KEENELAND TO BUY TURFWAY PARK

Keeneland Association, Inc. yesterday announced it has reached a tentative agreement to purchase Turfway Park and all of its related assets for \$37 million. Keeneland will manage the track on behalf of the newly formed Turfway Park LLC, which is controlled equally by Keeneland; Dreamport Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of GTECH Corporation; and Dusty Corporation, a wholly owned subsidiary of Harrah's Entertainment Inc. Turfway has been owned and operated by a group led by Jerry Carroll for the past 13 years. "What we are announcing today is very much about the future of racing in Kentucky," said William Greely, president and CEO of Keeneland Association. "Keeneland exists to strengthen and promote Thoroughbred racing in our state. For that to be accomplished we must remain a strong racing circuit. Jerry Carroll and Mark Simendinger have ably managed Turfway Park for the past 13 years. Their contribution has been significant. As the current management moves on to pursue other interests, we felt it imperative that Turfway continue as a vital link in Kentucky's racing circuit." Turfway will continue to operate with a management team that includes most of the current personnel. The agreement is subject to financing, due diligence provisions and approval of the Kentucky Racing Commission.

CONCERTO RETIRED Five-year-old **Concerto** (Chief's Crown--Undeniably, by In Reality), winner of nine stakes and \$1,308,118, has been retired from racing and will stand the 1999 breeding season at Ocala Stud Farms near Ocala, Florida as property of owner/breeder Kinsman Stable. The Kentucky-bred won the GIII Brown & Williamson Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two and the GII Jim Beam, GIII Clark H. and GIII Federico Tesio H. at three. A two-time stakes winner last season, he captured 10 of his 21 career outings with four seconds and two thirds. His 1999 stud fee has been set at \$3,500 live foal.

WINTER CANCELLATIONS CONTINUE Live racing was called off at Aqueduct Racetrack in New York and at Philadelphia Park in Pennsylvania yesterday after yet another winter storm hit the East Coast. Both tracks remained open for simulcasting and are expected to be back in action this afternoon.

BREEDERS' CUP RELEASES 1999 STAKES

SCHEDULE The first half of the 1999 Breeders' Cup stakes schedule offers 52 graded races and purses totaling \$16.25 million. The program kicks off with today's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. at Santa Anita. Now in its fourth year, the Breeders' Cup National Stakes Program is a series of 91 stakes funded by Breeders' Cup Ltd. and the 46 participating racetracks. A total of 26 races will receive \$100,000 supplements from Breeders' Cup this year, three more than last year. Five new stakes have been added to the program, one of which will be run during the first half of '99--the \$300,000 GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup Mile at Golden Gate Fields Apr. 25.



Running Stag Invited to World Cup

Running Stag (Cozzene), third in the Sept. 19 Gl Woodward S. at Belmont and seventh in the Nov. 7 Gl Breeders' Cup Classic, is back at his home base in England and has received an invitation to run in the G1 Dubai World Cup Sunday, Mar. 28. Philip Mitchell, who had been aiming the five-year-old at the \$4 million race, said, "Running Stag got back from the U.S. on New Year's Eve and has been doing road work for a fortnight. He cantered (yesterday) morning and he moved as well as ever." Foreign Report cont. Italian Strike to End?

After 15 days, the strike action afflicting Italian racing continues, but hopes are high that racing may resume within the next seven days. Thursday, General Domenico Pisani, the temporary President of the Italian racing authority U.N.I.R.E., resigned following a Wednesday meeting at Rome with the Ministers of Agriculture and Finance. In a brief statement, Pisani said, "I have resigned in the hope that it might improve the current situation affecting racing and trotting." Pisani's resignation was considered a welcome event by many sections of the racing and trotting industries. The situation appears to be improving slightly, but concerns still remain as to how the levels of prize money will be restructured together with solutions to the ambiguity currently surrounding the opening of betting shops and the rights for the broadcasting of live races. The picture is expected to come into sharper focus next week when U.N.I.R.E. appoints its new temporary President.
