CHURCHILL COMPLETES CALDER PURCHASE

At a press conference yesterday, Churchill Downs announced that it had purchased Calder Racecourse in Miami, Florida, from the Kawasaki Leasing Corporation for \$86 million. Churchill will take over operations once state regulatory approval, expected in late February, is completed. Churchill President Tom Meeker said, "Calder runs an eminently successful operation. One of the things that attracted us to Calder was the quality of its management team." Meeker added, "Based on Calder's most recent results, we expect this acquisition to contribute positively to our earnings in 1999." Last year, Calder netted around \$10 million before mortgage payments. The purchase of Calder is another in a long list of acquisitions by Churchill Downs. In addition to Calder and Churchill, the publicly traded corporation owns Ellis Park, Kentucky Downs and Hoosier Park. It also has interests in racing related companies such as Tracknet, a telecommunications consulting company, and Charlson Broadcast Technologies, which provides simulcast graphic software and video services to racetracks. Meeker said, "Churchill is looking to become a primary provider to the racing industry. In addition to the racetracks we own, we have acclimated ancillary properties recently. We are looking at putting together a comprehensive integrated company that can offer eight hours of racing 365 days a year." Reminded that there was a 15-week gap in its winter racing schedule, Meeker replied, "I didn't say it would be easy." Asked about the possible purchase of Gulfstream Park in Hallandale, Florida, he declined to talk about the track specifically but said, "We plan to continue making substantial investments in the industry as they become available."

ESCENA TO BE BRED TO SEEKING THE GOLD

Diane Snowden has announced that Eclipse Award candidate **Escena** (Strawberry Road {Aus}--Claxton's Slew, by Seattle Slew), who was recently purchased by Snowden's husband Guy for \$3.25 million at the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, will be bred to **Seeking the Gold** (Mr. Prospector). While racing under the colors of Allen Paulson, the six-year-old mare won 11 races from 29 starts and earned \$2,962,639. She capped off her career with a front-running nose victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

DUBAI WORLD CUP PURSE RAISED TO \$5

MILLION The purse for the 1999 edition of the G1 Dubai World Cup, set for Sunday, Mar. 28, has been raised from \$4 million to \$5 million. In addition, the purse for the Jebel Ali Free Zone Authority & Dubai Ports Authority Dubai Turf Classic, to be run on the World Cup undercard, has been increased \$250,000 to \$500,000. Renovations are underway at Nad Al Sheba Racecourse as well, including extension of the grandstand and improvement of the track's lighting system, which will enhance the television broadcast of the World Cup. "After three successful years of the Dubai World Cup, our aim is to try to bring about improvements to Dubai World Cup night, year on year," said Dubai World Cup Chairman Michael Osborne. "The prize fund additions which bring the total prize money on the night to \$6.25 million and the developments being undertaken at Nad Al Sheba reflect this determination."

DIXIE DOT COM SIDELINED Saturday's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. winner **Dixie Dot Com** (Dixie Brass) suffered a hairline fracture of the cannon bone in the race and will be out of action indefinitely. Trainer William Morey said, "One minute we've got the favorite for the (Feb. 6 GII Strub S.) and the next minute, we've got an injured horse. It hurts deeply." The four-year-old colt suffered a similar injury last winter which kept him sidelined for seven months. Dixie Dot Com will have surgery to correct the problem and be out for at least four months. To date, the colt has won five of nine starts and earned \$482,775.

SMITH BACK ON THE TRACK Almost five months after injuring his back in a spill at Saratoga, jockey Mike Smith was back on the track riding yesterday morning at Gulfstream Park. "It felt great," said Smith after riding Divide and Conquer for trainer Shug McGaughey. "It's good to be back. I'll start getting on a couple each morning. I hope to get my better mounts back and maybe pick up a three-year-old." Smith wants to be back by Jan. 31. "I'm really just trying to get back to riding. The rest will come. My first goal is my first race. I should be alright. I kept the weight off and stayed fit."

CANADIAN GRADED STAKES SCHEDULE

RELEASED The Canadian Graded Stakes Committee, which was formed after Canada officially withdrew from the North American Graded Stakes Committee last October, has announced a list of 40 stakes in the country which have received grading for 1999. The schedule includes six Grade I races, 10 Grade IIs and 24 Grade IIIs. The Grade I stakes are the \$175,000 Mazarine Breeders' Cup for two-year-old fillies, the \$175,000 Grey Breeders' Cup for two-year-olds, the \$125,000 Selene S. for three-year-old fillies, the \$400,000 E.P. Taylor S. for fillies and mares on the turf, and the \$1,000,000 Canadian International and the \$750,000 Woodbine Mile for three-year-olds and up on the turf. The Canadian Triple Crown races are not graded because they are restricted to Canadian-breds. (All purses are in Canadian dollars).

NUMBERS UP AT OBS WINTER MIXED A filly by Groomstick topped Wednesday's third and final session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's 1999 Winter Mixed Sale. Mac Fehsenfeld paid \$27,000 for hip number 590, a yearling filly out of Lend the Limit (Huckster), consigned by T-Square Stud, agent. For the session, 289 horses sold for a total of \$1,404,800, compared with 354 horses grossing \$1,830,600 in two sessions a year ago. During the three-day sale, the average increased 26.6 percent. "I was delighted to get the year off to such a strong start," said OBS Director of Sales Tom Ventura. "The market is a bit stronger than it was a year ago and the drop in the buyback percentage is an indication of a good sale and we hope to carry the momentum to our Calder Sale in February (Feb. 9)."

Waajib Death Remains A Mystery:

It has emerged that the stallion **Waajib (Ire)** (Try My Best), who on Monday was found dead in his stall at Schipol Airport in Amsterdam, Holland, while en route to Tara Stud in Ireland, may not have died of a heart attack as originally reported. Ministry vets in Holland have reportedly sent parts of the stallion to Utrecht University for investigation. Meanwhile, another unnamed stallion on the same flight from Australia has been put into isolation in Ireland, while two eventers who were sent to Captain Mark Phillips' establishment at Gatcombe Park in England are now being checked by British Ministry of Agriculture officials. Australian authorities strenuously denied reports that Waajib had died from equine morbillivirus (EMV), the same disease that killed 14 horses and trainer Vic Rail in Queensland, Australia, in September 1994. "In our discussions with the Dutch authorities, we both agree the horse showed absolutely no symptoms consistent with EMV," Carson Creagh of the Australian Quarantine Inspection Service (AQIS) told the *Australian Associated Press*.
