopen event, with Canadian invader Chief Bearhart (Chief's Crown) finding himself the morning-line favorite. Four-for-six on the year and a decisive winner of the GI Canadian International in his most recent start, the chestnut could do no better than 11th on his home turf at Woodbine last year, when he was 20-1. This year's field is nowhere near as strong, however, and the colt, now four, has been worse than second at this distance only in his prior Breeders' Cup attempt. The European hopes rest on Borgia (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) to give her continent its fifth victory in the event, and her native country its first. If she doesn't bounce off her trying third-place finish in the Arc, she could become the first three-year-old filly to prevail in this race. The Arc has produced two Turf winners; neither was first in France.

You just never know where the winner of the Sprint will come from, and it is the Breeders' Cup race most likely to be won by a longshot--only three of the 13 winners have paid less than \$10. The lone three-yearold colt to take the race was also the longest-priced Sprint champ, 26-1 Sheikh Albadou (GB). These facts do not bode well for favored Richter Scale (*Habitony). Winner of the GII Jerome H. over fellow three-year-olds, the bay has been beaten only twice in six starts, but he finished off the board in both losses, and both were in his two tries in Grade I company. Exotic Wood (Rahy) could become the fourth distaffer to take the race. Ninefor-12 on her career, the five-year-old won her lone Grade I going a mile and an eighth, but she is four-forfive at six furlongs and, after a less than stellar start to this year's campaign, she came to hand with an impressive allowance win in 1:08 flat in her last October 8.

Every single past winner of the Juvenile Fillies has finished first or second in her previous start; the Frizette has been used as a springboard by the majority of JF winners--but never when the Breeders' Cup was held in California. Hollywood has produced the only two winners who went off at better than 6-1--27-1 Outstandingly in '84 and 30-1 Epitome in '87. This year's edition will feature plenty of speed, with no less than four of the runners wiring the field in their latest, including favored Countess Diana (Deerhound). She held on despite setting a torrid pace to win her two-turn debut, the GII Alcibiades, and has trained sharply since. But the bay has been beaten once and she faces her nemesis again here. Love Lock (Silver Ghost) handed Countess Diana a half-length defeat in the GIII Debutante at Churchill in June. Winless since, she has suffered more than her share of bad luck and has the right connections to turn it around for the big one. Trainer D. Wayne Lukas has three JF trophies to his credit; jockey Pat Day has
