EDDIE ARCARO DEAD AT 81 Hall of Famer Eddie Arcaro, the only jockey to ride two Triple Crown winners, lost his battle with cancer yesterday, passing away at his home in Miami, Florida, He was 81. Arcaro, who won 4,779 races before retiring in 1961, started at the bottom in "Sport of Kings," mucking stalls for trainer Otis Clellan at the age of 14. By 1932, the Cincinnati, Ohio native was riding races. He captured the first of his five Kentucky Derbies in 1938, piloting Lawrin to victory on the first Saturday in May at Churchill Downs. His first Triple Crown win came in 1941 with Whirlaway. Arcaro also won the "Run for the Roses" with Hoop Jr. in 1945, with his second Triple Crown champ Citation in 1948, and with Hill Gail in 1952. The leading jockey in money won in 1940, '42, '48, '50, '52 and '55, he also captured six Preakness Stakes and six Belmont Stakes. He was inducted in racing's Hall of Fame in 1958. Arcaro married his long-time companion, Vera, in late 1995, and the two lived at the Jockey Club in Miami. Funeral arrangements will be announced.

**GRAND SLAM RECOVERING** The connections of GI Futurity and GI Moet Champagne winner **Grand Slam** (Gone West) are very encouraged by the recovery of their star two-year-old, who underwent surgery Sunday, November 9 to repair severe lacerations to his left hind leg suffered during the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "He's really doing well," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas. "His blood count is excellent. We're really much more optimistic than we were just a few days ago." The colt is scheduled to van to Lukas' Westerly Farm in Santa Ynez, California today.

GI Turf Classic victor Val's Prince (Eternal Prince), eighth in the Breeders' Cup Turf last out, and Mid-America Triple winner Honor Glide (Honor Grades), eighth in the Breeders' Cup Classic, have been invited to the 1 1/8-mile International Cup; GII Del Mar Derby and Lone Star Derby hero Anet (Clever Trick) and GIII Hawthorne Gold Cup winner Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), fourth in the Breeders' Cup Turf, have been asked to run in the seven-furlong International Bowl; Maxzene (Cozzene), a multiple graded-stakes winner and runnerup in the GI Flower Bowl Invitational and GI Beverly D. this year, is the lone American invitee to the 1 1/2-mile International Vase, But trainer Tom Skiffington said from Gulfstream yesterday, "I'm going to run Maxzene in the Matriarch at Hollywood (Nov. 30) and then bring her (to Gulfstream) for the Orchid H. (March 8)." Negotiations to reach a simulcasting agreement between the Thoroughbred and Standardbred industries in Maryland have reached an impasse which will disrupt simulcasting in the state when the current agreement expires at midnight tonight. Beginning Sunday, there will be no afternoon simulcasting at Rosecroft, no evening simulcasting after 6:15 p.m. at Laurel, Pimlico or Maryland OTB facilities, and no afternoon harness simulcasting or evening Thoroughbred simulcasting anywhere in Maryland. The Facilities Use Agreement has set Maryland's simulcasting policies since April, 1993; the current dispute centers around the division of revenue derived from nighttime Thoroughbred simulcasting. The Maryland Jockey Club, one of three parties from the Thoroughbred industry, has called for parties from both sides to submit to binding arbitration immediately to resolve the situation.

### **ADOPTION MADE EASY**

Finding the perfect horse may only be a mouse click away, thanks to ROAN, or the Racehorse Outplacement Assistance Network, a national on-line list of racehorses in need of good homes. Recognizing that Thoroughbreds excel in a variety of post-racing careers, including polo, dressage, show jumping and police work, ROAN hopes to bridge the communications gap between the person seeking a new horse and the owner who wishes to ensure his or her retired racehorse is placed in loving hands.

Pat Calloway, an Arizona Thoroughbred owner who does freelance web page design and contributes regularly to Prodigy's Horse Racing Community, developed ROAN. Calloway owns four horses as part of an on-line racing partnership called the Cyberspace Racing Team, three runners and one broodmare.

"There are a lot of racing people who would like to find good homes for horses and there sure are a lot of people out there looking for an inexpensive horse," Calloway explained. "On a trip to Saratoga in August, a friend and I talked to a well-known trainer who offered her a horse. It came to me that if we formed something where we could network on the Internet, that perhaps we could match up those folks looking for a horse with those who wanted to place an ex-racehorse in a good home."

The ROAN website features the flyer that Calloway and her volunteers are distributing at racetracks all across the country. A working version of the site was put on the Web September 15 and can be accessed at http://pages.prodigy.com/equinerescue/roan.htm. The site will include a list of available horses, a brief description of them, and who to contact for additional information.

It is ROAN's hope that the list will be printed and distributed at racetracks, barns, tack and feed stores-wherever horse people meet. Calloway also hopes that the list will be sent to other equine rescue Web sites for incorporation into their programs. "It's a way of networking to get the word out about horses that are available across the country rather than relying just on word of mouth," she explained.

Calloway plans to have a network of "insider" volunteers in each state who will have access to the racetracks' backstretches, where they can talk to trainers and owners about the option that ROAN offers them.

"We're starting with volunteers in New York, Southeastern Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Kentucky, Arizona and Maryland," said Calloway. "We want to work out any bugs before we start adding more states, but we do have a lot of volunteers from the Equine Rescue Mailing list (an all-breed on-line rescue group) who will help in other states as well."

ROAN representatives will not be involved in negotiations between horse owner and horse purchaser. "We recommend pricing the horses around \$1,000 or so just to eliminate the possibility of slaughter sales," Calloway explained. "Ultimately, that's up to the owner. I think most owners are savvy enough to realize that possibility is out there."

\* \* \*

The Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, founded in 1982 to provide homes for former racehorses, has also initiated a private adoption program. TRF had traditionally provided retirement homes for Thoroughbreds at its own and satellite farms in Connecticut, Kentucky, Maryland, New Jersey and New York.

Three horses, a 17-year-old mare named Decka, a 15-year-old gelding named How About Now and sixyear-old Speedy Prankster, are the first to be placed in adoptive homes. Decka and How About Now were adopted by Marianne and Don Richards of upstate New York. Speedy Prankster has been adopted by Nick Piper, who learned to care for horses while a resident at the Charles Hickey Jr. Correctional School for youth in Baltimore. Piper, who has been released from the Hickey School, now works full time at a riding center in Maryland and plans to train his new horse as a hunter/jumper.

"We have taken great care to ensure that the horses will enjoy the same standard of care that we provide at our own retirement facilities," said Diana Pikulski, the TRF's executive director. "Applicants are advised at the outset that someone from the TRF may visit the stabling site before adoption and also make periodic visits to confirm the horse's continued wellbeing after placement. Reports from the horse's veterinarian are mandatory and are another way of ensuring that each horse we place is healthy and happy. Also, no horse now retired with the TRF will be adopted without the permission of its former owners and, from now on, owners will be asked whether adoption is acceptable." Through an agreement with The Jockey Club's Performance Horse Registry, the TRF will also register its adoptees with the PHR. Adopters will receive PHR certificates of their horses' five-generational pedigree, have access to Jockey Club records on their horses, and will be eligible to enter their horses in the PHR's Silver Stirrup Awards Program, which recognizes the performance of Thoroughbreds and half-Thoroughbreds in equestrian sports.
