### BUCKLAND MARE TAKES CENTER STAGE AT KEENELAND OPENER Meteor

Stage (Stage Door Johnny), a 15-year-old broodmare carrying a full sibling to GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Pleasant Stage (Pleasant Colony), topped the opening session of the 1997 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale which began Monday in Lexington. Part of the complete dispersal of the late Thomas Mellon Evans' Buckland Farm, Inc., with Lane's End as agent, the dark bay mare was purchased by John Magnier for \$825,000. "She will leave immediately for Europe and will go to Sadler's Wells (in 1998)," said Demi O'Byrne, agent for Magnier. Bringing a bid of \$810,000 Monday was the six-year-old mare Stellarina (Pleasant Colony), in foal to Woodman. The multiple-stakes winner of \$522,391 was consigned by Adena Springs, agent; she was purchased by Robert Clay of Three Chimneys Farm after a spirited bidding war with Gainesway Farm owner Graham Beck. "She had a lot of class," said Clay. "She was a good race mare and out of a good race mare. She really tried hard every time. Plus I had a partner who was very, very keen to get her. I was hoping I wouldn't have to go that high, but my good friend Graham Beck kept giving me trouble. We just had to work a little harder to get her." The third highest price of the day came in for Lilac Garden (Roberto), the dam of one of this year's top three-year-old fillies, Blushing K.D. (Blushing John). In foal to Deputy Minister and consigned by Foxfield, the 11-year-old mare attracted a final bid of \$700,000 from The Thoroughbred Corp. "I thought it would go between \$800,000 and \$1 million," said Dick Mulhall, who represents The Thoroughbred Corp. "You've got to put the whole package together. She's in foal to Deputy Minister, which is the hottest stallion in the world right now. She's also the dam of Blushing K.D., who was a very, very good filly. We plan on keeping the foal." Blushing K.D. won this year's GI Kentucky Oaks and eight of her 10 career starts for earnings of \$918,900.

### MONDAY AT KEENELAND NOVEMBER

A total of 297 horses sold for an aggregate \$36,598,000 during Monday's Keeneland opener. In addition, one share in the 20-year-old stallion **Nureyev** (Northern Dancer), sire of Breeders' Cup Mile winner Spinning World and nearly 100 stakes winners, sold for \$125,000. The first session average was \$123,226, and the median was \$75,000. Last year's opener, which was held on a Sunday, saw 220 hips sell for \$27,998,000, an average of \$127,264. This year's 12-day auction continues this morning at 10 a.m., and runs through November 21.

SINGSPIEL TO DALHAM HALL STUD International superstar Singspiel (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}), North America's champion turf horse of 1996 and winner of the Dubai World Cup, G1 Japan Cup, G1 Canadian International, G1 Coronation Cup and G1 Juddmonte International who had hoped to add the GI Breeders' Cup Turf to his resume before suffering a condylar fracture during a workout Thursday morning, will return to England to stand the 1998 breeding season at Dalham Hall Stud in Newmarket. The five-year-old is recovering from surgery to repair the fracture in California. He retires with a record of nine wins and eight seconds from 20 starts and earnings of \$5,950,217 and will stand for a fee of £25,000 (approximately \$42,110).

FOXFIELD MARE TOPS FASIG-TIPTON KENTUCKY SELECTED BROODMARES The graded-stakes producer Intently (Drone), in foal to Gulch, brought a final bid of \$320,000 to top the Selected Broodmare session of the 1997 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Fall Mixed Sale, held Sunday evening at Newton Paddocks in Lexington. Consigned by Foxfield, the 14-year-old dam of GSW Gone For Real (Gone West) was purchased by Mike Ryan, agent. The second highest price of the day came in for MGSW Careless Heiress (Runaway Groom), in foal to Crafty Prospector. The four-year-old filly, consigned by Muirfield Ventures and Sibling Stable with Muirfield East as agent, was bought by Gallagher's Stud for \$295,000. A total of 67 hips brought an aggregate \$2,821,600 for an average of \$42,113. The average was down 17 percent from last year's corresponding session, when 51 broodmares sold for \$2,591,000, an average of \$50,804.

PILSUDSKI TOPS JAPAN CUP SHORT LIST The final list of horses invited to this year's Japan Cup, to be held November 23 in Tokyo, was released yesterday. Topping the invitations was Pilsudski (Ire) (Polish Precedent), winner of the 1996 Breeders' Cup Turf and the G1 Coral-Eclipse S., G1 Irish Champion S. and G1 Dubai Champion S. this year. Also set to represent Europe are Astarabad (Alleged), Caitano (GB) (Niniski), Mons (GB) (Deploy {GB}) and Oscar Schindler (Ire) (Royal Academy). Val's Prince (Eternal Prince), winner of the GI Turf Classic and eighth in the Breeders' Cup Turf, will be the lone horse from the U.S. in this year's edition of the race, and Ebony Grosve (NZ) (Grosvenor {NZ}), will be the only runner from

Oceania. All of the invitees will arrive in Japan between November 11-13, and will move to Tokyo

#### BREEDERS' CUP CHAMPS ARRIVE IN

Racecourse after five days in guarantine.

FLORIDA Three of Saturday's Breeders' Cup winners, Classic champ Skip Away (Skip Trial), Juvenile Fillies winner Countess Diana (Deerhound) and Juvenile hero Favorite Trick (Phone Trick), arrived at Gulfstream Park yesterday. All three have finished their 1997 campaigns, but will race again next year. "We'll give him a little time off," said Pete Johnson, assistant to trainer Sonny Hine, of Skip Away. "You really can't let him down all the way. If you don't train him, he gets too high. That's how horses hurt themselves." Johnson added the colt will be pointed for the GI Gulfstream Park H. February 28 as his first start of 1998. As for the two-year-olds, trainer Pat Byrne said, "I'll probably send them to Ocala for about six weeks of rest. My plans are for the Florida Derby (March 14) for Favorite Trick. Maybe not the entire series, but definitely the Florida Derby. Our main concern will be getting him ready for the Kentucky Derby. I basically have the same plan for Countess Diana--the three-year-old filly series at Gulfstream with our main interest the Kentucky Oaks."

BREEDERS' CUP RATINGS DROP The Blood-Horse Interactive Daily Edition reported yesterday that the overnight A.C. Nielsen ratings from the 38 largest markets for this year's telecast of the Breeders' Cup indicated the program drew the smallest audience in its 14-year history. The 1997 broadcast earned a 2.5 rating and a 6-percent market share. Last year, the Breeders' Cup's overnight rating was 3.0 with an 8-percent share, which was down from a 3.3 rating and 9-percent share in 1995. Final ratings will be released November 13.
