COOLMORE TO SPONSOR LEXINGTON

STAKES Coolmore, the Irish stallion station which is home to some of the world's best sires, has underlined its commitment to American racing and breeding with an agreement to sponsor the GII Lexington S. at Keeneland. The Coolmore Lexington, a race for three-year-olds at a mile and a sixteenth to be run April 19, will carry a purse of \$325,000, up from \$175,000 in 1997. "Coolmore is delighted to be associated with Keeneland as a sponsor of the Lexington S.," said Dr. Barry Simon, general manager of Coolmore's American division, Ashford Stud. "In addition to being an important race in its own right, the Lexington serves as a prestigious and timely prelude to America's classic events each spring." Touch Gold, winner of this year's Lexington, went on to take the 1997 GI Belmont S.

RAINTRAP TO STUD Raintrap (GB) (Rainbow Quest), a champion and Group 1 winner in France and two-time Grade I winner in North America, has been retired and will stand the 1998 breeding season at La Station d'Etalons at Haras des Chartreux in France. The sevenyear-old began his career in Europe, winning six of 12 starts including the G1 Prix Royal Oak and G2 Prix Kergorlay; he was named highweight three-year-old in France at 14 furlongs and up. Shipped to America, he captured the 1994 GI Rothmans International and the 1996 GI San Juan Capistrano H. The dark bay started just twice this year, finishing fifth in the GII Elkhorn S. at Keeneland April 25 in his final start. Raintrap goes to the breeding shed with a record of nine wins from 28 starts and earnings of \$1,279,467. He will stand for a fee of 30,000 French francs (approximately \$5,060).

Air Groove (Jpn), runner-up in the Japan Cup last out, sat fifth through the opening fractions, moved to put a head in front at the eighth pole, but was outfinished by the top two. TAIKI BLIZZARD (Seattle Slew), sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic in his most recent appearance, pressed the pace, took over three furlongs from home, but tired to be ninth.
