WOODBINE '97 MEET CLOSES Woodbine ran its last live race of 1997 on Saturday, December 6, Daily average attendance at the Toronto track increased by 5.2 percent to 3,356 from the 3,191 figure recorded in 1996. Average daily wagering on Woodbine live racing from all sources totaled \$1,608,654 for 178 racing dates in 1997. That figure is down 3.8 percent from last year's 195-day meeting. "I thought that our live racing held up very well this year, especially in light of the short fields we experienced early on," said David Willmot, Ontario Jockey Club President and Chief Executive Officer. "And wagering on Thoroughbred racing in general in this marketplace has shown signs of a turnaround. Our average daily wagering on Calder, Keeneland, Belmont, Saratoga, Churchill, Santa Anita, Del Mar and Hollywood Park will show an increase this year over 1996." Simulcasting continues from Calder and Santa Anita through the end of the year. Emile Ramsammy won 170 races to earn his second consecutive Woodbine riding title and the Sovereign Award as Canada's top jockey. Robert Tiller matched his training feat of 1994, capturing his second Woodbine title with 55 wins. Sam-Son Farm headed the Woodbine owner standings for the third time this decade.

GOFFS RESULTS At yesterday's Goffs December Foal Yearling and Breeding Stock Sale in Kildare, Ireland, 160 horses sold for a total of \$907,730, up slightly from last year when 211 horses sold for \$904,797. The average sales price rose 32 percent, from \$4,287 in 1996 to \$5,631 this year. Top price was paid for hip number 138, Hasaid Lady (Ire) (Shaadi). The five-year-old mare sold for \$38,597 to Peter Doyle, agent.

BARRETTS SALE DATE CHANGE Barretts Equine Limited will conduct its Winter Mixed Sale in Pomona, California on Tuesday, January 27, a day later than originally scheduled. The continuous session, beginning at 10 a.m., will catalog 371 lots and will include horses of racing age from the dispersal of the R. E. Hibbert Estate. Catalogs will be available from December 30.

<u>TOMORROW, FRIDAY, DECEMBER 12:</u> 12-14 \$250,000 Hollywood Futurity-GI, Hol, 2yo, 8.5f (\$12,500s) THA & TPA PLEDGE SUPPORT TO NTRA In a significant boost for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA)'s efforts to coordinate a national marketing plan for the sport, the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association (THA) Wednesday became the first major multi-state horsemen's organization to commit formally to join the NTRA. Meeting in Tuscon, in conjunction with the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program Symposium, the THA Board of Directors voted unanimously to recommend that its member organizations provide the necessary funds to enable the NTRA to begin its operations as soon as possible. The THA represents 20,000 horsemen in Delaware, Illinois, Maryland, New England, New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania, the largest concentration of Thoroughbred racing on a daily basis in the nation. Endorsement by the organization's board of directors included the most recent funding formula developed by officers of the NTRA, who are scheduled to make a major presentation at the symposium Friday, December 12. The THA's commitment is significant in that its member organizations will contribute some 42 percent of all national NTRA funding from horsemen. THA Executive President Alan Foreman praised the plan, calling it the best opportunity yet developed to put racing back in competition with other North American professional sports. "Our board believes that the NTRA has developed a workable plan and is recommending that it be accepted by our wide racetrack constituency. We are proud and delighted to play a leadership role and encourage all other horsemen's organizations to join with us to make the NTRA a reality." Nick Nicholson, interim chief operating officer of the NTRA, was one of the first to applaud the THA resolution. "I am really appreciative of the leader-ship of the THA," he said. "A genuine mutual relationship has been established over the course of our many meetings in recent months. This mutual relationship is exactly the tone of the NTRA, it's plan and the way it intends to do business. The THA has given us a strong lead." Earlier this week, members of the Jockey Guild pledged their support for the NTRA and fully endorsed its preliminary proposals to increase public awareness of racing. And, at its annual meeting in Tuscon yesterday, the Turf Publicists of America (TPA) voted unanimously to endorse the NTRA. "The creation of the NTRA is the most significant step taken in may years to ensure and strengthen the future of Thoroughbred racing," said Dan Metzger, the new president of the TPA and Director of Marketing Services and Licensing for Breeders' Cup Ltd. "As an organization whose members work in publicity and marketing for our sport, the TPA felt it was important to publicly state its enthusiasm for this bold and unified approach to solve racing's problems and build on its successes."

Local News, England:

The British Racing and Breeding industries shuddered at the contents of Sheikh Mohammed's speech at Tuesday night's Gimcrack Dinner, the annual event which gives the winning owner of the Aug. 20 G2 Gimcrack S. a platform to address the racing and breeding industries. This year's winner was Carrowkeel (Ire) (Waajib {Ire}), owned by Sheikh Marwan al Maktoum. Sheikh Mohammed took the opportunity to make a speech on behalf of himself and his brothers. The speech was delivered by Michael Osborne (Chairman of the Dubai World Cup Committee). In the speech, the Sheikh said (British) racing was "being bled dry by chronic underfunding." and added, "Unless we see positive signs of progress and the possibility of change, we will massively reduce our racing and breeding presence in Britain and resign ourselves to racing in countries which bring us less pleasure but make more economic sense." Sheikh Mohammed pointed out that "the (British) Government takes six times the amount that is returned to racing. They have 6.75 pence, the Levy receives 1.2 pence and the rest (1.05 pence) disappears in the general direction of the bookmakers' ever-open pockets." The Sheikh's speech also pointed a finger at British bookmakers who. he said, "must laugh at us as they make their way to the bank with their ever-increasing profits!"

PEDIGREE SHORTS

Tower Full (h, 5, Irish Tower--Fine Dining, by State Dinner), who captured his first stakes event when taking the GIII Vernon O. Underwood S. Saturday at Hollywood Park, has a variation on the popular theme of bringing together relatives featuring Menow and Bull Dog. In the fourth generation on the dam's side we have Tom Fool (Menow out of a Bull Dog mare) who is frequently found with other Menow/Bull Dog combinations. The variation comes through the mare Longford (granddam of Irish Tower's sire, Irish Castle). She is by Menow and her dam is by a son of Bull Dog's brother, Sir Gallahad III. Tower Full also has two combinations of Teddy--sire of Bull Dog and Sir Gallahad III--with Blue Larkspur, these coming in through Revoked in Irish Tower and Businesslike in Tower Full's dam, Fine Dining.

Still on the Menow/Bull Dog theme, there was another example when Tate (f, 3, Afleet--Half Secret, by Upper Nile) won Saturday's Garland of Roses H. at Aqueduct by seven lengths. Tate is the fourth stakes winner by Afleet out of a mare by Nijinsky II or a son of Nijinsky II, the others being graded stakes winners Top Secret (sister to Tate), Blu Tusmani and Flat Fleet Feet. Of course Afleet carries Tom Fool, and Nijinsky II has Menow and Bull Dog through his dam, Flaming Page. Afleet is now in Japan, where he should meet up with plenty of Nijinsky II strains, and it is obviously going to be worth trying Afleet mares with stallions carrying Nijinsky II.
