PARTNERS SELL HALF-INTEREST IN GRAND

SLAM Robert Baker, William Mack and David Cornstein, the three partners who own top two-year-old Grand Slam (Gone West), have sold a 50-percent interest in the colt to John Magnier and Michael Tabor. Bred by Overbrook Farm, Grand Slam was purchased for \$300,000 as a yearling from the Keeneland September Sale. He has won three of his five career starts, including the GI Futurity at Belmont and the GI Moet Champagne, and earned \$357,800. "He has a high cruising rate and speed to burn," said his trainer, D. Wayne Lukas. "I think he will have a big Classic season, and we won't be afraid of any other horses with him." Grand Slam suffered severe cuts which required surgery when he was eased in his final start of the season, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but is now back in training. He will stand at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky upon the completion of his racing career.

FIRST GRADE I WIN FOR PADUA STABLES

Satish Sanan's Padua Stables, which made headlines this month after buying a weanling colt and champion filly Dance Design (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) for \$4.4 million apiece at the Tattersalls December Sales, picked up its first-ever Grade I win with the Brazilian filly Verinha (Brz) (Baronius {Brz}) Sunday. The three-year-old captured the third leg of Brazil's filly Triple Crown, taking the GI Grande Premio Jose Guathemozin Nogueira by five lengths. She was purchased for Padua Stables by Lane's End Bloodstock and Santa Escolastica, Inc. just last week, and will now travel to Ocala, Florida before beginning her U.S. campaign.

"WINNINGEST" HORSES FACE OFF AT

SUFFOLK Suffolk Downs will host its first match race in 60 years this Sunday when local favorite Maybe Jack (Classic Account), a winner of 12 races this year, faces Finger Lakes invader Pro On Ice (Distinctive Pro), who has also won an even dozen races in 1997. Billed as "The Showdown at Suffolk," the event will decide the title for America's winningest horse for 1997. It will be run at a flat mile for a purse of \$15,000, with \$10,000 going to the winner. Since Suffolk is Maybe Jack's home track and he excels at two turns, he will concede five pounds (124 to 119) to sprinter Pro On Ice. The last match race at a major track saw Soviet Problem defeat Mamselle Bebette at Del Mar in 1994. "The match race grabs people's attention," said Al Borosh, trainer of Maybe Jack. "You can hear that just walking around the backstretch or in the grandstand."

The nine-furlong GII \$600,000 Jim Beam S., to be held Saturday, March 28, highlights Turfway Park's 20-race 1998 Winter/Spring stakes program. Worth a total of \$1,180,000, the stakes calendar will offer two new races, the \$60,000 Tejano Run S. (formerly the Pioneer S.) for older horses going a mile and an eighth March 21, and the \$40,000 Inexcessivelygood Starter S. for older horses going a mile on the Jim Beam undercard. The Winter/Spring meet opens for a 64-day stand January 1 and runs through April 2, with racing Wednesdays through Sundays.

AGENCE FRANCAISE DECEMBER SALE

WRAP-UP Vicenca (Sky Classic), a three-year-old filly in training, brought a bid of \$45,520 to top yesterday's final session of the Agence Francaise December Mixed Sale in Deauville, France. A winning halfsister to G1SW Seattle Rhyme (Seattle Dancer), she was purchased by Axel Donnerstag Bloodstock. A total of 283 lots sold for \$4,067,605 during the three-day auction, an average of \$14,373. The gross was up 3 percent from last year's December Sale, when 352 horses brought \$3,930,203, while the average rose a healthy 28.7 percent over the 1996 figure of \$11,165.

A total of 194 hips brought \$1,380,700 Monday, up 2 percent from last year's corresponding session when 219 horses sold for \$1,354,400. The 1997 average of \$7,117 showed a 15-percent gain over the '96 figure of \$6,164. Overall during the two-day sale, 428 horses grossed \$2,685,000 for an average of \$6,273.
