LUSO RETIRED Three-time European champion Luso (GB) (Salse--Lucayan Princess {Ire}, by High Line {GB}) has been retired to Michael Hickey's Garryrichard Stud in County Wexford, Ireland. The winner of 10 Group races in England, Germany, Italy and Hong Kong earned \$2,384,106 in a career that spanned five years. The six-year-old also competed in Dubai, France and Japan. The German Champion Older Horse at 11-14 furlongs in 1997 and dual Italian Champion (3-year-old, 11-14f, 1995; 4-year-old, 9.5-11f, 1996), Luso last won Aug. 9 in the G1 Grosse Erdgas-Preis at Gelsenkirchener, Germany. He followed that up with two lackluster performances, a 46-length defeat in the G1 Grosse Preis von Baden Sept. 6 and a last-place finish in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 29. Clive Brittain's charge did not shirk competition, however. Twenty-seven of his 35 career starts were in Group 1 races, and Luso managed four wins and eight seconds in that select company.

RECONSTRUCTION FOR PHILADELPHIA PARK

A \$3.5 million reconstruction project of the main level of Philadelphia Park will get underway next week. "The renewal of the racetrack is another step in our efforts to bring racing in Philadelphia to a new level," explained Bob Green, track chairman and president. CEO Hal Handel added that the project was the result of feedback from guests and horsemen at the Pennsylvania track. Scheduled to be completed by early May 1999, the new look will feature mahogany, granite and marble finishes in the state-of-the-art teletheaters, dining areas and a sports bar. "This renovation will encompass a complete demolition of the first floor and, with a planned reopening for the Kentucky Derby, guests will find a totally new facility," Handel said. This past summer, Philadelphia Park's paddock and walking ring were redone and by next spring, the track will offer increased picnic areas and a new group party section.

Wicapi had earned three stakes wins in his career, but came into this event looking for his first graded win. Home first in a 1 1/16-mile allowance as the 7-5 favorite in his last outing Dec. 11 at Calder, he was nonetheless sent off the second-longest shot in this five-horse field. Prominent throughout, he steadied and altered course at the eighth pole, but rallied to get clear in the final sixteenth. Trainer Joe Calascibetta said the gelding would not be pointed toward the Jan. 30 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream, but may wait for the Calder meet to reopen next spring. "He just likes this racetrack," he said. "(We'll) basically wait until we get back here."

Suffolk Spring Meet Opens:

Racing returns to Suffolk Downs today for a 94-program Winter/Spring Meet which runs through June 5. Racing returns to a four-day weekly schedule--Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Wednesday. The track's schedule is peppered with several special events. Paying patrons attending the races opening weekend will receive a monthly pass good for free admission to the track for the entire month of January. Qualifying rounds for the sixth annual *Boston Herald* Thoroughbred Handicapping Challenge are scheduled for Jan. 23 and 24. The top 50 qualifiers from each afternoon will be invited back to compete in the final round Jan. 30. The contest features over \$5,000 in cash prizes and a trip to Las Vegas for the top two overall finalists. The showcase event of the Suffolk meeting, the 60th running of the GII Massachusetts H., is scheduled for May 20.

Meadowlands Continues to Offer NYRA Signal in '99:

The Meadowlands will continue to offer the simulcast racing signal from the New York Racing Association Thoroughbred tracks in 1999. Racing from Belmont, Aqueduct and Saratoga will remain on the Meadowlands' extensive simulcasting calendar on Wednesdays through Sundays. "Our simulcast guests have been very receptive to the NYRA signal since it began in October," said Bruce Garland, senior vice president for racing. "We are pleased that we are able to continue the simulcasts in 1999 and the fact that our simulcasts are now being shown at Yonkers Raceway and the New York State off-track betting regions. This cross simulcast relationship should be a win-win situation for all involved." The average handle on the NYRA signal since its introduction Oct. 1 has been \$175,000.

Pre-strike Chaos at Livorno:

Chaos reigned supreme at Livorno in Italy yesterday on the eve of an industry-wide strike action. After persistent rain over the past few days, local stewards inspected the course to determine whether or not racing should proceed. The stewards were accompanied on their inspection by the Jockeys' President, who disagreed with the stewards' decision that the course was fit to stage racing. Most of the jockey colony decided not to ride, and racing went ahead with fields of three to five runners in races where as many as 16 had been declared to run. The main race of the day, the Premio Artigianato, only had three runners from an original declaration of 11.
