LOST CODE MARE TOPS KEENELAND

JANUARY WEDNESDAY The third session of the five-day Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington saw **Steal of the Night** (Lost Code) top the bidding, bringing \$207,000 from Helen Andrews' Twin Hopes Farm, Inc. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent XXVI, the four-year-old, a half-sister to five black-type horses including stakes winners American Dynasty (Quiet American) and Dynasty (Time for a Change), was sold as a racing or broodmare prospect. Unraced at two, she won once with four seconds and a third during her three-year-old campaign, earning \$46,625. "I didn't look at her as the possible sales topper, but she is an awfully nice mare," said Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made. "Helen Andrews bought one from us (Tuesday) and I told her then that she ought to go and take a look at Hip 809. I told her that (Steal of the Night) was better than the one that she had bought. Sure enough, she went back there and liked her and she ended up buying her, too. It's just a very, very good pedigree and she's a beautiful mare. I think Lost Code is very underrated as a broodmare sire. This is a good package. I think it was a good buy." Commenting on the first three days of the January Sale, Taylor said, "The market is very good and it's not just at the top. It's pretty solid all the way through." Bidding continues today at 10 a.m.

CLAGETT NAMED TOBA OWNER OF THE MONTH

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association has named Hal C.B. Clagett its owner of the month for December. Clagett, an attorney and Maryland breeder, was represented on the track by two homebred stakes winners during the month. Silent Valay took the Dec. 6 Heavenly Cause S. and Valay Bullet captured the Dec. 19 Stallion Series Auction S., both at Laurel. Clagett, in partnership with his wife Jeanne, has 11 broodmares at Roedown Farm in Davidson, Maryland and races a stable of 10 horses, conditioned by John (Jerry) Robb. "It's a love of the game that keeps me going," said Clagett, who has been involved with Thoroughbreds for over five decades. "I'll tell you that you cannot enjoy the top without having been on the bottom. When you've bounced off the bottom and been to the top, it's very pleasing."

Elnadim to U.S.:

G1 Darley July Cup winner Elnadim (Danzig) has been relocated to the United States for medical treatment, according to the *Racing Post*. Trainer John Dunlop revealed yesterday that "micro-fractures" in the colt's hind legs were to blame for his 11th and 12th-place showings in the G1 Nunthorpe S. and G1 Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup after his dominant July Cup win. "The vets discovered micro-fractures, tiny, almost imperceptible cracks in his hind pasterns, which are very difficult to diagnose and treat," Dunlop told the *Post's* Jon Lees. "He was all right until he was at full stretch. They were possibly caused in the July Cup on the fast ground by jarring the pastern bone in his hind legs. We ran him twice more thinking he was all right."
