

REVOOUE RETIRED Revogue (Ire) (Fairy King--La Bella Fontana {Ire}, by Lafontaine), Europe's champion two-year-old of 1996, has been retired from racing and will stand the 1998 breeding season at Gay O'Callaghan's Morristown Lattin Stud in County Kildare, Ireland, O'Callaghan is reported to have purchased a 50percent share in the three-year-old bay from the colt's owner Robert Sangster. Revoque was unbeaten in four starts at two, capturing the G1 Prix de la Salamandre and G1 Grand Criterium. At three, the colt finished a fast-closing second in the G1 English 2,000 Guineas but was unplaced as the favorite in the Irish equivalent. In his final start. Revogue finished fifth in the G1 Dubai Champion S. He retires with five wins in 10 starts and earnings of \$411,852. Revogue's stud fee has been set at £7,500 (\$11,336).

BAY MEADOWS CONCLUDES FALL MEET The 1997 Bay Meadows racing season ended Sunday with the San Mateo track showing a substantial increase in daily average mutuel handle. The meet was highlighted by a North California record for total mutuel handle on a single day when \$7,314,351 was bet at the track on Breeders' Cup Day. Daily average handle for the 107day meet was \$3,357,550, up 7.6 percent over 1996's 98-day season. The key contributor to that figure was out-of-state handle, which was up 26.6 percent to nearly \$1.2 million per day. "While we obviously are thrilled with support our races received from patrons at all locations in Southern California and outside of California, we were partricularly pleased that New Yorkers on occasion wagered more on the Bay Meadows card than they did on the Southern California card the same afternoon," said Bay Meadows President Jack Liebau. Daily attendance at the track was down approximately 1.5 percent.

KEENELAND RESULTS Figures remained up as Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale continued with its ninth session in Lexington, Kentucky vesterday. During the session, 230 horses were sold for a total of \$3,898,000--up 6.2 percent from last year's corresponding day when 257 horses sold for \$3,669,800. The average price rose 6.2 percent, from \$14,279 in 1996 to \$16,948 this year. The median price of \$12,000 represented a 23.7 percent increase over last year's figure of \$9,700. Top price of Wednesday's session was paid for hip number 3110. Due Bill (Relaunch). The seven-year-old mare, in foal to Mountain Cat, was consigned by Glencoe Farm, agent, and brought a final bid of \$125,000 from Bill Tracy, agent. Through nine sessions, Keeneland has sold 2,454 horses for an aggregate of \$207,470,000 and an average of \$84,544. The sale continues through Friday.

Three-year-old filly **Igreja** (Arg) (Southern Halo) established herself as the hot favorite for next month's G1 Fillies Guineas after a superb five-and-a-half length success in Saturday's G2 \$20,758 Odessa Stud Fillies Championship over seven furlongs at Kenilworth in South Africa. Starting at odds of 1-3, Igreja, owned by Des Scott and his Irish partners Diane Nagle and Susan Magnier and trained by Geoff Woodruff, raced in third until the straight, when she swept into the lead and ran on to beat Marlagain (Saf) (Man of Property {SAf}), with Tetre Rouge (Saf) (French Stress) third.



Local News, Suffolk Downs:

Locally based **Maybe Jack** (Classic Account) became the nation's winningest horse so far in 1997 when he captured his 11th race of the year on Nov. 11 at the Meadowlands. Three horses are tied with 10 wins apiece. Last year, Maybe Jack raced nine times, but only found his way to the winner's circle on one occasion. His record improved dramatically this year. Among his 11 wins from 21 starts, the four-year-old captured Suffolk's Bruce G. Smith Memorial S., was second or third in five starts and earned \$127,530. WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

The combination of genetic relatives Storm Bird/Nijinsky II, Storm Bird/The Minstrel and Nijinsky II/The Minstrel is gaining momentum. The GIII Stuyvesant H. at Belmont Saturday resulted in a first stakes win for Delay of Game (g, 4, Summer Squall--Wimbledon, by Blushing Groom {Fr}). Delay of Game is by a son of Storm Bird and his second dam is by Nijinsky II, so the pair appear 2x3. This is the second graded stakes winner for Summer Squall bred on this pattern. The first, his Champion Two-Year-Old Filly Storm Song, had Storm Bird and The Minstrel 2x3. These crosses are just about as close as one would dare try, and it is only in the last year or two that the relatives have receded far enough back into pedigrees to make combining them feasible. We don't have any statistics with regard to success related to opportunity, but our feeling is that these are just the beginning signs of a combination which is going to be extremely successful. We should also mention that Delay of Game has another of our favorite combinations. In his sire we find Tom Fool, and in his dam we have Tom Fool's genetic relatives Flaming Page and Spring Run.

The Tom Fool/Flaming Page combination is also found in the pedigree of **Misty Hour** (**f**, **2**, **Miswaki--Our Tina Marie**, **by Nijinsky II**), heroine of Saturday's Glorious Song S. (GIC). Misty Hour follows Umatilla (the leading Freshman Sire in Australia this year) and Ninja Dancer as the third stakes winner for Miswaki out of a Nijinsky II mare, all three having the Tom Fool/Flaming Page combination.

When a pedigree combination works, it transcends any national boundaries. As mentioned above, we have had plenty of examples of Nijinsky II (or to be more precise, his dam, Flaming Page) and Tom Fool working together, and now we can add one from Argentina to the list. Saturday's Gran Premio Copa de Oro (G1) was won by **Diddler (Arg) (h, 5, Political Ambition--Double Account, by Sham)**. He has Nijinsky II as the broodmare sire of Kirtling (sire of Political Ambition), and Tom Fool through Buckpasser, sire of his second dam. We might also note that Princequillo appears 4x4x5 (including as the broodmare sire of the broodmare sire), while in the male line we have Honeyway, whose dam is a threeparts sister to the dam of Princequillo. We should be careful about reading too much into limited examples, but it is interesting to note that the victory of **Crowd Pleaser (c, 2, A.P. Indy--Creaking Board {GB}, by Night Shift)** in Saturday's Valley Forge S. at Philadelphia Park means that of the three stakes winners out of Night Shift mares, two are by sons of Seattle Slew. The other one is Grade II winner City By Night. Crowd Pleaser does have another interesting twist to his pedigree, as he has Sir Gaylord 5x5 and Sir Gaylord's dam Somethingroyal 5x6x6.

You won't find too many horses with a more powerful parentage than King Halo (Jpn) (c, 2, Dancing Brave--Goodbye Halo, by Halo). The sire was one of the best horses to race in Europe in recent times, and the dam was a Multiple Grade I winner of over \$1.7 million. Together they give two-year-old King Halo, whose victory in the Tokyo Sports Hai Sansai S. (G3-Jpn) took his record to a perfect three-for-three, an intriguing pedigree. The closest inbreeding in the pedigree is a 4x4cross of Sir Gaylord, but what is particularly interesting is that this cross comes through the genetic relatives Drone and Sir Ivor, Drone's dam is by Tom Fool out of a mare by Mahmoud, and Sir Ivor's dam is by a son of Mahmoud out of Athenia (three-parts sister to Menow, the sire of Tom Fool). King Halo also has Almahmoud 5x4, as she appears through her grandsons Halo and Northern Dancer.

In some respects this pedigree is reminiscent of that of Bubble Gum Fellow (Sunday Silence--Bubble Company, by Lyphard), the Champion Japanese twoyear-old of 1995, and another horse who combined Halo and Lyphard. There was also another Japanese victory for the Halo/Northern Dancer combination when **Taiki Shuttle (c, 3, Devil's Bag--Welsh Muffin, by Caerleon)** took Sunday's Mile Championship (G1-Jpn) at Kyoto Racecourse for his sixth victory in seven starts.

One to watch! Keep an eye out for **El Condor Pasa (c, 2, Kingmambo--Saddlers Gal {Ire}, by Sadler's Wells)**, a Japanese two-year-old winner by seven lengths in his debut Nov. 8. El Condor Pasa has Nureyev and Sadler's Wells 3x2 in his pedigree, but that's not all. His third dam is Lisadell, a sister to Special (dam of Nureyev and granddam of Sadler's Wells), so Special and Lisadell appear 4x4x3.
