BYRNE & STRONACH SPLIT Owner Frank

Stronach and trainer Pat Byrne are going their separate ways only 13 months after Byrne signed a five-year contract to be Stronach's private trainer. Byrne will still keep 12-15 horses for Stronach on the East Coast, but most of the better horses will end up with Southern California trainers. "I'll go back to having a public stable," said Byrne from Hialeah, where he's bedded down for the winter. "Since Mr. Stronach bought Santa Anita he told me he wants his better horses on the West Coast, and I can't blame him. So I'm looking at starting a public stable again and carrying 30 or 40 horses. I want to stay on the Kentucky-Florida circuit. I'll ship into Saratoga if I have horses I think can compete. In the meantime, I'll look for horses I think I'll like." Last December, Byrne gave up his two juvenile Champions Favorite Trick and Countess Diana to train exclusively for Stronach. The team's biggest victory came in last vear's Breeders' Cup, when Awesome Again capped an undefeated season by winning the Classic.

### LURE COLT TOPS DAY ONE AT MAGIC

MILLIONS SALE On yesterday's first of four days of the Magic Millions yearling sale on the Gold Coast in Australia, 149 lots sold for a gross of AUS\$9,864,000 (US\$6,036,720) and an average of AUS\$66,201 (US\$40,515). The session topper was Lot 37, the only colt in the sale sired by two-time Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure. Consigned by Coolmore Stud, agent, the bay yearling out of Vigne Vierge (Diesis {GB}) was sold for AUS\$300,000 (US\$183,599) to Domeland Pty Ltd. Seven lots brought AUS\$200,000 (US\$122,399) or more at the session. The second highest-priced yearling was Lot 133, Stratheden Stud's bay colt by Danehill--Comely Lass (Aus) (Comeram {Fr}), sold to Anton Koolman Bloodstock for AUS\$230,000 (\$140,759). Ashford Stud stallion Dehere had a strong opening day, with his seven yearlings averaging AUS\$131,429 (US\$80,434). The top-priced Dehere was Arrowfield Stud's filly out of Delightful Belle (NZ) (Balmerino {NZ}) who sold for AUS\$200,000 (US\$122,399). Among other yearlings sired by American-based sires, Twin Palms Stud's filly by Thunder Gulch out of Tennessee Mist (Aus) ((Bletchingly {Aus}), was sold to Sydney trainer Gai Waterhouse for AUS\$180,000 (US\$110,159). The sale runs through Jan. 12.

### **TOMORROWS CAT RETIRED Tomorrows Cat**



No stud plans have been announced for the four-year-old, who is expected to arrive at 505 Farm in Lexington, Ky sometime today. In addition to his Pegasus win, Tomorrows Cat ran second behind Favorite Trick in the Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. and was runner-up in the GIII Pennsylvania Derby. He suffered a career-ending injury in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S. and retires with four wins in 15 starts and earnings of \$516,090.

### **BAD WEATHER FORCES CANCELLATIONS**

Turfway, Philadelphia and Laurel Park officials were forced to cancel racing yesterday due to poor weather conditions. Friday was to have marked the start of an expanded winter schedule for Philly Park. For Turfway, it was the third cancellation of live racing since the new year.

MILITARY SIDELINED Multiple graded stakes winner Military (Danzig) will be sidelined up to six months due to an ankle chip. The five-year-old won the GI Oak Tree Turf Championship and rebounded from an off-the-board finish in the Breeders' Cup Mile to win the Nov. 28 GII Citation S. in his last start. ### More Arrests in England:

Leading jockeys Graham Bradley and Ray Cochrane were arrested yesterday by the Metropolitan police in shock dawn swoops, but both will be able to continue to race ride. Former trainer Charlie Brooks was also arrested in the afternoon. Their arrests are part of the long-running police investigation into doping and alleged race-fixing that has also seen jump jockeys Jamie Osborne, Leighton Aspell and Dean Gallagher arrested, although the first two were subsequently cleared of any wrongdoing. Bradley, Cochrane and Brooks were released on bail until March 10 and not charged with any offense. All three denied any wrongdoing.
