ESCENA TOPS POTENT KEENELAND

JANUARY SALE When owner Allen Paulson led a triumphant Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}) into the winner's circle after her breathtaking victory in the Breeders' Cup Distaff, the duo seemed inseparable. But this week Escena will be led into a different sort of circle, headlining the performers at the five-day Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. The sale, boasting over 1,700 lots, begins today and runs through Friday, Jan. 15, with bidding set to start at 10 a.m. daily. Escena, consigned by Lane's End Farm, is scheduled to sell Tuesday. "It's been a long time since we've had as big a name mare in the January Sale as this one," said W.B. Rogers Beasley, Keeneland Director of Sales. "She was a tremendous race mare and she has a good pedigree to match. You have to think there will be a tremendous interest in her." Steve Johnson, who manages Margaux Stud near Midway, agrees. "A mare like Escena assures everyone that all the right buyers are going to be there," he said. Escena, just turned six, won nearly \$3 million in her career. She captured the GII Fantasy S. and ran second in four Grade I events, including the Kentucky Oaks, at three. She picked up her first Grade I in the '97 Ramona H. and finished the year running third in the Breeders' Cup Distaff. But last year was her best. Escena won three Grade | stakes and saved her finest moment for her finale, holding off Banshee Breeze in a dramatic finish to win the \$2 million Distaff. The January Sale also offers mares in foal to such stallions as A.P. Indy, Deputy Minister, Gulch, Sadler's Wells, Spinning World and Woodman, and for the first time will sell mares bred to stallions including Lure, Red Ransom and Grindstone who will foal on Southern Hemisphere time. "There are a lot of solid, strong families in the sale," said Beasley. "We expect it to be a very good sale." Optimism is strong that the upward trends of last season will continue. "I don't see any reason why the sales won't be strong again," said Johnson. "I think the economy is good and stable and I don't think we have hit the top by any stretch of the imagination. I think we've got two or three years to go on this run. January really gives people an opportunity to evaluate their stock. There was such a deluge in November that sometimes you can get overwhelmed and even shut out. Now we have a time to regroup and go after horses that fit our plan." News cont. page 2

With a little more than a half-mile to run in the San Pasgual H., the 20,708 fans who had come to see Silver Charm make his 1999 debut and who had bet him down to odds of 3-10 had to be getting a little bit concerned. After all, the five-year-old colt had finished last year with a grueling second in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 7 and been taken to the wire and barely beat the little known Littlebitlively in the GII Clark H. Nov. 27. Could the big gray, who found himself almost nine lengths behind the leaders after a half-mile, be a little bit off his game? Jockey Gary Stevens admitted he was worried. "That's when I thought this might be Del Mar all over again (when Silver Charm checked in last by 27 lengths in the GII San Diego H.)," said Stevens. With Crafty Friend and the ageless Dramatic Gold (Slew o' Gold) setting moderate fractions of :24 2/5 and :47 2/5 and looking quite strong, Silver Charm went into the second turn with more ground to make up than he was normally used to. The 3-10 favorite began his move on the second turn, came out three wide into the stretch where he was set down for the drive and rolled past the leaders as if they were standing still. "Man, I mean he just inhaled those horses," said Stevens. "That is actually as easy as he has ever won a race." Trainer Bob Baffert said, "What he did today was hopefully a sign of what he's going to do the rest of the year. He's a great horse and I just thank God he ended up in my barn." ZABEEL COLT TOPS MAGIC MILLIONS SALE Bart Cummings paid AUS\$475,000 (\$291,411) for the only son of Zabeel (NZ) in the third session of the Magic Millions Premier Yearling Sale at the Gold Coast yesterday. Consigned by Ra Ora-Haunui Parnership on behalf of Marbella Lodge in Auckland, the colt is out of Papa's Beauty (Aus) (Hunka Papa), who is a half-sister to Australian Group 1 winner English Wonder (Aus). English Wonder is the dam of Australian Multiple Group 1-winner Dr. Grace (NZ) (Sir Tristram). This year's Magic Millions sale showed gross receipts of AUS\$26.4 million for an average price of AUS\$66,289 (\$40,668), a 24.4 percent increase over the 1998 average. Sale Director Don Hancock said, "It was a good solid sale with the emphasis on quality and people are prepared to pay top dollar for that." Hancock added that strong performances by new stallions such as Dehere and Flying Spur, "show that Danehill doesn't have it on his own anymore."
