\$4.4 MILLION DANCE DESIGN SETS RECORD

AT TATTERSALLS Satish Sanan's Padua Stables paid \$4,425,000 (2,500,000 guineas) for the four-year-old filly **Dance Design (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) to top yesterday's third session of the Tattersalls December Filly/Mare Sale in Newmarket, England. It was *deja vu* for Sanan, who paid the same price last week for a weanling full brother to champion **Generous (Ire)**. The winning bid also shattered the previous record price for a filly or mare sold in Europe, set at this sale last year when **Luna Wells** was sold for 1,700,000 guineas. Padua manager Dr. Warren Evans opened the bidding at 500,000 guineas and saw off two challengers. First, Derrinstown Stud manager Hubie de Burgh, who went to 1,700,000 guineas (\$3,009,000) for Sheikh Hamdan al-Maktoum, then bloodstock agent John Ferguson. No one else ever bid. Twice champion of her generation in Ireland, in 1995 and 1996, **Dance Design** captured the 1996 G1 Kildangan Stud Irish Oaks in the colors of Walter Haefner's Moyglare Stud Farm. She will remain in training with Dermot Weld in 1998. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "It has been wonderful to have broken the world record for a foal and the European record for a filly or mare, at the same sale. We very much hope that Mr. Sanan has years of enjoyment to come in the Thoroughbred world, and in particular with **Dance Design** and the Caerleon colt he purchased last week." The overall session saw 234 horses sell for \$21,949,062, an average of \$93,799. The gross was down two percent from last year's record session, while the average was off four percent. The day's median price was \$42,480. The sale continues today at 9:30 a.m.

RYAFAN RETIRED Juddmonte Farm's **Ryafan** (Lear Fan) has been retired from racing and will return to England to be bred to **Zafonic** next year. The three-year-old filly, the likely Eclipse Award winner for outstanding turf mare, capped off an undefeated three-race American campaign with a win in Sunday's G1 Matriarch at Hollywood Park. "She retired at the top of her game," said her American trainer Bobby Frankel. "She's done everything we've asked. They're just not taking any chances with her. She's going to have a great life and they'll take good care of her." In addition to her Matriarch win, **Ryafan** won the G1 Yellow Ribbon S. and G1 Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. In Europe, she won the 1996 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and this year's G2 Falmouth S. and G2 Nassau S. She retires with seven wins from 10 starts and earnings of \$1,345,140.

BAZE HITS 6,000 Jockey Russell Baze became only the 12th rider in Thoroughbred racing history to win 6,000 races when he scored in the fourth race at Golden Gate Fields yesterday. His 6,000th trip to the winner's circle came after a 12-length victory aboard the two-year-old colt Clover Hunter. Baze joins fellow 6,000-race winners Bill Shoemaker, Laffit Pincay, Jr., David Gall, Pat Day, Angel Cordero, Jr., Jorge Velasquez, Chris McCarron, Sandy Hawley, Larry Snyder, Carl Gambardella and John Longden. "It's nice to join a select group like that," Baze said yesterday. "I don't really think about it that much. I think of myself as a guy that goes out there and does his job. I've just been really lucky to have had a lot of success. The numbers say I'm up there with a select group, but I'm not going to let that go to my head."

BYRNE NAMED UTTA TRAINER OF THE YEAR

Conditioner Patrick Byrne narrowly edged out Bob Baffert to be named the 1997 Trainer of the Year in a poll of the United Thoroughbred Trainers of America Board of Directors. Through early December, Byrne had recorded 50 wins from 133 starts with a 38-percent winning ratio. His stable won 17 stakes races (13 Graded) from 39 starts. Byrne's two-year-old star **Favorite Trick** (Phone Trick) went undefeated in 1997 and is a leading candidate for Horse of the Year. Both Favorite Trick and filly **Countess Diana** (Deerhound) capped off juvenile championship seasons with wins in the Breeders' Cup. Byrne, a 41-year-old native of London, England, came to the United States in 1978 and has been training on his own since 1985. "I've truly been blessed," Byrne said of his spectacular season. "It's been a remarkable year, but you still think to yourself, what could I have done better. If Countess Diana had not lost a shoe in that stake at Churchill, we might have had two undefeated champions." The awards dinner will be held at the Fair Grounds Race Course in New Orleans February 3.

North American representative **La Soberbia (Arg)** (Octante {Arg}) has been withdrawn from the Dec. 7 International Vase. With no reserves from North America, the vacancy has been transferred to Hong Kong, which allows first reserve **Citadeed** (Shadeed) to run.

Churchill Downs Incorporated announced yesterday the formation of a wholly owned subsidiary known as Churchill Downs Investment Company to oversee those investments in which Churchill Downs Incorporated participates as an equity investor and neither the Company nor any of its subsidiaries actively manage the operations. Among the investments held by CDIC are Tracknet, a telecommunications service provider for both the pari-mutuel and simulcasting industries and EquiSource, a recently formed procurement business which will assist in the group purchasing of supplies and services for the equine industry. CDIC will also hold the Company's investment in the former Dueling Grounds Racecourse, now known as Kentucky Downs.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Since we started this column, one of the crosses which has most frequently made the news is the combination of Tom Fool with his genetic relatives Spring Run (dam of Red God) and Flaming Page (dam of Nijinsky II and granddam of The Minstrel). The cross earned another Grade I credit Sunday when **Subordination (c, 3, Mt. Livermore--Not So Careless, by Desert Wine)** won the GI Crown Royal Hollywood Derby. He is by a grandson of Red God and his dam is inbred 5x3 to Tom Fool. To show how the overall pedigree pattern can sometimes outweigh the sire line/broodmare sire line nick, it is worth noting that Subordination is the first Northern Hemisphere graded stakes winner by a Blushing Groom line sire out of a Damascus line mare.

Not for nothing have we christened Seattle Slew "King of the Regional Sires of Sires." He struck again in that role when **Cosmo Topper (f, 2, Compelling Sound--Cosmahgorian, by Gregorian)** won the Heavenly Cause S. at Laurel Sunday. Cosmo Topper is the first stakes winner for Freshman Sire Compelling Sound, a Maryland-based son of Seattle Slew. Cosmo Topper's broodmare sire, Gregorian, is out of Natashka, who is by a son of Princequillo out of a mare by Nasrullah, the same pattern which produced Seattle Slew's broodmare sire Poker. In addition, Compelling Sound carries Determine (by Alibhai out of a Mahmoud mare) and Gregorian has Flower Bowl (by Alibhai out of a daughter of a Mahmoud mare).

Silver Ghost has been having a good season with his two-year-olds, and two of them won stakes last weekend, **Love Lock (f, 2, Silver Ghost--Harvest the Gold, by Spend a Buck)** capturing the GIII Golden Rod S. at Churchill Downs in new stakes record time and **Casanova Market (f, 2, Silver Ghost--Casanova Junction, by Pleasant Colony)** landing the Holly S. at the Meadowlands. We have covered Love Lock before, but Casanova Junction also has an interesting pedigree with the brother and sister Misty Flight and Misty Morn 4x5 and a double of Almahmoud through Halo and Northern Dancer.

Cape Town (c, 2, Seeking the Gold--Seaside Attraction, by Seattle Slew) indicated he might be a force to reckon with next year by winning the GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs. The three-parts-brother to Champion Golden Attraction is another talented runner with multiple La Troienne strains and another success for the Mr. Prospector/Seattle Slew cross. The La Troienne crosses here come through Busanda and her three-quarters relatives, the sisters Striking and Busher, who appear 4x6x6. The dam also carries Blue Banner, who is by War Admiral out of a Blue Larkspur mare, and is therefore a three-quarters genetic relative to Busanda.

Mantles Star (GB) (c, 2, Beveled--Nosey, by Nebbiolo), who scored an upset victory in the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood Park in his U.S. debut, is the first group or graded stakes winner to represent his English-based sire. Mantles Star is out of a mare by Nebbiolo, who in turn is a son of Yellow God. Beveled's granddam, Salmon Lake, has a strikingly similar genetic background to Yellow God. Yellow God is by Red God (dam, Spring Run) out of Sally Deans (by a grandson of Fairway out of Cora Deans). Salmon Lake is by Tom Fool (three-quarters related to Spring Run) and her dam is by Royal Vale (by a son of Fairway out of Cora Deans). Yellow God is just about the only horse who could bring together such close genetic relatives to Salmon Lake. Can it be just coincidence that Mantles Star, the first group or graded winner from seven crops sired by Beveled, should have Yellow God so close up in his pedigree?

Salt Lake, the Leading Freshman Sire of 1996, continues to do well in 1997 and he had an interesting stakes winner Saturday in the shape of **Wait For Silence (f, 2, Salt Lake--Off the Record, by Chas Conerly)**, who ran out a convincing winner of the Ontario Lassie S. (GIIC). Wait For Silence has the mare Blessed Again 5x5, she appearing as dam of Take Away (the sire of the second dam of Salt Lake) and granddam of Prince Blessed (sire of the second dam of Wait For Silence).

THIS DATE IN HISTORY...

December 7, 1957...A two-year-old colt named **Silky Sullivan** won the one-mile Golden Gate Futurity after making up 27 lengths, establishing a running style that became legendary. Horsemen still invoke the name of Silky Sullivan when referring to a horse that runs from far off the pace.
