"He loved the track. The track is in great shape," said Baffert. "He can run anywhere. He's run in Dubai, he's run at Turfway Park. He takes his racetrack with him." In other Donn developments, Unruled (Notebook), who ran second to Skip Away in last year's Donn, worked five furlongs at Gulfstream in 1:03 2/5 Tuesday. Truluck (Conquistador Cielo) will be ridden by Mike Smith, who will return to action after being out since August with a neck injury he sustained in a spill at Saratoga.

Italian Strike Ends:

The Italian strike that has halted racing since Jan. 1 is at an end and racing will resume in Pisa on Friday. It was decided that, for the next two months, racing will be conducted with prize money at 10 percent below 1998 levels instead of the original 30 percent cut. Transmissions of live television broadcasts to betting shops will also resume. Discussions are now taking place to establish a more permanent structure for both racing and trotting so that no further industrial action will be needed.

Jim and Tonic Targets Dubai World Cup:

Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed {Fr}), second in the GI Woodbine Mile and winner of the G2 Hong Kong International Bowl, is being aimed at this year's Dubai World Cup. His trainer, Francois Doumen commented, "Jim and Tonic returned in great form from his win in Hong Kong. He's in tremendous form and we will seriously consider the Dubai World Cup. He is not entered at present, but he will be entered on Feb. 3 at the second entry stage." Doumen said his charge could prep for the World Cup in the G3 Prix Exbury at Saint-Cloud two weeks earlier.

Millie Fox Dead at 93:

Millie Fox, the woman widely regarded as Sydney's first lady of racing, died yesterday following a long illness. She was 93. Mrs. Fox and her late husband, coal mining magnate Stan, were the most prolific racehorse owners in Australia. In 1965, when Stan Fox asked his wife what she would like for her birth-day, she replied "a beautiful racehorse" and thus began a magnificent racing empire. When Stan Fox died suddenly in 1974, many anticipated his wife would scale down her bloodstock interests. On the contrary, she linked in 1978 with fast food entrepreneur Bob Lapointe and international breeder Robert Sangster with the aim of turning Nebo Lodge at Rosehill into Sydney's premier training establishment.

Might and Power Near Return to Races?:

Sydney racegoers should not rule out seeing Might and Power (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) this (Southern Hemisphere) autumn, owner Nick Moraitis said Tuesday. Moraitis said there was every chance the reigning Horse of the Year would have one or two lead-up races in Sydney before campaigning in Queensland to defend the Hollindale and Doomben Cups. "I think there's every chance he could be back to work in the next two or three weeks to prepare for Queensland," Moraitis told *Australian Associated Press*.

New York Governor Pataki Seeks Higher Takeout:

The takeout on exotic wagers at the New York State tracks may soon be raised in order to foot the bill for the New York State Racing and Wagering Board. New York Governor George Pataki issued his proposed executive budget yesterday and it included a proposal to raise the takeout on triples, superfectas, Pick Threes and Pick Sixes at all New York racetracks from 25 to 27 percent. In the budget proposal, it is estimated that the increase in takeout will raise \$13.5 million. Most of that (\$11.8 million) will be earmarked to fund the NYSRWB. Another \$1.7 million from the new surcharge will be for direct assistance to the racing industry. It was not specified exactly how that money would be divvied up. NYRA executives were not available for comment.

Another Hat Trick for Smith:

For the third time this month, 16-year-old apprentice Ariel Smith won three races in a single day at Aqueduct yesterday. He also accomplished the feat on Jan. 7 and Jan. 21. As a result of the wins, Smith went from being a double-bug (seven-pound allowance) to a singlebug (five-pound allowance). He won yesterday's fourth, seventh and eighth races. A fourth win slipped away when Track City Lad was disqualified after finishing first in the ninth race.

FLORIDA'S SOPHOMORE CLASS

In past years, the three-year-olds with true Triple Crown ambitions already would have started to rise to the top. Not this year. As we hurdle through January, the cream of the crop are still mixed with the second and third strings of contenders that make sorting through the pile so much fun. Looking at the Floridabased bunch, we'll try and separate the contenders from the pretenders.

Casanova Star (A.P. Indy--Minstrella, by The Minstrel) is developing well for trainer Mark Hennig, winning his non-winners of two lifetime Jan. 16. Look to Hennig to step up his schedule. "He's going to go in the Fountain of Youth (GI, Feb. 20)," he said. "He needed that allowance race to help educate him. I'm hoping he got a lot out of that race, he had mud kicked in his face, now he knows what that's like. He's catching on."

Chief Minister (Deputy Minister--Mended Heart, by *Le Fabuleux) was pegged as one to watch by trainer Elliott Walden, who traveled from Payson Park to Fair Grounds to saddle the colt for an impressive maiden victory in his second career start Jan. 23. The dark bay set all the pace and left the field 10 1/2 lengths in his wake at the wire in the 1 1/16-mile test.

Dan's Report (Corporate Report--Lasting Glory, by Wild Again) might not be worth a mention except for the fact that those fun-loving folks that brought you Rock and Roll last year, Madeline Paulson and Jenny Craig, along with Dee Dee Snowden just paid \$300,000 for this colt. They sent him to Hall of Fame trainer Bill Mott. From Payson Park Mott said he hasn't decided where to go with the Florida-bred, who's eligible for non-winners of one after five starts at Calder as a twoyear-old.

Doneraile Court (Seattle Slew--Sophisticated Girl, by Stop the Music) finished second in the Jan. 16 GIII Holy Bull and is being pointed towards the March 13 GI Florida Derby and the March 27 GII Gallery Furniture.com S., nee Jim Beam, at Turfway Park. "I'd like the winner's share of that \$750,000 race," said trainer Nick Zito, who once handled a string for Gallery Furniture owner Jim McIngvale. Ecton Park (Forty Niner--Daring Danzig, by Danzig) was racing near the front in an allowance race on Holy Bull day, was eased back, then charged up for second money behind Casanova Star. Looks like Elliott Walden and Shane Sellers were trying to teach a lesson to this colt, who is still eligible for non-winners of one allowance. Walden said, "He came out of his allowance race fine. I'm looking for another allowance race before I try him against stakes competition. He's always been a good horse in the morning and he's improving."

Kettle Won (Colonial Affair--Safe At the Plate, by Double Zeus), a 10 1/2-length maiden winner at Saratoga Aug. 29, is behind in his schedule according to trainer Todd Pletcher. He'll look for an allowance race when the colt catches up.

Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo--Charming Lassie, by Seattle Slew), winner of Belmont's GI Futurity at two, finished fifth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile to end his '98 season. Trainer Scotty Schulhofer is looking for a two-turn race for his three-year-old debut. The Florida Derby is a possibility on the way to the Kentucky Derby.

Lion Hearted (Storm Cat--Cadillacing, by Alydar) got the worst of a speed-favoring track in his first start at three, finishing third in a non-winners of two lifetime allowance Jan. 16. Expect Shug McGaughey to have this colt ready to roll the next time. But as for the future, McGaughey said, "I'll take each race one at a time."

Lucky Roberto (Belong to Me--Roberto's Gal, by Roberto), winner of the GI Hopeful at Saratoga in his latest appearance, is being readied for his return by trainer Frank Alexander. Alexander said he is thinking about the seven-furlong GIII Swale S. March 13 at Gulfstream, and then possibly the GI Toyota Blue Grass April 10 at Keeneland and the Kentucky Derby May 1. Alexander said, "He worked (last Thursday), going five furlong in 1:02 2/5. He's been off since August because he was sick. We lost some training time, so rather than rush him back for the fall races we decided to give him time off. I'm looking at something near the end of the Gulfstream meeting, possibly the Swale."

Pineaff (Pine Bluff--Kerplop, by Affirmed) finished fourth in the Holy Bull for trainer Ken McPeek. He expects to send the colt to the Feb. 20 GI Fountain of Youth, the Florida Derby and the Blue Grass before the Derby. McPeek said, "I think he'll get better as he goes longer. I'm thinking of keeping him out of the Fountain of Youth because he's already shown that the distance is too short. He was 15 lengths out of it in the Holy Bull at the half-mile pole. I don't think we can accomplish anything going that distance again. The Florida Derby will be his next start."

The Groom Is Red (Runaway Groom--Sheena's Gold, by Fast Gold) won the GI Champagne as a two-year-old before running sixth in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He is being pointed towards the Fountain of Youth, Florida Derby and Blue Grass.

Silk Broker (Pentelicus--Silk Stocks, by Medieval Man), also trained by Frank Alexander, was second behind Prime Directive in the GII Saratoga Special in August. A Gulfstream allowance winner on his return Jan. 3, he is expected to come back in the Jan. 31 GII Hutcheson S. Alexander said, "He worked the same day as Lucky Roberto, going five furlongs in 1:01. He came out of his race at the beginning of the Gulfstream meeting fine. Our goal is to see him go around two turns. I'm looking at the (seven-furlong) Hutcheson and hope he can make the step up. With three-year-olds you just never know."

Vicar (Wild Again--Escrow Agent, by El Gran Senor) finished fifth in the Holy Bull, but trainer Carl Nafzger and jockey Jerry Bailey were trying to get the head-strong colt to rate, so they let him run early, then took him back. "He got mugged in the Holy Bull, said Nafzger. "He's doing well and will go in the Fountain of Youth and the Florida Derby."
