ESCENA BRINGS RECORD BID AT KEENELAND

Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}) became the highest-priced broodmare to pass through the ring at a Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale when she brought a final bid of \$3.25 million vesterday in Lexington, Kentucky. The six-year-old mare, sold by Lane's End, agent, as a racing or broodmare prospect, won three Grade I races in 1998 and is a leading Eclipse candidate for champion older mare. She was purchased by bloodstock agent Reynolds Bell, Jr. on behalf of Guy Snowden. "I think it was a helluva price," Bell said after acquiring Escena. "I think before the Breeders' Cup that she was valued at probably about \$2.5 million. After the Breeders' Cup. I figured she was at \$3.5 million. She was a great racemare. I think she'll make a great broodmare." The previous record broodmare price at Keeneland January, was the \$3 million Shadwell Farm, Inc. paid for the mare Lucky Lucky, in foal to Northern Dancer, in 1986. The second highest priced mare at Tuesday's second session of the five-day sale, was hip number 557, multiple graded stakes winner J J'sdream (Glitterman). The six-year-old racing or broodmare prospect, consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, agent for Franks Farm, was purchased for \$1.6 million by Jamie Carrion. "We've been looking to try to buy mares that have done well and have won graded stakes races," Carrion explained. "Obviously, this mare fits that profile. We certainly like her a lot." The third seven-figure mare at last night's session was Broad Dynamite (Broad Brush). The graded stakes winner, in foal to Deputy Minister, was consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XI, and brought a final bid of \$1.4 million from Aaron Jones. "That was about what we thought she would bring," Taylor Made's Frank Taylor said after Broad Dynamite sold. Taylor also represents Jones in many of his bloodstock transactions. "We had her valued about the same as J J'sdream. He (Jones) was the underbidder on her (J J'sdream). Broad Dynamite will go back to our farm and be bred to his (Jones's) stallion Saint Ballado." The top-priced yearling at yesterday's session was hip number 655, a colt by Dixieland Band--Damerelle (King's Bishop). Consigned to the sale by Summerfield Farm, agent, the chestnut brought a final bid of \$205,000 from Elmwood Farm. The sale continues through Friday. SKIP AWAY TOPS INT'L CLASSIFICATIONS

Horse of the Year candidate Skip Away (Skip Trial) was named the overall highweight on the International Classifications of 1998. The winner of five Grade I races last year. Skip Away was assigned top weight of 131 pounds at the distances of mile and intermediate. He was waited one pound ahead of Awesome Again (Deputy Minister), who beat him in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and Intikhab (Red Ransom), who ran second in the Dubai Duty Free H. Mar. 28, then went to Europe and won the GIII Vodafone Diomed S. by five lengths and the GII Queen Anne S. by eight. Swain (Ire) (Nashwan), the winner of the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and the G1 Irish Champion S. as well as an unlucky third in the Breeders' Cup Classic, was rated another pound lower at 129. He received the highest rating in the long category. American-based sprinters Affirmed Success (Affirmed) and Kelly Kip (Kipper Kelly) were, at 121 pounds, tied with European-based Elnadim (Danzig) for honors as the highest-rated sprinters on the list. Other Americanbased runners near the top of the list include Silver Charm (Silver Buck) at 128, Gentlemen (Arg) (Robin des Bois) at 126 and Buck's Boy (Bucksplasher), Da Hoss (Gone West) and Sharp Cat (Storm Cat) at 125. Desert Prince (Ire) (Green Desert) topped the three-year-old classifications at 128 pounds for the mile distance, while American Triple Crown rivals Real Quiet (Quiet American) and Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance) headed the intermediate classifications at 127 pounds. GI Travers S. winner Coronado's Quest (Forty Niner) came in at 127 pounds, while GI Spinster winner Banshee Breeze (Unbridled) was the top filly at 124 pounds. Two-year-old classifications, limited to horses raced in Europe, were led by 123-pound highweight Mujahid (Danzig), who won three of four races including the G1 Saudi Arabian Airlines Dewhurst S. at Newmarket.

One of the unanswered questions in Thoroughbred breeding is whether a veteran stallion can be expected to be as effective in his ripe old age as he was in the first flush of youth. Even the great Nijinsky II seemed to be suffering from declining powers until Lammtarra emerged from his penultimate crop and the magnificent Mr. Prospector has been quiet by his own very high standards in recent years. After being champion sire in 1987 and 1988, Mr. Prospector reached the top ten sires in each of the next five seasons. However, he languished down among the also-rans in 1997 and 1998 and failed to add another Grade I winner to his highly impressive total.

However, Mr. Prospector's lengthy wait for his next Grade I winner may soon be over, judging by the way his lightly raced son Cape Canaveral won the GIII San Miguel S. at Santa Anita on Jan. 9. Now two-for-two, Cape Canaveral appears to have the ability to match his exceptional pedigree. His dam, the Seattle Slew mare Seaside Attraction, defeated Go For Wand by three lengths to take the Kentucky Oaks over nine furlongs in 1990, in the process justifying the \$1.05 million she cost Overbrook Farm as a weanling at the Hermitage Farm Dispersal. Seaside Attraction was one of two Grade I winners representing the Key to the Mint mare Kamar in 1990, the other being her three-parts sister Gorgeous (Slew o'Gold), winner of the GI Vanity H.

Kamar realised \$2.6 million at the Hermitage Farm dispersal in 1987, which gives some idea of this family's achievements. Kamar became Canada's champion three-year-old filly, an honor also achieved

by Kamar's dam, Square Angel. Another mating between Square Angel and Key to the Mint produced Love Smitten, a Grade I winner now famous as the dam of Swain (Ire) (Nashwan). Another of Square Angel's stakes winners was Stellarette, who bred the Grade I winner Cuddles to a mating with Mr. Prospector.

Kamar was voted Broodmare of the Year for 1990 and Seaside Attraction is proving similarly effective as a broodmare. Cape Canaveral is her fifth foal and fourth Graded stakes winner, following the Mr. Prospector fillies Red Carnival and Golden Attraction as well as the Seeking The Gold colt Cape Town. Golden Attraction was a triple Grade I winner at two, once beating My Flag in the Frizette S. over 8 ½ furlongs, and Cape Town won the Florida Derby on the demotion of Lil's Lad. This is clearly a very "live" family and Cape Canaveral promises to make it even livelier.
