The 21-year-old stallion sired Grade I stakes winners Stop Traffic and Stormy Blues as well as German Champion Le Glorieux (GB) among his 60 stakes winners. During an undefeated two-year-old season, Cure the Blues captured the GI Laurel Futurity in 1980 and finished second in the GII Gotham and third in the GI Wood Memorial the following year.

The bay was consigned by Sue Vacek, agent, and was purchased for \$58,000 by Hugh Harlingten. The average at the two consignor preferred sessions rose 23.1 percent from last year's single preferred session. The overall median of \$9,500 was an increase of 11.8 percent over 1998's \$8,500. The sale's final session begins today at 10:30 a.m.

### **Vodafone Assures Continued Sponsorship:**

In light of its probable merger with the U.S. tele-communications company Air Touch, Vodafone attempted to quiet rumors about its continued £1.5 million (\$2.5 million) annual sponsorship to racing, according to Racing Post online. The director of corporate affairs for Vodafone, Terry Barwick told Racing Post's Tony Smurthwaite, "There is no danger to the sponsorship of the Derby or any of our other races." Barwick continued, "We have recently signed a new £3.5 million three-year-deal to sponsor the Derby until 2002." In additon to the Derby, Vodafone also sponsors the Oaks at Epsom, the Horris Hill S. at Newbury and the Saturday card at the Glorious Goodwood meet.

#### **British Breeders Bonus:**

Breeders' prizes will only be paid to the progeny of United Kingdom-based stallions, starting with the two-year-olds of 2002, so as to provide a boost to the British breeding industry. The Levy Board yesterday confirmed this important change so that breeders have a chance to decide on matings in full knowledge of the new policy. At present, the progeny of overseas stallions out of British-based mares qualify. The year 2002 has been chosen to start the new rules so that breeders will not be penalized retrospectively. The Levy Board Breeders' Prize Scheme, in its seventh year in 1999, will make available £1.47 million (\$2.44 million) for breeders' prizes during this year.

# WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

There are few businesses as fashion conscious as the Thoroughbred industry. The perception of a stallion, for example, can change from hot to cold in a matter of weeks. This is particularly so in the case of young sires. If a stallion doesn't deliver in very short order he rapidly loses virtually all traces of commercial viability. Inevitably this leads to some premature judgements, and more than a few stallions have come back strong after hesitant starts.

One recent example is Dixie Brass. An extremely fast sprinter/miler, he won three of four races at two, and took the GI Metropolitan Mile, GII Withers S. and Swift Stakes at three. He is by Dixieland Band out of Petite Diable, also dam of the multiple graded stakes winner Odyle (Alleged).

These looked like promising ingredients, but Dixie Brass's first crop yielded just one stakes winner (although that one, Putra, was an unbeaten Group III winner at two in England). By contrast, Dixie Brass's second crop--foals of 1995--has produced eight stakes winners, including Dixie Dot Com, whose earnings are now approaching \$500,000 following a victory in this weekend's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S.; Soldier Field, a multiple graded stakes winner with earnings of over \$400,000; and graded stakes winning two-year-old Polished Brass. Had these appeared in his first crop, Dixie Brass would have rapidly become a hot item. As it was, his slow start earned him the cold-shoulder from the marketplace and, before his first runners had completed their second season, he was on the move from Vinery in Kentucky (where half-brother Odyle still stands) to The Stallion Park in Millbrook, New York.

Monday's Grade III Sweetest Chant Stakes:

1st PICO TENERIFFE 2nd CRYSTAL SYMPHONY

Dixie Brass is certainly a major gain for the New York program, and we suspect that local breeders will be sending him plenty of Mr. Prospector line mares. Dixie Brass's sire, Dixieland Band, has an extremely strong affinity with Mr. Prospector, and Dixie Brass seems to be following the trend as three of his stakes winners, including graded/group winners Dixie Dot Com and Putra are out of mares by sons of Mr. Prospector.

Of course the combination of Dixieland Band's sire Northern Dancer with Mr. Prospector has long been noted as a successful one, but Dixieland Band is doing far better with the cross than the average Northern Dancer line stallion. One likely explanation appears from a look at Dixieland Band's pedigree. Northern Dancer did particularly well with mares carrying the strain of Teddy, particularly through Bull Dog and Sir Gallahad III. The most likely reason for this is that Northern Dancer was closely inbred to the stallion Gainsborough, a very close relative to the dam of Teddy.

Dixieland Band's dam, Mississippi Mud, has but one distant strain of Teddy, but she does have three more crosses of Gainsborough's son, Hyperion. Perhaps this build-up of Gainsborough responds particularly well to the Teddy strain? Mr. Prospector has Teddy 4 x 5 in his pedigree, and his dam has Teddy's sons, Sir Gallahad III and Bull Dog. In the case of Dixie Dot Com, the Gainsborough/Teddy background receives further reinforcement through Dixie Dot Com's granddam, Pride's Crossing. She is inbred to Heliopolis, a son of Hyperion (and grandson of Gainsborough), who also appears in the pedigree of Dixieland Band. Pride's Crossing is herself a granddaughter of Hillbrook, a mare inbred 3 x 4 to Teddy's son, Sir Gallahad III.

### PEDIGREE SHORTS

Monday's GIII Sweetest Chant S. resulted in a one-two finish for the Red Ransom/Mr. Prospector cross as Pico Teneriffe (f. 3, Red Ransom--Ballerina Princess, by Mr. Prospector) defeated Crystal Symphony (f, 3, Red Ransom--Tappity Tap, by Mr. Prospector). The Roberto/Mr. Prospector combination is one which has long looked good on paper--both horses are out of similarly bred daughters of Nashua--but has taken a while to find its stride. The similarity between the pedigrees of Bramalea (dam of Roberto) and Gold Digger (dam of Mr. Prospector) resides in the fact that they both combine Nashua with a Bull Dog/Blue Larkspur cross. In the pedigree of Pico Teneriffe, the Bull Dog/Blue Larkspur cross is strongly reinforced. First, because Roberto is by Hail to Reason, a horse whose dam, Nothirdchance, was bred on a cross of Blue Larkspur and Bull Dog's brother, Sir Gallahad III; second, because Pico Teneriffe's fourth dam, Alablue, is also by Blue Larkspur out of a Sir Gallahad III mare.

In addition to Mr. Prospector, Roberto is also beginning to work with another Raise a Native line son who carries a Bull Dog/Blue Larkspur combination: Alydar. The cross has already come up with graded stakes winners Trail City and Comic Strip, and there was a new addition to the club when Turkish Prize (c, 4, Prized--Turkish Gipsy, by Turkoman) captured the \$110,000 Sensational Star S. at Santa Anita.
