TRAITOR BACK ON TRACK Alfred G. Vanderbilt's **Traitor** (Cryptoclearance), officially retired in May, has pulled a George Foreman and is now back in training. Trainer Mary Eppler guided the three-year-old to four wins, a second and a third in six starts over the past two seasons, including a victory in the 1996 GI Futurity S. at Belmont Park, and now has the colt, injured while getting ready for the Preakness, jogging at Hialeah Park. "He tore his left front suspensory," Eppler said of her charge's absence, adding, "I don't think he'll be ready to race again before May." Traitor won his most recent outing, an allowance race at Aqueduct April 23.

BEADMAN RETIRES WITH A WINNER Darren Beadman, the Australian jockey who stunned the racing fraternity in August when announcing that he would retire after Christmas to become a Christian minister, ended his riding career in the best possible style with a winner on Friday at Randwick race course in Sydney. It was then revealed by the Sydney Turf Club that his involvement with racing had not in fact ended. Instead he has been appointed as "Golden Slipper Ambassador" by the Sydney Turf Club, which hosts Australia's premier juvenile event, the G1 Tooheys Golden Slipper, at Rosehill every March. Beadman, who is about to take a holiday in the United States, will be featured in an extensive advertising campaign to promote the Golden Slipper, the world's richest race for two-year-olds, and will also be involved in other public relations work on the race. "We at the STC believe we have pulled off a great coup in having Darren act as the exclusive ambassador for the Club," said STC Chairman Graeme Pash. "He had no hesitation in accepting our offer to become associated with the Golden Slipper carnival. His popularity speaks for itself and he wants to keep his racing involvement, although he won't be in the saddle."

Haillye's Prince, a Texas-bred making his first start outside his home state, was sent off the longest shot on the board in his stakes debut. A 14 1/2-length allowance winner at Sam Houston in his most recent outing December 18, the dark horse dueled on the lead through a half in :45, dropped back while drifting out as they straightened into the stretch, but came back to get the lead late and draw off, shocking the crowd with a \$97.80 mutuel. The 4-5 favorite LATE EDITION (Cryptoclearance), a maiden winner at Churchill in his lone prior appearance, was just off the leaders early but had no late kick and finished fifth.

Local News: Gulfstream Park

Gulfstream has lowered its blended takeout, the amount removed from the average betting dollar before winning payoffs are determined, for the upcoming 1998 meeting. The anticipated new rate, based on projected handle figures, is 19.66 percent, as compared to 19.73 percent in 1997. The reduction is the result of two adjustments--the track has lowered its takeout on win, place and show wagers from 17 to 16 percent, but has raised its takeout on trifectas and superfectas from 24 to 25 percent. "Based on our 1997 total commingled handle, it is projected that the lowered rate will result in an additional \$500,000 distributed among winning bettors at Gulfstream and throughout our simulcast system," said Mark Gunderson, vice president of finance. Gulfstream's 63-day meet opens January 3.

◆ EAST ◆

Local News: Garden State Park

Mark Reid, the all-time winningest trainer in Garden State history with 262 victories, will be back in action when the track's winter meet opens January 1, 1998. The 47-year-old horseman retired four years ago, but now has six horses on the Garden State backstretch. Explaining his hiatus from racing, Reid said, "It got to be too much for me. I had horses at several different tracks and staying on top of things just took too much time. It beat me up too much. When I wanted to cut back on the size of the stable, I really didn't know where to start. I didn't know which horses to get rid of, so I just decided to do something else for awhile." Besides spending more time with his family, he operated his own commercial heating and air conditioning business. But he missed the track. "I feel great now," said Reid. "I'm refreshed and I'm excited. It's fun going to the barn in the mornings again. I'll try to build the string to 15 or 20, and that's it." Reid was the leading trainer at Garden State four times, most recently in 1992.

Local News: South Africa

South Africa's much-traveled 1996-97 Horse Of The Year **London News (SAf)** (Bush Telegraph {SAf}) attempts a second straight win in the G1 Queen's Plate over a mile at Kenilworth race course in The Cape, South Africa, this Saturday. London News won last year's Queen's Plate as well as the G1 J & B Met last season before heading off to Hong Kong in April to win the Queen Elizabeth II Cup. His owners, Laurie and Jean Jaffee, are hoping to follow the same pattern again this year. London News, to be ridden by Karl Neisius, faces 14 opponents Saturday.
