**TALE OF THE CAT BACK ON TRACK** Three-year-old Tale Of The Cat (Storm Cat), who was forced to skip the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Hollywood Park, is back under tack at Gulfstream Park and is expected to race at the meet, which opens January 3. The colt, a winner of three of his five starts, captured the GII King's Bishop S. and was third in the GI Vosburgh in his last appearance of the campaign September 27. He was diagnosed with palmar metacarpal syndrome while getting ready for the Sprint. Trainer John Forbes explained, "(The syndrome) is emerging as a fairly common ailment. It's asymptomatic and can only be diagnosed through the use of nuclear scintigraphy. In a nutshell, it affects the bottom part of the cannon bone, which is trying to remodel to handle the stress of training and racing. But the microdamage caused by training and racing is happening at a greater rate than the bone can accommodate. If it's caught early, the only necessary treatment is 30 days of rest. If not, a lesion will form on the bone and the result can be a condylar fracture of the cannon bone." Tale of the Cat's condition was caught early and after a 30-day vacation, he is now galloping. Forbes expects his charge to have his first breeze back next month. "He's great," said the trainer. "He looks just fantastic. I'm thrilled to death with him and I think he is going to have a sensational season."

### ALL-STAR JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP RETURNS TO LONE STAR

Lone Star Park has reached an agreement with the Jockeys' Guild to present the National All-Star Jockey Championship through the year 2000. Gary Stevens, elected into racing's Hall of Fame this year, won the inaugural edition of the NASJC at the Grand Prairie, Texas track in June, defeating an elite field of 11 rivals, including six fellow Hall of Famers. The one-day event, set for June 19 next year, features 12 of the top riders in the country competing in a series of four races for a total of \$100,000 in prize money. "It was a tremendous event in 1997," said Jockeys' Guild Manager John Giovanni. "The jockeys loved it and Lone Star Park did a great job. We are excited to be back. Ultimately, we think this will be similar to the NBA All-Star Game or the Pro Bowl in the NFL." The NASJC also benefits the Jockeys' Guild and the Disabled Riders Fund, with Lone Star Park donating a percentage of the handle from the four NASJC races, as well as money raised through sponsorships, merchandising and live and silent auctions, to the organizations.

# WRITERS UP

## TITLE FIGHT

For the first time since Kotashaan (Fr) captured the title in 1993, there is no clear-cut favorite to secure bragging rights as the very best horse this season. Kotashaan, the first "Horse of the Year" since the great John Henry in 1984 to do all his winning on the grass, beat out another top turf runner, Lure, by taking five Grade I races and six of his 10 starts (he was also second three times), capping his U.S. campaign with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. He then traveled to Tokyo and garnered a few more votes with a second-place finish in the Japan Cup.

None of the top candidates for the 1997 title can point to quite that level of accomplishment, but each can certainly boast of an impressive record. The acknowledged front-runners are:

Two are Breeders' Cup champs, the third won three of the seven Grade I stakes the trio pulled down this year. It will not be an easy choice. The *Thoroughbred Daily News* conducted an informal poll to see how our field of experts would vote, if given the chance.

**Penny Chenery, owner of Triple Crown winner and two-time Horse of the Year Secretariat:** "Skip Away, because he didn't get it last year. I think it's a body-of-work type of award rather than that he was the outstanding horse this year. I was bowled over by Favorite Trick's ability to go into another gear, and he is undefeated this year, but I just feel he's going to be it next year. I think he is THE horse for next year. I guess it's a sentimental vote for the Hines for putting up the money and all the criticism they got over changing riders, and I think they want it very very badly and they certainly have been great supporters of the game. I'm not voting against Favorite Trick, but voting for Skip Away."

**Warren "Jimmy" Croll, Hall of Fame trainer of Horse of the Year Holy Bull:** "I don't know. It's very close between Skip Away, Gentlemen and Favorite Trick. It's very hard to give it to a two-year-old even though he's done everything he's supposed to do. It's very close and there is no stand out. It's really hard to decide. Skip Away's win in the Breeders' Cup was outstanding. I would have said before the Breeders' Cup there was no chance he'd get it, but his win was so outstanding. Of course, Gentlemen wasn't there."

**Ron McAnally, Hall of Fame trainer of two-time Horse of the Year John Henry:** "It's a close call between two horses--Gentlemen and Skip Away. Favorite Trick is a very good, undefeated two-year-old, but it takes a Secretariat type to win Horse of the Year as a two-year-old. Gentlemen beat Skip Away early in the year then didn't race in the Breeders' Cup because of a throat infection. But if I had to choose one of them, my opinion is that the 'now' horse is Skip Away, and now is when the voting is coming up."

**Allen Paulson, owner of two-time Horse of the Year Cigar:** "I guess I would have to take Skip Away on the basis of him beating older horses and what he has earned. But that Phone Trick colt (Favorite Trick) is pretty impressive. I'm kind of mixed."

**Alan Porter, Bloodstock Analyst:** "In my mind, Favorite Trick was the horse who was most clearly dominant in his own division this year. He won from 4 ½ to 8 ½ furlongs, won from April to November and won in the Midwest, on the East Coast and the West Coast. If you don't give it to him, you'll never give it to a two-year-old."

**Clarence Scharbauer, co-owner of Horse of the Year Alysheba:** "From what I've seen, it's **Skip Away**."

**George Steinbrenner, Thoroughbred owner and breeder and owner of the 1996 World Champion New York Yankees:** "I don't know how anyone can not vote for **Skip Away**. I thought his performance in the Breeders' Cup Classic stamped him as Horse of the Year. He took on all comers, the older horses and the three-year-olds, good horses who wanted to take a shot at him, and he just overran them all. I couldn't quite liken it to Secretariat winning the Belmont, but it was certainly in the same ballpark. There's no way not to make him Horse of the Year."

**Karen Taylor, co-owner of Triple Crown winner and Horse of the Year Seattle Slew:** "Definitely **Skip Away**. He was awesome in the Breeders' Cup. He deserves it since he has proved so much. He's done everything that's been asked of him."

**Jack Van Berg, Hall of Fame trainer of Horse of the Year Alysheba:** "**Skip Away**--there's no question. He won when he had to. He won that \$1 million race in New York (Jockey Club Gold Cup) and they changed riders and he ran great again in the Breeders' Cup. There's no question."

**Jack Werk, publisher of Owner•Breeder:** "I like **Gentlemen** for Horse of the Year. No doubt **Skip Away's** performance in the Breeders' Cup was awesome, but he won only four of 11 races in 1997 and lost to **Gentlemen** in their only meeting. **Gentlemen**, on the other hand, won four of six races including Grade I victories on both coasts. His excusable performance at Woodbine should not cost him the championship."

**Patrice Wolfson, co-owner of Triple Crown winner and two-time Horse of the Year Affirmed:** "**Skip Away**. I'm not saying that a two-year-old couldn't be or shouldn't be Horse of the Year, but I think the only way a two-year-old should win is by default, when the other divisions fall apart, because there's only so much a two-year-old can do. You really only see how good a two-year-old is when you look at the entire crop several years down the road. This year, you do have a logical choice. I thought **Skip Away's** Breeders' Cup was tremendous."

The 1997 "Horse of the Year" will be announced at the annual Eclipse Awards Dinner in Rancho Mirage, California February 10, 1998.
