ALYWOW TOPS KEENELAND AT \$1.25

MILLION Alywow (Alysheba--Triple Wow, by Coastal), Horse of the Year and champion three-yearold filly and grass horse in Canada, wowed onlookers at vesterday's second session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale when she brought a final bid \$1,250,000. The six-year-old mare, in foal to Mr. Prospector, was consigned by Lane's End, agent and purchased by Curragh Bloodstock Agency and Patricia O'Kelly. "It's very exciting to get a chance at a Mr. Prospector," said O'Kelly, as she stood in the hallway and was greeted by a host of well wishers. "She'll stay over for a year to foal. We've got to take great care of what she has inside. After that, she'll go to Kildare. She'll go to Ireland." All told, it was a very exciting day at the Keeneland sales pavilion. When all the hammering was done and the auctioneer's chant was just echoing in the night air, six Thoroughbreds had been purchased for \$1 million or more. In all, 270 horses were sold yesterday for \$58,088,000--that's up 25.8 percent from a year ago when 263 horses sold for \$46,147,500. The average price of \$215,141 rose 22.6 percent from last year's figure of \$175,466. The median price of \$160,000 rose 33.3 percent from \$120,000 at last year's second session. After the first two days of this year's 12-day sale, 567 horses have sold for \$94,686,000. The average for the two sessions is \$166,995 and the cumulative median price is \$100,000. "This is a tremendous horse sale," said bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell. One of Bell's client's Jayeff B Stables, purchased multiple graded stakes winning Chaposa Springs (Baldski--La Chaposa {Per}, by Ups), in foal to Seeking the Gold, for \$1,100,000. "There are mares that are appealing. There are some very nice weanlings. And, there are a lot of people here looking. That makes it very interesting," Bell added. As for plans for Chaposa Springs, Bell said, "We really haven't made a final decision yet, but we're thinking about Gone West." The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

VELASQUEZ TO ANNOUNCE RETIREMENT

Jorge Velasquez, the sixth leading rider of all time, will announce his retirement during ceremonies to be held at Aqueduct Racecourse November 22. "I've been riding for more than 30 years," he said. "Don't you think that's enough?" Velasquez has not yet decided exactly when he will retire, but is certain that the 22nd will be his last day at Aqueduct. He would like to make a brief tour of racetracks around the country. The Panamanian native is officially credited with 6,793 wins, but he believes that that figure does not include most of his overseas winners. His career highlights include victories aboard Pleasant Colony in the 1981 Kentucky Derby and Preakness; a then-record 57 stakes victories in 1985; election to the Racing Hall of Fame in 1990; a nationwide leading 438 winners in 1967; and New York riding titles in 1971, 1972, 1974, 1976 and 1978.

FIRST ANNUAL ADENA SPRINGS SALE A

SUCCESS The first annual sale featuring mares in foal to Adena Springs stallions was held at Fasig-Tipton's Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky Monday evening. After dinner was served, the sale began, with the four-year-old broodmare Yes Dear (Allen's Prospect), in foal to Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Lit de Justice, bringing the night's top price of \$75,000. The stakes-placed mare was purchased by Stonerside Stable. Other buyers at the sale included Brereton C. Jones, agent; John Franks; and Buzz Chace, agent, "It was a great looking group of horses that were extremely well turned out." Chace said. Overall, 86 mares were offered and sold for a gross of \$1,581,500 and an average of \$18,390. All broodmares were offered without reserves or buy backs.

ECLIPSE AWARDS DINNER The 1997 Horse of the Year will be announced at the Thoroughbred Racing Associations 27th annual Eclipse Awards Dinner on February 10 at the Westin Million Hills Resort in Rancho Mirage, California. Ballots for the Eclipse Awards will be mailed to voters on December 17 and must be returned to the TRA auditors by January 5. All divisional winners and the three leading vote-getters for Horse of the Year will be announced Thursday, January 8.

DAY ONE

Every fifteen minutes at Keeneland Monday, a horse went through the ring for \$300,000; once an hour something sold for half a million-plus. I left the front with 25 left to sell--so you can almost certainly add a couple to this total--30 horses had sold for \$300,000+, of which 11 had brought \$500,000 or more ... The Buckland Dispersal, obviously, was going to be strong, and it accounted for eleven of the 30 \$300,000+ sales, but perhaps the surprising thing is that there were 19 other horses from various consignments worth that kind of money.

A diversified group of buyers, too. Ahmed Salman, in good form as ever at the head of a delegation from The Thoroughbred Corporation including Dick Mulhall and Willie Carson, was in action, buying six, including Blushing K.D.'s dam, Lilac Garden, from Foxfield, as well as a Tabasco Cat colt for \$375,000 ... Dallas buyer Gerald Ford was big in the foal market, including Capote fillies early and late for \$310,000 and \$500,000 (the day's high for a foal) respectively ... also on the score sheet for the big numbers were the likes of John Magnier, Farish and Kilroy, Seth Hancock, John Gaines, Graham Beck's Gainesway ... you get the drift ... Airlie Stud's Sonia Rogers and son, General Manager and bon vivant Tony signed twice for \$350,000 mares with serious paper ... 22 of the 30 sold for \$300,000 + were mares, four were horses of racing age, four weanlings.

BOXCAR NUMBERS AT KEENELAND CONTINUE

DAY TWO

Monday a horse sold at Keeneland every fifteen minutes for \$300,000+, and once an hour for a half-million or more. As expected (after that), the buyers really stepped on the gas on Tuesday ... it sort of reminded me of ... well, let's just say the buyers were pretty fearless. With 50 hips left to go Tuesday night, 52 horses had sold for \$300,000 or more during the day--about one every ten minutes. There were 21 at a half-million or more, and six mares sold for prices ranging from \$1-million to \$1,250,000. Every twenty-two minutes a horse went through the Keeneland sale ring valued at a half-million dollars or more. It's awesome, when you think about it.

Tuesday's seven-figure mares are bound, naturally, for Europe, Anerica, and Japan ... the Japanese have been very active mare buyers at all levels from \$100,000 and up ... Almost completely shut out so far: bottom-fishers. Oh, a few have slipped through the cracks, but not very far -- only to 'sensible' prices. On the whole prices are running as much as 50% higher than anticipated, and not just anticipated by me... It is a hugely strong sale...

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

In terms of sire lines, Saturday's Breeders' Cup Championship Day was virtually a shutout by Nearctic. Of seven Breeders' Cup winners, one was by a son of Northern Dancer (Nureyev), two by grandsons (Chief's Crown, Deerhound) and one by a great-grandson (Strawberry Road {Aus}). The less-trumpeted branch of the Nearctic line--that via Northern Dancer's three-quarters genetic relative Icecapade--struck twice through Icecapade's son, Wild Again, and his grandson, Phone Trick. The shining exception was Damascus, whose grandson, Skip Trial, ran away with the Classic.

We have already touched on most of these in earlier articles, but a brief review of each won't go amiss. Skip Away (c, 4, Skip Trial--Ingot Way, by Diplomatic Way) has Mahmoud 5 x 5, including on the zig-zag of his sire, and his dam is inbred to Nasrullah, who is out of a three-parts-sister to Mahmoud. Through Damascus, he also carries My Babu, who is somewhat related to Never Bend (one of the Nasrullah sources in Skip Away's dam), and who is out of Perfume II, a very close relative to Nasrullah.

The Breeders' Cup Turf winner Chief Bearhart (c, 4, Chief's Crown--Amelia Bearhart, by Bold Hour) is a reminder of the fact that his deceased sire was a really effective sire of turf horses. Chief's Crown was out of a Secretariat mare, and Chief Bearhart is inbred 4 x 3 to Secretariat's sire, Bold Ruler. Inbreeding to Bold Ruler seems to have worked extremely well when Secretariat is involved, and another sire out of a Secretariat mare who works with the same pattern in Gone West. Actually, Chief Bearhart has something else in common with Gone West, as his granddam, Myrtlewood Lass, is a half-sister to Gone West's sire, Mr. Prospector. We might also note that Mr. Prospector sired GI winner Classic Crown out of Chief's Crown's dam, so Chief Bearhart should suit Mr. Prospector mares when he retires to stud.

In the Juvenile Fillies, Countess Diana (f, 2, Deerhound--T.V. Countess, by T.V. Commercial) was devastating. After a somewhat hesitant beginning, Danzig has enjoyed a great year as a sire of sires, and, of course, Deerhound is from the "hot" Lassie Dear branch of the Uvira II family of A.P. Indy and Honor Grades (Deerhound's three-parts brother).

Countess Diana is inbred 3 x 4 to Northern Dancer, but has two balancing influences in Alibhai and T.V. Lark. As we have mentioned many times, Alibhai is bred on very similar lines to Lady Angela, the dam of Nearctic, and he turns up in about 10% of all stakes winners from the Danzig male line. T.V. Lark is by a grandson of Nearco (sire of Nearctic) and his dam is a three-parts sister to Lady Angela.

In terms of dominance over a division, Favorite Trick (c, 2, Phone Trick--Evil Elaine, by Medieval Man), winner of the Juvenile, is clearly Horse of the Year. From baby races in April to a mile and a sixteenth in November, he never put a foot wrong, winning in the Midwest, the East and finally, the West. For those who are interested in the positions of duplications in pedigrees, we will note that Favorite Trick has Bull Lea on the zig-zag of both sire and dam. Favorite Trick has some similarities with Countess Diana in that Lady Angela and a genetic relative are combined. This time the genetic relative is Star Kingdom, who is in the male line of Favorite Trick's dam. Lady Angela is a daughter of Hyperion and her dam is by a son of Tracery out of a Swynford mare. Star Kingdom is by a son of Hyperion and her granddam is by a son of Tracery out of a Swynford mare.

Favorite Trick's fellow Icecapade scorer was the Sprint hero Elmhurst (h, 7 Wild Again--Mimbet, by Raise a Native). The dam is a three-parts sister to Alydar, and there seems to be something of an affinity between Alydar's family and Wild Again. Sweet Tooth, the third dam of Elmhurst, is also third dam of Wildly Joyous and Bright Again (graded stakes winner by Wild Again), while Wild Again has sired graded stakes winners out of mares by Alydar and his son Alysheba.

Alydar also appeared as the broodmare sire of Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Ajina (f, 3, Strawberry Road {Aus}--Winglet, by Alydar). This represents the Nijinsky II/Alydar cross which has also produced graded stakes winners Alydeed, Destiny Dance, Green Darlin and Miss Huff n' Puff. It's no surprise to see Nijinksy II and Alydar working together, since Bull Page, the broodmare sire of Nijinsky II, is a three-quarters genetic relative to Real Delight, the third dam of Alydar. In addition, Alydar is by a son of Native Dancer, and Nijinsky II has a daughter of that horse.

Another cross with an excellent strike rate is the one which produced Mile victor Spinning World (c, 4, Nureyev--Imperfect Circle, by Riverman). There have actually been eight individual stakes winners by Nureyev out of Riverman mares, two more by Nureyev out of Irish River mares, and one by Nureyev's son Theatrical (Ire) out of a Riverman mare.
