DONN FOLLOW-UP Donn H. winner Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky) and the 4-5 beaten favorite Silver Charm (Silver Buck) came out of Saturday's race in good order and are scheduled to leave Gulfstream Park today to fly back to California. "He came out of the race fine," said Kiki Spencer, an assistant to Dick Mandella, of the winner. "We were not surprised that he won. He ran a great race." Mandella has indicated the March 28 \$5 million Dubai World Cup would be the five-year-old's next start. Said April Mayberry, assistant to trainer Bob Baffert, of third-place Silver Charm, "He's fine this morning. He's a little tired. Bob had said that the Santa Anita H. would be his next start, but that could change." Hanarsaan (Hansel), fourth, beaten just a neck by Silver Charm at 129-1, will look for easier pickings, said trainer Stanley Hough. "It was a great effort," said Hough. "I don't where he'll start next, but it will be an easier spot." Two-time graded stakes winner Crypto Star (Cryptoclearance), who pulled up lame and vanned off after an 11th-place finish in the Donn, suffered a cannon bone fracture in his left front leg and was scheduled to undergo surgery by Dr. Greg Bonen-Clark at the Circle S. Farm in Davie, Florida yesterday afternoon. "I talked with (jockey) Robbie Davis and he wasn't sure when it happened in the race," said trainer Larry Kelly. "We had to van him off after the race and according to the vet it is a cannon bone fracture and he will operate and put two screws in the leg. It figures to keep him out of action for at least six months and for the immediate future, I'll keep him at the Circle S. Farm," he said.

Silk Broker. The Kennedy Space Center is well up the eastern shore of Florida, but those in attendance for the GII Hutcheson S. might have guessed that the facility had relocated to Hallandale. Bet Me Best, undefeated and never headed in five tries coming into this effort, had won those races by an average of nearly 10 lengths, but had never faced the likes of Texas Glitter, who splashed his way to a five-length victory in the Jan. 3 GIII Spectacular Bid S. Blasting away from his inside post, Texas Glitter set fractions of 21.70 and 43.69, with Jerry Bailey on Bet Me Best content to sit just off the leader. As they turned for home, Bet Me Best drew on even terms with Texas Glitter. Bailey said, "It kind of turned into a two-horse race at the quarter pole and by the time I got to the turn, I decided to go after Texas Glitter." The two raced as a team for the entire length of the stretch, with Bet Me Best gaining a short advantage leaving the eighth pole and bested Texas Glitter after a thrilling, if bumpy, stretch duel. "We want to try him longer," said new trainer Elliott Walden. "Whether he will go longer, I don't know. The Kentucky Derby is an extreme stretch, but a race like the one-mile (GIII) Gotham is not." He indicated that the next leg of the Florida Derby series, the GI Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 20, has not been completely ruled out. Whereas Bet Me Best may try to get a distance of ground, trainer Todd Pletcher seems more inclined to keep Texas Glitter short. "I think we want to stay sprinting, but I'll talk it over with the owners and we'll go from there." Cat Thief, making his first start since his third-place finish in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, raced well back early and came with a sustained run to be clearly third.

Mike Harrington, trainer of the runner-up, Buck Trout, said, "It looks like he got outrun to me. He relaxed nice today, but he just got outrun. I don't know what we'll do next."
