SANTA ANITA OPENS DEC. 26 The Los Angeles Turf Club will present its 61st season of Thoroughbred Racing at Santa Anita beginning Friday, December 26 and running through April 20, 1998. Opening day of the 85-day meeting marks the return to the racetrack of Kentucky Derby and Preakness champ Silver Charm (Silver Buck) who makes his first start since the Belmont S. in the \$200,000 GI Malibu S. Highlights of the stakes schedule, worth over \$11 million, include the \$1,000,000 GI Santa Anita H. March 7, the March 8 \$300,000 GI Santa Margarita H., the March 15 \$200,000 GI Santa Anita Oaks, the April 4 \$750,000 GI Santa Anita Derby and April 19 \$400,000 GI San Juan Capistrano Invitational. Santa Anita's premier event for three-year-old's, the Santa Anita Derby, will be televised live on FOX Sports during a one-hour national program on April 4. Racing at the Arcadia, California track will be conducted Wednesdays through Sundays, with special Monday racing on January 19, February 16 and April 20. There will be Tuesday racing December 30. Post time on weekdays is 1 p.m. and on weekends, holidays and Mondays will be 12:30 p.m. On opening day, February 7, March 7 and April 4 there will be a special 12 noon post and Santa Anita will offer two Twilight Fridays, April 10 and 17, when racing will commence at 3 p.m. Santa Anita Park has undergone approximately \$15 million in renovations since its last winter-spring meeting. Improvements include a new sound system, a refurbishment of its public areas, grounds, infield and paddock gardens and \$1 million in renovations to the track's concession stands.

## DOLLASE TO TRAIN SHARP CAT Sharp Cat

(Storm Cat), one of this year's leading three-year-old fillies, has been transferred from the barn of D. Wayne Lukas to the care of trainer Wally Dollase, according to the *Daily Racing Form*. Earlier this week, it was announced the filly's owner, Ahmed Salman's Thoroughbred Corp., had signed Dollase to a three-year contract as its private trainer. Sharp Cat has won 11 of 18 starts for earnings of \$1,417,250. The chestnut filly, second in this year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, has won five Grade I events and captured her most recent start, the December 7 GII Bayakoa H., in a walkover.

### POLITICS AS USUAL

About 25 years ago a part-time politician and full time playboy from Philadelphia named Jack Kelly decide he wanted to be mayor of the City of Brotherly Love. What were Kelly's qualifications? All he had were his Olympic medal for rowing and an older sister who was the Princess of Monaco. After hinting in the press for a couple of weeks about the possibility of running, a member of the fourth estate went to Kelly's mother and asked her what she would do if her son ran. "I would-n't vote for him!" was her reply. A resounding "No!" was the headline in the paper the next day, and Kelly's bid for high political office ended right there.

Fortunately for the three horses considered front runners for this year's Horse of the Year title, Favorite Trick, Gentlemen (Arg) and Skip Away, they have not only the credentials but also strong support, starting

right at home.

Skip Away's trainer Sonny Hine, always the savvy campaigner, missed an opportunity for the title last year by passing up the Breeders' Cup. After Cigar got beat in the 1996 Classic, Bill Finley of the New York Daily News took an informal poll of writers who would cast votes in the year-end contest and found that, had Skip Away run and won, there would have been a 50-50 split in the voting between Cigar and Skip Away for Horse of the Year.

Will Skip Away's near miss in 1996 influence the 1997 election? Cigar's trainer Bill Mott remarked, "Possibly. It's like a judge telling a jury to disregard the

witness' last remark. It's hard to forget."

A media darling, Hine started talking up his horse right after "Skippy" won the Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont this year. And he wasn't going to second guess himself this time around about going to the Breeders' Cup. He wrote the check, signed his name.

"I want to run against Formal Gold and Gentlemen," two of his nemeses during the year, Hine said after the Gold Cup. And when they didn't make it to the Breeders' Cup he changed the names to Touch Gold

and Deputy Commander.

In any other year a seven-length romp in the Breeders' Cup Classic in record-breaking time would almost certainly guarantee the Horse of the Year title. But trainer Pat Byrne has himself a two-year-old phenom named Favorite Trick who finished his season with a win in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile a couple of races before Skip Away took to the track.



Favorite Trick set a Breeders' Cup record and won by the largest margin ever for a juvenile. It made people sit up and take notice.

Both Hine, the elder statesman, and Byrne, the brash upstart, have been gentlemen about which one deserves Horse of the Year honors. Neither has put the knock on the other's horse, but neither will back down from their conviction that their horse deserves the title.

Says Hine, "How could you vote against my horse? He won it on his own merits. My horse answered the final bell. He won over \$4 million this year, he deserves to be Horse of the Year. I don't want to say anything bad about Pat's horse, but my horse would crush his in a mile-and-a-quarter race."

Meanwhile on the left coast, Gentlemen's owner R. D. Hubbard is convinced he has the top horse of 1997. Hubbard says, "We beat Skip Away when we ran against him. There's no question in my mind who the best horse is."

Byrne counters, saying, "Even when Secretariat won Horse of the Year as a two-year-old, he didn't win all his races that year. My horse is undefeated and he's run against everyone that he could face."

It didn't take the English-born horseman long to learn the ropes in American politics. Byrne pointed to Favorite Trick as he crossed the finish line in the Juvenile and said, to a national T.V. audience, "There's the Horse of the Year."

He later observed, "You don't like to think of it as a political campaign, but that sure is what it seems like."
