ARRESTED DREAMS INJURED Three-year-old filly Arrested Dreams (Dehere), five-for-six lifetime and runner-up in last season's GI Matron S., has come up with minor problems in both her knees and will be out of action until the summer, according to her connections. "She worked good (Thursday), but she had just a little bit of soreness to her right front leg," assistant trainer Bobby Kelly said. "We want to get some (arthroscopic) surgery on her knees. They're going to look at her at the vet clinic in Kentucky. The vets are looking at the (X-rays)...she has a weak spot on the bone and she might chip it off. She'll be back in about five months."

THE GROOM IS RED THIRD IN '99 BOW The Groom Is Red (Runaway Groom), winner of the GI Champagne S. at two, made his first start since a sixthplace finish in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in a 1 1/16-mile allowance at Gulfstream vesterday. Sent off as the 3-5 chalk coupled with stablemate Cryptodiplomacy (Cryptoclearance), the three-year-old was last for six furlongs over the sloppy strip, came out six-wide for the stretch run and closed on the leaders at the top of the lane, but couldn't keep up the rally and finished third, beaten 4 1/2 lengths by Certain (Out Of Place); Cryptodiplomacy was second. "He made a good move around the stretch turn, but then he just couldn't sustain it through the stretch," said jockey Jerry Bailey. "I don't think the track had anything to do with it." Added trainer Nick Zito, "I liked the way he ran. He made up a lot of ground, but he was wide on the turn, which is tough on this track. I would have liked to win, but this was a good effort. He'll go forward from here. He'll run in the Fountain Of Youth (GI, Feb. 20), that's for sure."

Medieval alchemists never did succeed in their attempts to turn base metals into gold, but South America's breeders seem to have discovered how to produce racehorses of the highest quality from stallions whose racing records were far from golden.

Gentlemen (Arg)'s sire Robin des Bois is a case in point. This son of Nureyev won only one of his six starts, a Listed race, and was rated 17 pounds below the best of his age by Timeform.

Gallantsky, sire of last Saturday's stylish Donn H. winner Puerto Madero, is another fine example. This son of Nijinsky II managed to win only one of his 16 starts in France, and reached the first three only once in stakes company, before being sent to Chile. The French handicappers rated Gallantsky no less than 26 pounds inferior to Three Troikas (Fr), the best three-year-old of 1979, after he had finished a respectable fourth in the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil, third in the Prix de Menneval and fourth in the G3 Prix de Lutece. Gallantsky's Lutece effort established that he stayed nearly two miles, but Puerto Madero is very well suited by distances around nine furlongs, as he has shown with his wins in the Native Diver H. and the Donn.

Gallantsky would have struggled to attract quality mares in the European industry, but his impressive international bloodlines were enough to make him a very different proposition in Chile where he effectively became a big fish in a much smaller pool.

In addition to being a son of the exceptional Nijinsky, Gallantsky had the attraction of being a grandson of Lady Pitt, America's champion three-year-old filly of 1966. Lady Pitt was as tough as she was talented, clocking up 14 starts at two and another 16 at three, when her wins included the Mother Goose S. and the Coaching Club American Oaks.

Although Lady Pitt's sons included The Liberal Member, winner of the GI Brooklyn H., it largely has been her daughters who have ensured that her name lives on. Three of them have produced Graded Stakes winners, including her Buckpasser fillies Bank Of England (dam of the Reviewer colt Comptroller) and Queen Pot. In addition to Gallantsky, Queen Pot bred King of Clubs, a very successful European miler.

However, it has been Lady Pitt's Riva Ridge filly Blitey, winner of the GII Maskette H. and GII Test S., who has done most to perpetuate Lady Pitt's name by producing the Graded Stakes winners Dancing All Night, Dancing Spree, Fantastic Find and Furlough. Significantly, Gallantsky's sire Nijinsky has played a major part in Blitey's success story, siring Dancing All Night and Dancing Spree (winner of Grade I races over three different distances) as well as Oh What a Dance, the unraced dam of the Grade I winners Heavenly Prize and Oh What A Windfall.

With a background of this quality, it is hardly surprising that Gallantsky has sired over 20 stakes winners, including Puerto Madero's brother Chantilly (Chi), a winner at Grade 1 level in Peru, and Patio de Naranjos (Chi), a Chilean champion who became a Grade III winner in the U.S.

Gallantsky sired Puerto Madero from Paty Game, a minor winner in Chile, and it is a remarkable fact that the Donn winner was produced by a pair which jointly won only two of their 33 starts. Gallantsky also sired a notable performer from Paty Game's sister Pachita Game (Chi), this being L'Express (Chi), a Chilean champion who went on to finish third in two Graded Stakes at up to nine furlongs in California.

### WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

Sydney's mad tropical summer, with its sudden fiery storms and pelting of warm rain, is slowly giving up the fight to autumn as Randwick's glorious old Oak trees show hints of changing colour. There is a delicious hint of heady anticipation in the air as the nation's topliners make early raceday forays. Who knows, Might And Power (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) could even turn up for Sydney's autumn racing carnival. It is understood that Australia's reigning Horse of the Year returned to Jack Denham's Rosehill training base this week, but Denham's not saying a word and the close-knit Rosehill racing community has closed ranks and will keep silent, too.

The focus this season will be on Melbourne's rich early autumn races, with triple crowns galore and the AUS\$1 million (US\$611,995) Blue Diamond S. for two-year-olds, switching to Sydney for the Golden Slipper carnival and the Australian Jockey Club carnival, climaxing on Doncaster-Derby day and concluding Apr. 17.

Although the shuttle stallions departed last month, their presence is being felt in a big way despite the fact that Australasian hero Zabeel (Sir Tristram {Ire}) has a stranglehold on this year's sires' championship. The stallion has a strong hand this autumn, with three-year-olds Dignity Dancer (NZ) and Sky Heights (NZ), promising filly Nahayan (NZ) and Doncaster H. hope Bezeal Bay (NZ).

But as Golden Slipper fever takes hold, two-year-olds eclipse everything else, at least in Sydney. In the wake of his win at Rosehill Saturday, his second in as many starts, Commands (Aus) (Danehill) is dominating talk at present, firming from 10-1 to 6-1 for the Group 1 AUS\$2.5 million (\$1,529,988) race over six furlongs March 27. There is no doubt Commands is far more precocious than his five-time Grade 1-winning brother Danewin (Aus), who came to hand as a late two-year-old to win the Listed Fernhill H. at Randwick over eight furlongs.

Commands accelerates brilliantly, he has a beautiful action and stable staff at Crown Lodge are already comparing him with former champion Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel). It's not such a long bow, since Commands' dam Cotehele House (GB) (Eight Carat {GB}) is Octagonal's half-sister. Trainer John Hawkes is exceptionally tight-lipped about the colt.

There is a feeling that while Commands will have to stay "up" for another eight weeks to claim the Slipper, Melbourne trainers including three-time Slipper winner Lee Freedman have yet to show their hand. Freedman's unraced colt The Golden Dane (Aus) (Danehill) is at 16-1 following heavy support over the past week.

Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner Brocco (Kris S.) is creeping quietly into serious contention. The only Grade I-winning Roberto sireline horse to stand at stud in Australia, Brocco covered a remarkable book of mares in his first two seasons here but surprisingly, the deeds of his first runners haven't attracted much attention to date. However, we won't be able to ignore Brocco's youngsters for much longer if they keep going like Saturday's stakes winner Charm Scene Land (Aus). The Peter Hayes-trained colt won the Listed Talindert S. at Flemington Saturday, beating Sudurka (Aus) (Perugino) by five lengths at his second start. He'll take on even money favourite Testa Rossa (Aus) (Perugino) in the Blue Diamond S. at Caulfield Feb. 27.

The classy Charm Scene Land's success follows that of G3 Blue Diamond Preview runner-up Miss Pennymoney (Aus), a half-sister to Golden Slipper winner Merlene (Aus) (Danehill) who is raced by Arrowfield syndicate. Brocco's colt Lure Of London (Aus) won by five lengths at Ascot in Perth on his debut before being unplaced in the Blue Diamond Preview.

Boom New Zealand filly Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) stretched her unbeaten record to eight when she won first-up at Ellerslie in Auckland yesterday. Carrying 138 pounds, Sunline was ridden hands and heels to the line by Larry Cassidy to beat Delphic (Aus), to whom she conceded 12 pounds, in the Windsor Park Breeder of the Year Sprint for three-year-old fillies. Cassidy made a special trip from Sydney to Auckland to ride Sunline, on whom he won three races in Sydney last spring including the G1 Flight S. Oct. 3. She will next contest the first leg of the triple crown series for three-year-old fillies, the G3Angus Armanasco S. at Caulfield Feb. 20.

The New Zealand Bloodstock premier sale session begins tonight and this year's sale has attracted Irishman Demi O'Byrne, a fixture on the northern hemisphere sale's scene buying yearlings for Michael Tabor and John Magnier. A huge plus for the Karaka catalogue is the inclusion of a trio of youngsters by sought after stallion Lure (Danzig) (two colts and a filly) and Thunder Gulch (Gulch) (a filly and two colts). The premier session begins at 5p.m. and continues Wednesday and Thursday.
