DANEHILL FILLY TOPS IN NEW ZEALAND

Trainer Bart Cummings went to NZ\$850,000 (US\$455,764) to buy a yearling filly by Danehill out of Taareck (Aus) (Bluebird) at yesterday's second session of the New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Sale. Consigned by Cambridge Stud, she is out of a half sister to Golden Slipper winner Canny Lad (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}) and MG1SW Canny Lass (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}). That the Danehill filly topped the session surprised many, who expected a colt by Danehill out of Nine Carat (*Sir Tristram), herself a half sister to Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), to fetch the highest price on the day. The colt, also consigned by Cambridge Stud, brought a final bid of NZ\$800,000 (\$428,954) from Dr. Gene Tsoi of Hong Kong. A total of 188 lots sold for an average of NZ\$93,473 (\$50,120) Wednesday. Through the first two days of the auction, 67 yearlings have brought six figures, compared with 57 during last year's entire sale. Fillies are averaging NZ\$113,083 (\$60,634), while colts are averaging NZ\$83,368 (\$44,701). Danehill leads all sires at the auction, with his seven lots selling for an average of NZ\$425,000 (\$227,882). Thunder Gulch is hot on his heels, with his three sold averaging NZ\$400,000 (\$214,477). The sale concludes today.

CHURCHILL & FASIG-TIPTON PLAN DERBY

WEEK SALE Churchill Downs and Fasig-Tipton Company will offer a new sale of two-year-olds in training this spring. Fasig-Tipton is seeking entries and nominations for the new Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Derby 125 Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale, scheduled for Monday, Apr. 26 at the Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum. "It's possible that the winner of next year's Kentucky Derby could walk through the sales ring at Churchill Downs Sports Spectrum during the week of Derby 125," said Don Richardson, senior vice president of racing. "The sale also provides buyers with an opportunity to purchase a horse that is ready to compete in our important trio of Spring Meet stakes races for juveniles--the WHAS-11, GIII Kentucky Breeders' Cup and the GII Bashford Manor."

MORE GODOLPHIN DERBY HOPEFULS NAMED

Two more names have surfaced as part of Godolphin's planned invasion of the May 1 Kentucky Derby. Along with Comeonmom (Jolie's Halo), Worldy Manner (Riverman) and Aljabr (Storm Cat), Godolphin may attempt to run Holy Pole (Polish Numbers) and Prado's Landing (El Prado {Ire}) in the Derby. Both horses were purchased last summer from American interests. Holy Pole has not raced since winning the Pennsylvania Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association S. at Philadelphia Park Sept. 12. He is two-for-three lifetime and, according to former trainer Reynaldo Nobles, was sold for \$1.1 million. "This horse has a great disposition and he can really run," Nobles said. Prado's Landing broke his maiden by 31/2 lengths in his third career outing at Laurel July 30. Former trainer John Robb declined to disclose the sale price. "I always thought this horse had a nice future," Robb said. "He was doing great when we sold him." Godolphin has nominated eight horses to the Triple Crown, but has so far declined to release their names. According to Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford, none of the Godolphin horses will have any official preps for the Kentucky Derby. Rather, they will run in trial races against one another at Nad al Sheba Race Course in Dubai. Crisford said there may be two such prep races and they will determine which horses Godolphin will send to the Derby.

BET ME BEST INJURED Undefeated three-year-old Bet Me Best (Barberstown) suffered a non-displaced chip in his right front knee and will be away from the races until the end of August. The injury was found after the gelding captured Sunday's GII Hutcheson at Gulfstream Park. "He's still pretty sound," trainer Elliott Walden reported yesterday. "If he was any lesser of a horse, you could probably run him with this. It's not that big a deal." No decision on whether the gelding will have surgery to repair the injury has been made. Walden said he hopes to have Bet Me Best back on track in August with an eye towards the Breeders' Cup Sprint. "He's not nominated, but that's what we're going for. We've already seen enough of him to see he's that kind of horse," Walden said of his Breeders' Cup aspirations. Bet Me Best has started and won six races for earnings of \$236,136.

SHAKE THE YOKE RETIRED Shake the Yoke (GB) (Caerleon--Bermuda Classic {Ire}, by Double Form {Ire}) has been retired from racing and will be bred to Pleasant Colony. The six-year-old had not raced since winning the GIII Wilshire H. in May. The mare was plagued by sore feet, a problem that led to her retirement, according to trainer Ron Ellis. Shake the Yoke, a two-time Group winner in France, finished second in the 1996 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, the 1995 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac and the 1996 G1 Coronation S. She began her North American campaign with a runner-up finish in the 1996 GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup S. and raced only once in 1997. In five 1998 starts, the bay mare finished second in the GII Buena Vista H. and was second behind Fiji (GB) in the GII Santa Ana before ending her career with two victories. Shake the Yoke retires with five wins and five seconds in 15 starts for earninas of \$701,620.

PREVIEW Swept Overboard (End Sweep) zipped a quarter mile in :21 2/5 to record the fastest work at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Under Tack Preview for the 1999 Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training at Calder Tuesday. The colt, consigned by Mark Casse, agent, sells during the Feb. 9 auction as hip number 77. The fastest furlong work was turned in by Manofglory (Glitterman), hip number 62, consigned by Ricky Leppala, agent. The colt covered the distance in :10 1/5. The second Under Tack Show is set for Feb. 7 beginning at 10:30 a.m. The sale begins Feb. 9 at 10:30 a.m.

The recently formed California Marketing Committee, which represents racetracks, horsemen and the California Association of Racing Fairs, announced yesterday that it will be using National Thoroughbred Racing Association advertising in its inaugural campaign. The committee will administer a \$6 million fund to market horse racing. The fund was established from license fees based on Thoroughbred racing handle in the state. When General Challenge kept his unbeaten record intact in the GII Santa Catalina S., it seemed fair to guess that this exciting colt's pedigree would not match up to his very encouraging performances. He is, after all, a California-bred son of an inexpensive California-based stallion.

However, a bit of research quickly reveals that the Mabees' General Meeting colt has a pedigree worthy of a potential Kentucky Derby challenger.

With Magical Allure, Excellent Meeting and Career Collection already to his credit, General Meeting is proving a good deal more effective as a stallion than he was as a racehorse. Indeed, he is fulfilling the potential of his illustrious bloodlines. His sire Seattle Slew won the Triple Crown and his broodmare sire Alydar would have done so as well, had he not been born the same year as Affirmed.

General Challenge's dam, Excellent Lady, won four times, repaying nearly all of the \$110,000 she cost John C. Mabee at Keeneland's 1987 July Yearling Sale. This Windfields-bred mare is a half-sister to Southern Halo, a Grade I performer who did so outstandingly well at stud in Argentina that he is now a member of Ashford's distinguished stallion team. Their dam, the Gl Test S. winner Northern Sea, was a very talented daughter of Northern Dancer and the excellence continues down through the generations. General Challenge's third dam, the Sea Bird filly Sea Saga, was one of the best three-year-old fillies of 1971, when her victories included the Ladies H. over 1 1/4 miles. And his fifth dam, Lea Lark, made a lasting impression on the American industry through her Nasrullah fillies Leallah, Lea Lane and Lea Moon.

The Lea Moon branch is currently being represented by Lujain, Seeking The Gold's winner of the G1 Middle Park S. last October, so 1999 could turn out to be a memorable year for Lea Lark's descendants.
