JERSEY GIRL BACK ON TRACK Unraced since suffering a slab fracture of her right knee last summer, **Jersey Girl** (Belong to Me) is back in light training with Todd Pletcher at Hialeah. The Eclipse Award candidate is scheduled to begin galloping Jan. 25 and should have her first work shortly after that, co-owner Lee Ackerley reported. "She'll probably make her first start some time during the Hialeah meet," Ackerley said. "Todd says that she looks great and that she's going really smoothly." Ackerley is cautiously optimistic about the upcoming Eclipse announcements. Jersey Girl, seven-for-seven in '98, is battling **Banshee Breeze** (Unbridled) for top three-year-old filly honors. "As an owner, I can see both sides of it," he said. "Banshee Breeze had a great year, but when we went head-to-head we beat her (in the Mother Goose). I know it will be close."

END SWEEP COLT SETS OBS RECORD A yearling colt by End Sweep--Half Mast (Tunerup) brought a sales record \$135,000 to top the opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales 1999 Winter Mixed Sale in Ocala. Consigned by Cardinal Hill Farm (Carol and Norman Casse), agent, the colt is out of a half-sister to MGSW Isitingood (Crusader Sword). He was purchased by Todd Wojciechowski, agent for Diamond One Bloodstock. The highest-priced broodmare at the session was **Halo My Baby** (Halo--Lachesis, by Iron Ruler), in foal to Miswaki. The 17-year-old, dam of stakes winner and graded stakes-placed Art Work (Czaravich), was consigned by Bridlewood Farm, agent, and purchased by Silverleaf Farms Inc. for \$82,000. The buyback percentage dropped from 22 to 14.3 percent from last year's single Consignor Preferred session. "Attendance was solid and the dip in the buyback percentage is a good indication that our consignors are meeting the demands of the market," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. The sale continues with a second Consignor Preferred session today, followed by Wednesday's open session. Bidding begins at 10:30 a.m. daily.

Rallying winner of the GII San Gabriel H. Dec. 28 for his third straight stakes score, Brave Act was stretching out a furlong for his first appearance of the new year. The 2-1 favorite to handle the added distance, the bay sat just off a pedestrian pace that saw the field crawl through six furlongs in 1:16 1/5, came with a three-wide bid on the final bend to take command and held off the strong late surge of Ferrari for the victory. "He's all horse," said trainer Ron McAnally. "He's had so many problems since he arrived from Europe, but he overcame them all and right now, knock on wood, he's going sound. His biggest problem was a broken bone in his back foot. When he first arrived, he kicked the backboard on the plane and came up with a fracture. Then he had a little ankle trouble last year and we had to give him more time, but he's all heart." McAnally was undecided as to his charge's next start. The runner-up, a Group 2 in Germany last April, finished third in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup in his second U.S. try last time out and finished full of run here, closing from last down the hill to just miss.

CANCELLATIONS CONTINUE Adverse weather conditions forced the cancellation of Monday's live cards at Aqueduct and Philadelphia Park. The program was called off after the first race at Aqueduct due to the heavy rains, which caused a deterioration in the track condition. At Philly Park, CEO Hal Handel said, "The storms of last week and the rapid changes in temperature have resulted in a track surface that would have been unstable for racing. We hope to get back to running as soon as possible." Racing is scheduled to resume Tuesday at Philadelphia and Wednesday at Aqueduct. Aqueduct's \$50,000 Busanda S. for three-year-old fillies will be reopened to the original nominees, redrawn and run this Sunday.

Pico Teneriffe broke her maiden at first asking last June 28 at Belmont on the main track and then took her first ever turf try, a division of the Sept. 13 G1C Natalma S. at Woodbine, by six impressive lengths. Rested since an off-the-board placing in Keeneland's Green River S. Oct. 29, the bay trained well at Hialeah, including a bullet five-furlong drill Jan. 13 in 1:01 flat. Favored to rediscover her winning ways, she was unhurried by jockey Jerry Bailey as the field went through very deliberate fractions for the opening six furlongs. The filly was asked for her best run after angling out three wide leaving the three-eighths pole, responded to lead just entering the stretch and drew off to the victory. "It really was as easy as it looked," said Bailey. "I had a handful of horse behind a wall of horses. The only question was when I was going to get her to run." The winner goes next in the GIII Herecomesthebride S. at nine furlongs Mar. 3.

Making her first start since running third in the Nov. 27 GII Top Flight H., the consistent Glitter Woman was bet down to 1-5 on her return and lived up to those odds, setting the pace, opening up on the field at the top of the lane and coasting home an easy winner. "I'd like to try her on the turf, but after today I'm thinking about the Shirley Jones (GIII, Feb. 3), Rampart (GII, Feb. 28) route," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "I'll wait and try her on the turf at Hialeah maybe. I'd say that it's pretty definite that she'll be bred this year, but if she wins the two races here it might change. The Breeders' Cup is here this year." Glitter Woman caused a minus show pool of \$22,834.30; the mare also caused a minus show pool last year, costing Gulfstream \$21,030.24 when she finished second in the 1998 Shirley Jones.

Frisk Me Now Feeling Frisky:

MGSW **Frisk Me Now** (Mister Frisky), a disappointing seventh in the GIII Broward H. in his '99 debut, was anything but disappointing during a workout at Gulfstream Monday morning. The five-year-old dashed through five furlongs in :58 flat with jockey Pat Day in the saddle, clipping off the half mile in :45 4/5 and galloping out six furlongs in 1:11 3/5; he was wearing blinkers for the first time since taking the '97 Ohio Derby. "He was awesome this morning," said trainer Bob Durso. "He was really focused on what he was doing. I underestimated him going into the Broward. He was a little heavy and we've had trouble getting him as trim as we wanted him. He needed the race more than anything. We took him to the track a few days after the Broward and he was like a wild horse. Right now, mentally and physically, he's 200 percent."

Sword Dance Season Tops Charity Auction:

An auction of stallion seasons to benefit Florida Thoroughbred Charities, held after Monday's opening session of the OBS Winter Mixed Sale in Ocala, saw 58 seasons bring in \$142,500. The highest bid was for a no-guarantee season to Stone Hedge Farm's **Sword Dance** (Ire) (Nijinsky II), which sold for \$19,000.

Jockey Javier Castellano, thrown from his mount, Governor Hicks, during the stretch run of yesterday's eighth race at Gulfstream, was transported to Memorial Hospital in Hollywood for treatment of a possible dislocated or broken right collarbone.

Hong Kong's Queen Elizabeth II Cup Opened to Europe:

Hong Kong's Queen Elizabeth II Cup, to be run at Sha Tin April 18, has been re-opened to European competition after a break of three years. The 10-furlong turf race, which has been granted Group 2 status, is worth \$400,000 to the winner. This year the Hong Kong Jockey Club will invite two horses each from Europe and Australia and one each from Japan, Malaysia and Singapore, New Zealand, South Africa and the United Arab Emirates; they will take on five local horses. Entries, which cost nothing, close Feb. 19 and selected overseas raiders will be announced Mar. 9.

South African Jockey Killed:

Jockey Craig Magua, 35, died Sunday after being thrown from his mount 50 meters from the wire at Gosforth Park in South Africa. He is the first South African rider to die from racing-related injuries in more than 40 years. Magua was near the back of the pack aboard 33-1 Whistling Nun when she fell and somersaulted over the rider, kicking him as she stood up. He never regained consciousness and died that evening of severe head injuries. Magua, who started riding in 1980, leaves a wife and six-month-old son. Whistling Nun was uninjured.
