DONCASTER SALE OPENS TODAY The 1999 Doncaster January Sale, Europe's first auction of the new year, begins today, with bidding set to start at noon. The three-day event kicks off with the Stallion Parade of 40 stallions, followed by an offering of 85 broodmare and broodmare prospects. Mares in foal to such sires as Catrail, Emperor Jones, First Trump (GB), Night Shift, Petong (GB) and So Factual have been catalogued. Wednesday's session will feature 150 foals of 1998. The new yearlings will represent sires like Bin Ajwaad (Ire), Clantime (GB), Dolphin Street (Fr), Eagle Eyed, Grand Lodge, Inchinor (GB), Mind Games (GB), Muitahid, Piccolo (GB), Pursuit Of Love (GB), Sabrehill, Shaamit (Ire) and Whittingham (Ire). The third and final day of the January Sale offers a session of horses in and out of training and point-to-pointers.

MASSCAP PURSE INCREASE Suffolk Downs has increased the purse of the GII Massachusetts H. The 60th renewal of the race will now be worth \$600,000 with a guaranteed winner's share of \$400,000. The MassCap will be run May 29 and is part of the NTRA "Champions on Fox" series. Also receiving a purse increase, the newly renamed James B. Moseley Breeders' Cup H. will now be worth \$250,000. "In an effort to maintain the position of the MassCap as one of the nation's premier handicap races, and in conjunction with our role in the NTRA championship series, we thought it would be prudent to raise the purse," said Executive Vice President of Racing Lou Raffetto, Jr. "The guaranteed winner's value of \$400,000 is also one of the largest top shares for any handicap in the country. Our goal is to ensure the participation of the national divisional leaders."

CALDER STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED Calder Race Course has unveiled a 31-race 1999 stakes schedule worth a record \$4,275,000. The announcement was made by Calder Race Course President Ken Dunn and Senior Vice President of Racing Don Richardson of Churchill Downs Inc., the company which recently purchased the Florida track. "We have restructured our stakes schedule over the years to attract top-notch talent from outside the state to compete against Florida's best, and create more interest," said Dunn. "Last year we put more money into sprints because, nationally, it was a division that lacked large purses. This year, we've also positioned several stakes to serve as preparatory races for the Breeders' Cup." Highlights of the meet, which begins May 23, are the June 12 \$200,000 GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S., the July 3 \$200,000 Carry Back S., the Oct. 2 \$300,000 Miami Mile Breeders' Cup H., the Oct. 9 \$300,000 Smile Sprint H., the Oct. 16 \$300,000 GIII Princess Rooney H., and the Oct. 16 \$200,000 Calder Breeders' Cup H. The 1999 stakes schedule concludes with the Oct. 23 Calder Oaks and the Oct. 30 Calder Derby, both worth \$200,000.

French Purses to Rise:

The board of France Galop, the French racing authority, has adopted a budget for this year which will provide purse increases for both flat and jump racing in the country. Louis Romanet, general manager of France Galop, said, "The plan is to increase prize money by 1.5 percent in 1999, but as we had slightly overspent last year, especially on premiums paid out to French-bred horses racing overseas, the increase will effectively be around one percent. The increase of 5.6 million francs (\$1 million) is to be used mostly to help the purses at provincial tracks, to support Tierce races and to help finance divided handicaps at the Paris track and at Cagnes-Sur-Mer to avoid horses being balloted out." The purse for the 1999 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe has been raised more than 20 percent to 8,756,000 francs (\$1,576,067), with 5 million francs (\$899,993) going to the winner. But one of Europe's biggest prizes still lacks a sponsor. "This (Arc increase) has been achieved mainly thanks to money from the European Breeders' Fund," said Romanet. "It might be a little late to find a sponsor for this year's race, but hopefully we will find a sponsor for next year."

When Stop Traffic showed herself to be better than ever with her win in the GI Santa Monica H., this tough six-year-old paid a timely tribute to her sire, Cure The Blues, who died 12 days earlier. This underrated stallion had suffered complications following surgery on a fractured lea.

Cure The Blues' total progeny earnings of around \$37,000,000 represents a very respectable sum for a stallion whose career can't have been helped by several changes of location. He began his stallion career in 1982 at the Gilltown Stud in Ireland, billed as "a peerless performer" with "a matchless pedigree." While this description owed a lot to advertising hype, there was no denying that Cure The Blues was a very interesting stallion prospect.

He had ranked second to Lord Avie on the 1980 Experimental Free Handicap, thanks to a sequence of five wide-margin victories, including one in the GI Laurel Futurity. Foot problems always made Cure The Blues a difficult horse to train; he managed only one start at three in Florida, winning an allowance, before heading for New York. He nearly made it seven in a row in the Gotham S., but that was the last time he showed his true ability and his career ended with a disappointing effort in the Metropolitan H. in his 10th start.

The "matchless pedigree" part of his description stemmed largely from the fact that his second dam, Speedwell, was by Bold Ruler out of Imperatrice, which made her a three-parts sister to the wonderful Secretariat (by Bold Ruler out of Imperatrice's daughter Somethingroyal).

Cure The Blues returned to the U.S. for the 1987 breeding season, moving to Pillar Stud in Kentucky, and his return proved to be very timely. He had already been represented by Musical Lark, winner of the GI Matron S. in 1985, and further Grade I wins came his way when the French colt Le Glorieux took the 1987 Washington D.C. International and the ex-Irish Gaily Gaily won the 1988 Flower Bowl H.

After commanding a fee of \$35,000 in his three vears at Pillar Stud, Cure The Blues moved to Spendthrift. He had already started his third season there when a majority interest in him was sold to a group headed by John Stuart and Ben P. Walden Jr., who moved him to Vinery in March, 1992. Stop Traffic was conceived soon afterwards. Cure The Blues stayed at Vinery for 1993, but was on the move again by the end of the year, this time to stand at a fee of \$9,500 at Milfer Farm in New York.

Kentuck's loss soon proved to be New York's gain as Cure The Blues came up with an impressive total of 13 stakes winners in 1994, including Honky Tonk Tune (Canada's champion two-year-old filly) and Stormy Blues (GI Matron). The stakes winners have kept on coming, recent examples being Incurable Optimist, Dave Donk's candidate for the Irish 2000 Guineas, and Stop Traffic, whose first Grade I win came in the 1998 Ballerina H.

Her first Grade I placing came in the 1996 Acorn S., and I think it's fair to say that it was her racetrack achievements, rather than her bloodlines, that persuaded Gerald J. Ford to pay \$300,000 for her at Keeneland's 1996 November Sale. She had, after all, cost only \$85,000 as a yearling.

Stop Traffic is a half-sister to multiple stakes winner Bionic Soul, their dam being Save My Soul, whose only stakes placing came in the Inaugural H. at Lincoln in Nebraska, Her broodmare sire, I'ma Hell Raiser, never won a stakes race, but this son of Raise A Native was runner-up in the Arlington Classic and the Sheridan S.
