RECORD-BREAKING TATTERSALLS DECEMBER SALE CONCLUDES The 1997

Tattersalls December Sale which ended vesterday shattered the marks set at last year's record-breaking auction. Gross for the 10-day sale was \$102,182,460, up 18 percent from a year ago, while the average of \$51,710 was up 16 percent and the median, \$26,550, rose 15 percent. "The 1997 Tattersalls December Sale will no doubt be long remembered for the two recordbreaking 2,500,000 guineas transactions and while they both provided dramatic proof of a buoyant market, it has been sustained strength throughout the last two weeks that has been the feature of the December Sale," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The Tattersalls December Sale is an accurate barometer of the worldwide bloodstock market, and with the sale turnover breaking the 50,000,000 guineas barrier for the first time it has delivered a powerful vote of confidence. Demand throughout the sale has been truly global and in the course of the last two weeks we have sold to buyers from more than 40 different countries." Satish Sanan's Padua Stables purchased two horses for more than \$4.4 million each during the sale. The first, a full brother to champion Generous (Ire) consigned by Barronstown Stud, Ireland, set a world record for a weanling sold at auction. The second, the two-time champion and G1SW Dance Design (Ire) consigned by Moyglare Stud, set a European record for a filly or mare sold at auction. The final session, held in Newmarket, England Friday, again showed gains over last year's corresponding session. A total of 138 fillies and mares sold for \$1,618,050, up 59 percent from the 1996 finale. Friday's average of \$11,725 was up 21 percent over 1996. The session topper was the three-year-old filly in training Trading Aces (GB) (Be My Chief). A winning half-sister to MGSP Crazee Mental (GB) (Magic Ring (Ire)), she was consigned by Fitzrov House Stables and purchased for \$81,286 by Mr. W. P. Churchward.
