## DANZIG MARE TOPS KEENELAND

JANUARY OPENER Glamorous (Danzig), a daughter of MGISW Gorgeous (Slew o'Gold) who finished second in her only career start, attracted the most attention at yesterday's first session of the 1999 Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. When the bidding stopped, the six-year-old, in foal to Broad Brush, had been purchased for \$800,000 from the consignment of Three Chimneys Farm, agent, by Lance Robinson and partner Ken Ellenberg. Glamorous' second dam is Kamar, who also produced the highly acclaimed Seaside Attraction, herself the dam of champion Golden Attraction and GISW Cape Town. "She has a lot of pedigree and we liked the individual as well," said Ellenberg, "She is a foundation kind of mare. She will probably go to Taylor Made and we'll probably breed her back to Mr. Prospector. We'll sell the offspring. We're commercial breeders. I bought her for a partnership. Lance and I are the major principles. The rest are from around the country." Caerlina (Ire) (Caerleon), a champion at three and four in Europe and winner of the 1991 French Oaks, brought a final bid of \$700,000 as the second-highest priced mare during the opening session. Also consigned by Three Chimneys Farm, agent, the 11-year-old, in foal to A.P. Indy, was purchased by John McCormack of B.B.A. (Ireland). She is the dam of twice Group 1placed La Nuit Rose (Rainbow Quest). "I bought her for Ballylinch Farm in Ireland," said McCormack. "They've purchased a lot of good mares here over the last few years. They have a portfolio of about 20 mares and they all are Group stakes performers or the direct descendant of a Group stakes winner. They buy very well-bred horses that fit into their plan and we feel great about being able to add this mare to that band of broodmares. This is the one that we had our sights on." It has not yet been decided who the mare will be bred to next. "It will be a little bit more difficult this year because most of the top stallions have already had their books filled. But she will have the best of covers," said McCormack. The sale continues through Friday.

## WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER By Bronwyn Farr

Benediction (Ire) (Day Is Done {Ire}), the dam of Might And Power (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), has been sold prior to auction to the Wildenstein family, according to the New Zealand racing newspaper *The Friday Flash*. Benediction, Hip #967 at this week's Keeneland January Sale, was bought from Nelson Schick's Windsor Park Stud three months ago for a reported seven-figure sum and was being offered at Keeneland by Blandford Stud as agent.

Might And Power, a winner of 15 races and more than \$3 million, was the third foal from the 14-year-old mare, who also foaled promising stayer Scud (NZ) (Dance Floor) and three-year-old filly Carmina Burana (NZ) (Star Way {GB}), who is yet to debut.

"She was very immature, very foal like, when she was bought," said trainer Gai Waterhouse of the filly. "She trialled and went shinny so we put her out and she is not quite right. I'd love to think she is a Queensland Oaks filly. She was quite small and backward, but each preparation she's grown. She'll make it, but at what level I don't know."

A Casual Lies colt from Benediction will be offered as lot 364 by Mapperley Stud during the New Zealand Bloodstock premier Sale at Auckland from February 2 to 4. Benediction is currently empty.

Conflicting reports surround Might And Power, with connections denying persistent rumours the champion five-year-old has strained a tendon. Sydney Turf Club officials must be immensely disappointed the nation's star turf attraction won't participate in the forthcoming Golden Slipper carnival. Although owner Nick Moraitis previously ruled out a tilt at Brisbane Winter Carnival riches in June, Sky Channel has reported that Might And Power would contest the G2 Hollindale Cup over nine furlongs and the G1 Doomben Cup (2020m) in Queensland in winter as a lead up to Melbourne's spring races. Watch this space.

Pinhooker Helen Aynsley is laughing all the way to the bank after her spectacular Magic Millions coup and she hopes the bank manager who knocked back her \$15,300 loan application notices her mirth. Aynsley topped the Magic Millions sale with the Zabeel yearling for which Bart Cummings outlaid \$290,698; she had bought the colt for \$14,076.

The New Zealand-based horsewoman said she hoped for between \$76,500 and \$91,800 for the colt after buying him at a culling sale at Glenmorgan Farm before Zabeel's ascendancy.

Cambridge Stud owner Patrick Hogan sold the colt's dam, Papa's Beauty (Aus), in foal to Zabeel for just \$4,590. But Hogan might be laughing even louder with no less than 35 Zabeel yearlings catalogued for the NZ Premier Session Feb. 2. Nine of them are among Cambridge's draft of 32.

The sale offers an eye-catching Zabeel colt from Great Klaire (GB) (Great Nephew {GB}), who is a half sister to European champion mare Habibti (Ire) (Habitat), who is, of course, the dam of three-time champion broodmare Eight Carat (GB). Hence the colt is bred along the same line as Octagonal (NZ) and Mouawad (NZ) and last year's \$856,793 sales topper Colombia (Aus). It will be offered by Rich Hill Thoroughbreds.

On the latest figures, Zabeel's progeny have earned more than \$3.6 million, with 42 individual winners from 85 runners to date compared with Danehill's nearly \$1.8 million in progeny earnnings with 44 winners from 120 runners. Zabeel has had 11 individual stakes winners halfway through this season, compared with Danehill's eight.



Coolmore sire Lure, who has seven yearlings listed for the Sydney Easter Sales, had the highest average at the Magic Millions sale with his two lots selling for \$183,600 and \$146,880, an average of \$165,240. Zabeel averaged \$159,730 for three sold, while Danehill averaged \$124,780 for nine sold, Thunder Gulch averaged \$77,111 for nine and Arrowfield's Golden Slipper winning Danehill sireson Flying Spur (Aus) averaged a respectable \$56,888 for his first quantity draft of 11. Dehere averaged \$65,973 for 20 sold.

Jockey-turned-trainer John Miller jolted Australian racing enthusiasts from an otherwise soporific New Year's Day when he achieved a truly remarkable feat winning the G2 Perth Cup over two miles with injury-plagued seven-year-old King Of Saxony (Aus) (Spartan Valley) who hadn't raced for eight months. It is highly unusual in Australia to resume over such a trip, but King Of Saxony rewarded Miller's faith winning by a long neck despite being galloped on and injured sufficiently to warrant retirement.

Racegoers on Australia's eastern seaboard tend to overlook Perth's summer carnival, all that way across the Nullarbor, but this was a training performance worthy of national recognition. The only other time it has occurred in Australia was when legendary conditioner James Scobie won the 1923 Melbourne Cup first-up with Bitalli (Aus).

And laconic Miller was chuffed when contemporary legend Bart Cummings, whose galloper Galilee (Aus) Miller partnered to win the Caulfield-Melbourne-Sydney Cups treble of 1996-97, approached him after the race. "Bart never said much, not that he ever did anyway, but he did hand over his racebook and asked me for my autograph, so I guess that's a bit of a wrap!" said Miller.
