STAR STANDARD DEAD Star Standard (Risen Star), winner of the 1996 GI Pimlico Special, was euthanized Tuesday, December 9 because of laminitis in his right foreleg. The five-year-old was away from the races for 17 months after his Pimlico Special win and returned to the track in an Oct. 22 Keeneland allowance. During that comeback race, the horse suffered a fractured distal cannon bone, a fractured sesamoid, and a fractured first phalanx in his left foreleg, "The badly injured left forelimb was healing but was not able to recover fast enough to protect the right front," explained Dr. Larry Bramlage in a statement from Rood & Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky, where Star Standard had been since the race. In addition to the Pimlico Special, Star Standard won the 1995 GII Lexington S. and ran second in the 1995 GI Belmont, GI Woodward and 1996 GI Gulfstream Park H. He won seven times in his 25-race career with earnings of \$1,121,512.

SUFFOLK TRAINERS EXONERATED The Massachusetts State Racing Commission yesterday unanimously voted to exonerate six trainers from any responsibility for the 10 horses that tested positive for Lidocaine during the spring meet at Suffolk Downs. The commission, by a split vote, let stand the purse distribution to the owners of the horses involved. The trainers are Ron Casey, Pearl Chain, Frank Dullea, Thomas McCooey, Richard Trimmer, Peter Tattersall and Michelle Nydham. The commission found that each horse testing positive had been administered a 50 percent dextrose solution manufactured by Phoenix Scientific, Inc. of St. Joseph, Missouri for Phoenix Pharmaceutical, Inc. The commission ruled the dextrose was contaminated with lidocaine at the time of manufacture. The source of the contamination was discovered through the efforts of counsel for the trainers and the race track stewards. The trainers were represented by James Esdaile, Jr., Harry C. Batchelder, Jr., Darrell Vienna and Henry Rossbacher.

The sire of Grade I winning fillies Cara Rafaela and Hidden Lake in his first crop, Quiet American now has a Grade I winning colt in his third crop. What's more, his Hollywood Futurity (GI) winner Real Quiet has a textbook pedigree.

Quiet American's pedigree is defined by its extremely close inbreeding to Dr. Fager, who appears 2x3, and to the mare Cequillo, who appears 4x3. In fact, the real inbreeding is even closer as Dr. Fager and Cequillo are focused together in the pedigrees of Killaloe (dam of Quiet American's sire, Fappiano) and Quiet American's own dam, Demure. So in effect, Quiet American has the

three-parts sisters 2x1.

Since Dr. Fager is a son of Rough 'n Tumble, what better horse to introduce than In Reality, who is out of Rough 'n Tumble's best daughter, My Dear Girl? Real Quiet's dam, Really Blue, does introduce In Reality, as her sire is In Reality's son, Believe It. That, however, is far from the end of the story. Dr. Fager's broodmare sire, Better Self, is by Bimelech (son of La Troienne) out of a mare by War Admiral. Believe It is out of a mare by Buckpasser, whose dam, Busanda, is by War Admiral out of a daughter of La Troienne, and therefore closely related to Better Self.

Surprisingly, though, neither the three crosses of Rough 'n Tumble nor the Better Self/Busanda relationship represents the closest inbreeding in Real Quiet's pedigree. That honor goes to Raise a Native, who appears 4x3 as the great-grandsire of Quiet American and as the sire of Real Quiet's granddam, Meadow Blue. The family has also produced 1997 group winner Allied Forces, who is also a grandson of Meadow Blue and is by a grandson of Raise a Native, giving him Raise a Native 3x3.

Keeneland distributed a record \$550,905 to 65 Lexington, Kentucky area charitable, educational and research organizaions during a short program Tuesday morning in the race course clubhouse. The largest gifts were to McDowell Cancer Research Foundation, St. Joseph Hospital Foundation and the Triangle Foundation, each receiving \$50,000.

Hollywood Park hosted two Grade I events last Sunday, and although we have featured the Hollywood Futurity (GI) winner Real Quiet, the Hollywood Turf Cup (GI) also went to a horse with a very clever pedigree. This is **River Bay (c, 4, Irish River {Fr}--Buckeye Gal, by Good Counsel)**. He has Nasrullah and his sister Malindi 4x4 (in the direct male and female lines) and Source Sucree 5x5 through her daughter Black Brook (third dam of Irish River) and her son Turn-to.

Whenever a stallion becomes a prominent broodmare sire of sires, there is the chance to inbreed to him in a very clever way. That is to introduce him as the broodmare sire of the sire and also as the broodmare sire of the broodmare sire. This is nothing new. For example, the great filly Busher was by War Admiral (dam by Sweep) out of a mare by Bubbling Over (dam by Sweep). One of the most recent outstanding broodmare sires of sires is Buckpasser, who is out of Busher's three-parts sister, Busanda. He appears in the designated positions of the pedigree of last weekend's

GIII Queens County H. winner Mr. Sinatra (c, 3, Mining--Midnight Stroll, by Private Account). The sire, Mining, is out of a Buckpasser mare as is the broodmare sire, Private Account. Others out of Private Account mares with similar inbreeding include My Flag (by Easy

Goer) and Squire Jones (by Seeking the Gold), while Private Account also sired a Grade I winner bred on the same pattern in Pretty Discreet (dam by Believe It). Other examples of the formula include Sneaky Quiet (Seeking the Gold out of a Slew o' Gold mare), Petionville (Seeking the Gold out of a Wavering Monarch mare), Talkin Man (With Approval out of a Miswaki mare) Play Waki For Me (by Fast Play out of a Miswaki mare) and Ethyl Mae (Woodman out of a Compliance mare). The next horse we foresee working this way? Secretariat, who is broodmare sire of Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, Gone West, Chief's Crown, Dehere and Atticus, to name but a few.

With Captain Bodgit in his first crop and three two-vear-old stakes winners in his second, Devil's Bag's brother Saint Ballado is beginning to look like the real thing. His son Sweetsouthernsaint (c, 2, Saint Ballado -- Sweetsoutherncross, by Tri Jet) indicated that he might follow Captain Bodgit as a classic contender with an easy victory in Saturday's GIII What a Pleasure S., his third in three starts. Since Saint Ballado is a Halo son, it is no surprise to find Mahmoud prominent in the distaff side of his mates. and in fact the 1933 Epsom Derby winner is found in all five of Saint Ballado's unrestricted stakes winners to date. Sweetsouthernsaint is no exception, and he has Mahmoud 5x5x5x6. There is, however, another interesting connection. Sweetsouthernsaint is out of a mare by Tri Jet, and Tri Jet's granddam, Blue Castle, is by Blenheim II out of a mare by Gainsborough and is therefore a three-quarters genetic relative to Mahmoud. It's not surprising that Halo, who loves Mahmoud, should work with a horse carrying a three-quarters relative to Mahmoud, and a similar cross is found in Hesabull (by Halo's grandson Dispersal out of a Tri Jet mare), a Grade II winner who was narrowly beaten in this year's Breeders' Cup Sprint, and Grade II winner Debutante's Halo (by Sunny's Halo out of a Tri Jet mare). Since Saint Ballado has now moved from Florida to Kentucky, he is less likely to meet with Tri Jet by accident, but getting him mares by Tri Jet or his son, Copelan, could be worth the effort.
