DANEHILL COLT TOPS MAGIC MILLIONS DAY

TWO On the second day of the Honda Magic Millions yearling sale on Australia's Gold Coast, more than AUS\$5 million (US\$3,059,976) changed hands, taking the sale gross after two days over AUS\$16 million (\$9,791,922). The average of AUS\$67,610 (\$41,377) is some 27 percent higher than last year's overall average of AUS\$53,167 (\$32,538). The session topper was Lot 256, Roselands Stud Ptv Ltd's Danehill colt out of the Sadler's Wells mare Humour (Ire), sold to Victoria-based Pastore Pty Ltd., acting on behalf of Hong Kong businessman Sam Li, for AUS\$350,000 (\$214,198). Humour is a half-sister to the multiple Group 1 winner in South Africa, Tracy's Element (Aus) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), and to the Australian Group 1 winner Danasinga (Aus) (Danehill). The progeny of Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. winner Thunder Gulch were in demand on the second day, with his three yearlings selling for a gross of AUS\$405,000 (\$247,858), an average of AUS\$135,000 (\$82,619). The four-day auction continues through Jan. 12.

WINTER STORM KO'S RACING Live racing was called off at Aqueduct, Philadelphia Park, Suffolk Downs and Turfway Park yesterday, the aftermath of the latest January storm. Unsafe track conditions were the culprit at Aqueduct and Suffolk, while the inclement weather caused the cancellations at Philly Park and Turfway. Saturday's \$50,000-added Count Fleet S., the feature at the Big A, will be reopened to the original nominees and run next Sunday, Jan. 17. All four tracks remained open for simulcasting and are expected to be back in action this afternoon.

Sir Bear has turned into something of a tiger. It was almost a year ago that the racing community first took notice of this hard-working gelding when he scored a 26-1 surprise in the 1998 Broward. "The Bear" went on to have an outstanding year, earning close to three-quarters of a million dollars; he capped the campaign with his first Grade I victory, beating a star-studded group including Affirmed Success, Distorted Humor and Coronado's Quest in the Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 28. After training well at his Calder base for his first 1999 engagement, the six-year-old broke alertly, but his jockey, Jerry Bailey, was content to stalk the pacesetters from the three path as they set solid fractions. As the field rounded the far turn, Bailey asked his mount for his best and he responded to engage Behrens at the three-eighths pole. The two rivals raced as a team through the stretch, with Sir Bear gaining a very narrow lead at the furlong grounds and inching away from there to a hardfought triumph, successfully defending his title. Winning trainer Ralph Ziadie was confident in his horse's chances. "He's come a long way since last year," he said. "He keeps getting better with age." A showdown with Silver Charm in the Jan. 30 Gl Donn H. is possible, according to Ziadie. Behrens, winless since taking the '97 GII Pegasus H., was fifth in last year's G1 Dubai World Cup and had only one subsequent start, running ninth in the June 13 GII Brooklyn H. He ran on gamely to just miss. Second choice Frisk Me Now (Mister Frisky) raced towards the back of the pack and offered no serious threat, finishing seventh.

"I was a little concerned because I didn't like her being that far back," said trainer and co-owner Louie Roussel III. "We just had to do it the hard way. She earned it today. Added jockey Eddie Martin Jr., "There were seven in front of me going around the turn...I just swung her outside and the next thing I knew I was on the lead. It was unbelievable." Roussel said the Kentucky-bred would be pointed for the Kentucky Oaks, with the Feb. 20 Davona Dale S. at Fair Grounds and the March 13 GIII Fair Grounds Oaks on the immediate schedule.

Record Handle at Fair Grounds:

Fair Grounds posted a record handle of \$7,367,155 yesterday, smashing the old mark of \$5,722,268 set Dec. 26, 1998. Fair Grounds President and General Manager Bryan Krantz credited a late cancellation at Aqueduct with giving the handle a leg-up toward the record. "We did almost \$1 million in handle from New York alone," Krantz said, "and when they canceled, that put our signal in California."

"The biggest thing was to keep her outside of horses because she hates to get hit with flying dirt. By the time we got to the three-eighths pole, I knew I had plenty of horse and I knew I was going to win," said jockey Octavio Vergara. "She has been very slow to get fit," said trainer Jim Chapman. "She's just coming around. When she gets it all going in the right direction, she's going to be a real nice horse." As for what's next, Chapman said, "We're going to keep her at a mile and a sixteenth, but I'm not sure what we're going to do with her. I think she'll run on turf or dirt, but I think it might be easier for her on turf--she can save ground because nothing's hitting her in the face."

"She couldn't be doing any better," said trainer John Shirreffs...Cal-bred Controlled (In Excess {Ire}), also four-for-five with three stakes wins to her credit, breezed a half in :47 3/5 as she points for the GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 24...GI Hollywood Starlet heroine Excellent Meeting (General Meeting), headed for the GI Las Virgenes Feb. 13, went a half in :48 1/5...GSW Tres Paraiso (Honest Pleasure), now a seven-year-old who came back after a 15-month layoff to be eighth in the Underwood, went fiveeighths in 1:01 1/5 and is possible for the GII Palos Verdes H. Jan. 30...Palme d'Or (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), a Group winner in France, but winless in three U.S. outings, worked five furlongs on the grass in 1:01 4/5 and could go next in the GII San Gorgonio H. Jan. 16...Green Jewel (GB) (Environment Friend (GB), winner of the GIII Louis R. Rowan H. and third in the GI Matriarch last season, worked six furlongs on the grass in 1:13 4/5...Ferrari (Ger) (Alkalde {Ger}), a Group winner in Germany and third in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup, went six furlongs on the turf in 1:14 3/5 and is likely for the Jan. 18 GII San Marcos H.



Testa Rossa Takes Magic Millions:

Two-year-old Testa Rossa (Aus) (Perugino) maintained his unbeaten record with a devastating 4 1/4-length win in yesterday's \$611,995 Honda Magic Millions over six furlongs on the Gold Coast. The colt is a member of the first Australian-bred crop sired by Coolmore Stud's shuttle stallion Perugino (Danzig). Starting as the 4-6 favorite, he lived up to his name, accelerating away from the field up the straight to win with ease from the filly Sally Magic (Aus) (Keltrice {Aus}) in a time of 1:09.55, only twofifths of a second off the race record. "We were pretty confident, but didn't want to shoot our mouths off," said trainer Dean Lawson. "I wasn't worried that he was three wide because I knew he was the best horse in the race." Testa Rossa will now be aimed at the juvenile Triple Crown in Melbourne, starting with the G3 Blue Diamond Prelude at Caulfield Feb. 13, followed by the G1 Blue Diamond, also at Caulfield Feb. 27, and culminating with the G1 VRC Sires Produce S. at Flemington March 13. Lawson is adamant, however, that he will not be aimed at the G1 Golden Slipper, Australia's premier juvenile event, at Sydney's Rosehill, March 27. "I don't have any regrets about missing the Slipper with him, because I think he's going to be an even better three-year-old," said Lawson.

ALL WORK AND NO PLAY? **By Chris Esslinger**

Apprentice jockey Dana Barnes may not get many chances to ride in the afternoon, but mornings at Santa Anita Park are a different story. Barnes is considered one of the top exercise riders on the backstretch and, as such, rides more stakes horses than most jockeys ever will.

She currently works horses for the powerful barn of trainer Bob Baffert, but has also worked for Hall of Famer Charlie Whittingham, his son Michael and Eddie Gregson.

"Here in Bob's barn, pretty much every horse l've been on has won a stakes," Barnes said. "Most of the guys have their horses they gallop, but I work everybody in the barn."

Riding nice horses is nothing new to Barnes. She worked for Charlie Whittingham for four years and, prior to that, split time between Mike Whittingham and Gregson for 10 years. Among the horses she rode for Gregson were Sunny Blossom and Petite Ile; with Mike Whittingham she rode Skywalker and Trucemaker.

"But with Charlie I worked Strodes Creek, Flawlessly and Sir Beaufort," Barnes said. "I rode some real nice horses before I got here."

The seven-day-a-week grind doesn't get to the 35year-old. She's having the time of her life.

"This is a lot of fun for me," Barnes said, "especially getting to work them. I love horses and I do get attached to them. I'm done by 10:30 a.m., and I have two daughters, so I'm home when they get out of school. It's a great job."

But who is her favorite horse?

"My favorite has to be Silver Charm, because he's the smartest horse you'd ever be around," Barnes said. "When Larry (Damore) gets on him (to gallop), he'll buck and play a little bit. With me, he's never done anything because he knows it's work time. Indian Charlie was a lot of fun to work and General Challenge (winner of the Cal Breeders' Champion S.) is a really nice horse because he's got this huge, floating stride that makes you feel like you're going slower than you are.

"Silverbulletday's really strong," Barnes continued. "Always has been, since the day she came in. When she worked her first quarter mile, I thought I was going to die trying to get her to pull up.

"One thing I've learned, if a horse feels like it goes in a minute and he really works in :59, that's a good horse," Barnes added with a laugh. "When they feel like they go in a minute and really go in 1:01, they're probably not too good."

Barnes said her favorite part of the job is getting to know the horses in the barn.

"They're like people," she said. "They all have different personalities. It's funny, but I can picture them all as people, especially Silver Charm and Real Quiet. They have so much personality. I remember in Kentucky last year when Real Quiet was getting all the publicity and the attention, they were right next to each other and Silver Charm would throw his head up, shake his head and get so mad. And he never does that. Then Silver Charm was back in the limelight for the Breeders' Cup, and he just loved it. He knows when someone's got a camera, he thrives on it. He's a lot like Bob, actually. That's probably why Bob likes him so much.

"We all get along really well," Barnes added of the Baffert barn cast. "Bob's really fun to work for because he jokes around and it's never too serious around here. He's a little more serious the days Silver Charm works. It's funny, because that's the only horse that has that effect on Bob. We have a good time. It's a good team."
