MID-ATLANTIC RACE CIRCUIT PROPOSED The managements at the Meadowlands, Monmouth, Philadelphia Park, Delaware Park and the Maryland Jockey Club are considering a plan under which they would form one racing circuit, with no more than two of the tracks running at one time. According to Hal Handel, executive vice president and chief operating officer for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, the idea was formulated by Philadelphia Park's president Bob Green, who was impressed by the success the track had working together during the MATCH series. "We have to generate more interest in the game," Handel said. "There seems to be more of a realization that business as usual is whistling in the graveyard. We have to create specialness to the individual racing day again, make the product better and try to stop the decline and reposition the sport." The potential benefits could be many. With shorter meets, live racing would no doubt be revitalized. With racing secretaries at the operating tracks able to draw from a much larger horse population, field sizes would swell, giving horseplayers a much better product to bet on. Accruing betting revenue from simulcasting while they are dark, tracks would be able to offer higher purses when they do operate. Handel said there may be some reduction of dates at the Mid-Atlantic tracks next year and that a full racing circuit combining the tracks in all four states could be in place by 1999. Under the plan, Delaware Park and Monmouth would be the featured tracks during the summer months, while Philadelphia Park and the Maryland tracks would be the main tracks operating during the spring and fall. Handel is anticipating a fight with horsemen, but John Forbes, who heads the New Jersey horsemen's organization said that he's in favor of such an idea. "We agree that there's an awful lot of racing in the Northeast in close proximity," Forbes said. "It dilutes the pool of horses--there may not be enough horses to go around. The horsemen I've talked to agree that this would create higher purses and there'd still be continuous opportunities to race. There are people that think the days of a year-round racing circuit at one track aren't sensible anymore."

KEENELAND WEDNESDAY RESULTS At the 10th session of Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington, Kentucky, top price was paid for Arashi Dancer (Northern Baby). Consigned by Mr. and Mrs. William Wofford, agent, the eight-year-old mare was purchased for \$100,000 by Arthur B. Hancock Ill's Stone Farm, Arashi Dancer is in foal to El Prado (Ire). During Wednesday's session, Keeneland sold 213 horses for a total of \$2,854,400, up 34 percent from last year when 241 horses were sold for \$2,130,100. The average price of \$13,401 rose 51.6 percent from the 1996 figure of \$8,839. The median price at yesterday's session was \$10,000, a 53.8-percent increase from last year's corresponding figure of \$8,839. With two sessions remaining in the 12-day sale, 2,667 horses have been sold for an aggregate of \$210,323,000 and an average of \$78,861.

GERI TO BROOKSIDE IN 1998 Allen Paulson has announced that 1997 Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Geri (Theatrical {Ire}--Garimpeiro {Mr. Prospector}) will make his final start in the GII Citation H. over the Hollywood Park turf November 29 before retiring to stallion duty at Brookside Farm in Versailles, KY for the 1998 breeding season. Five-year-old Geri first served notice in 1996, capping off a five-race win streak on dirt with an authoritative victory in the GI Oaklawn H. After racing exclusively on dirt in 1996. the chestnut took to the turf in 1997. The result was a victory over handicap star Gentlemen in the Sept. 20 Woodbine Mile (GIC) and second-place finishes in the GI Caesars Int'l and GI Breeders' Cup Mile. To date, Geri has a lifetime record of 18-8-4-3 with earnings of \$1,527,980. Geri is the first foal out of his dam Garimpeiro, who was purchased by Paulson for \$750,000 at the 1988 Keeneland July Yearling Sale. Out of stakes winner Far Flying, Garimpeiro is a 3/4sister to graded stakes winner Dalhart. Geri's stud fee has not yet been determined.

OCTAGONAL TO HARAS DU QUESNAY Australian champion Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}--Eight Carat {GB}, {Pieces of Eight II}) will stand the 1998 season at Haras de Quesnay in Deauville, France. The six-year-old stallion was named Australian champion two-year-old in 1995 after winning the G1 William Inglis Sires Produce S. and G1 BMW Cox Plate. Australia's Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old in 1996, Octagonal won that year's G1 Canterbury Guineas, G1 Rosehill Guineas, G1 AJC Australian Derby and G1 VATC Underwood S. In all, the dark bay won 10 Group 1 races with earnings over \$5.89 million. Octagonal will stand for 80,000 FF (\$13,860) payable October 1, 1998.


