NEW ZEALAND PREMIER SALE CONCLUDES

Heavyweight racehorse owners Robert Sangster and Sheikh Hamdan al Maktoum participated in the final session of New Zealand Bloodstock's Premier Sale, but it was Australian "Cups King" Bart Cummings who emerged as leading buyer, spending NZ\$3.43 million (US\$1.8 million) on eight youngsters including the sale-topping NZ\$850,000 (\$455,764) Danehill filly and yesterday's session topper, a colt by Zabeel (NZ) out of Court (NZ) (Prince Echo {Ire}). Consigned by Cambridge Stud, he sold for NZ\$575,000 (\$308,311). The sale average was NZ\$94,067 (\$50,438), with 394 lots grossing NZ\$37,062,500 (\$19,872,654). Most significantly, the middle market was buoyant throughout with a median price of NZ\$60,000 (\$32,172) and more than 100 lots fetching more than six figures. Until recently Cummings was unable to stretch his wings at the yearling sales as, after the failed Cups King Syndicate in the late 1980s, he was left with debts totaling more than NZ\$20 million (\$10,723,860). But Cummings made arrangements to repay his creditors in a five-year deal and, having fulfilled his obligations, the Randwick master is making up for lost time. Sangster arrived from Barbados to give NZ\$400,000 (\$214,477) for Hip# 321, a Slavic--Abbaye (Aus) (Ahonoora {GB}) filly who will go to Peter Hayes' stable. Sangster has about 300 gallopers here and he hopes this purchase, whose second dam is Cotehele House (GB), the dam of five-time Group 1 winner Danewin (Aus) (Danehill), will win him a Golden Slipper. Agent Angus Gold, acting on behalf of Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Ltd., yesterday paid NZ\$450,000 (\$241,287) for a colt by Lure from the American mare Dragoncello (Diesis {GB}). That colt will also go to Hayes. "The most impressive features (of the sale) are that the average price is up 17.25 percent on last year and that the clearance rate was 85.75 percent," NZ Bloodstock chairman Peter Vela told New Zealand Press Association. "It was two years ago that New Zealand breeders started seriously upgrading broodmare ranks and the progeny of those new purchases have yet to reach the catalogue," Vela added. "The first of them will be sold next year." Leading sire of the sale by average was Danehill, with eight sold for an average NZ\$403,125 (\$216,153). Thunder Gulch was runner-up with three sold for an average of NZ\$400,000 (\$214,477). Lure was third with three sold for an average of NZ\$276,667 (\$148,347).

DELAWARE '99 STAKES WORTH \$4.5 MILLION

Highlighted by the \$500,000 GIII Delaware H. and two other newly graded events, the 1999 Delaware Park stakes schedule released yesterday is worth a track record \$4.5 million. The three graded stakes will be run during the \$1.35 million Delaware Park Handicap Weekend Racing Festival scheduled for July 24 and 25. The Delaware H., for fillies and mare at a mile and a quarter, will be run on July 25. Also run that day, the \$250,000 GIII Kent Breeders' Cup will be contested by three-year-olds at nine furlongs on the turf. Saturday, July 24 the spotlight will be on the \$250,000 GIII Delaware Oaks. Every weekend during the 139-day meet, which opens on Apr. 10 and closes on Oct. 31, will feature at least one stakes worth \$50,000 or more. Sixteen stakes have purses of \$100,000 or more. Racing will be conducted Saturday, Sunday, Monday and Tuesday. Wednesdays will be added beginning May 19 and continue through Oct. 6.



THREE MORE GODOLPHIN DERBY NOMINEES REVEALED Sources say that Continental Mile winner **Breathtaking View** (Country Pine), Del Mar maiden winner **Always Believe** (Carr de Naskra) and Louisiana Downs maiden winner **Festive Bid** (Festive) are the other three Godolphin-owned Triple Crown nominees. The three colts, all purchased privately from American interests, bring the number of Godolphin nominees to eight. The list of Triple Crown nominees will be released Saturday.

Reinstated Bookmaker Applies for Aussie License:

Rob Waterhouse, who returned to the racetrack last spring after the Thoroughbred Racing Board lifted a 14-year suspension in the wake of the infamous 1984 Fine Cotton ringer affair in Brisbane, Australia, has applied for bookmaker's license Down Under. He was interviewed by the credentials committee of the New South Wales Bookmakers' Co-operative Society earlier this week. The co-operative gives a financial guarantee to all bookmakers in the state. His application will go before the full board of the co-operative next Monday and if granted a guarantee, then it is up to Waterhouse where he applies to field.

Melbourne Cup Heroine to Stay in Training:

Retirement plans for Melbourne Cup heroine **Jezabeel (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}) have been shelved in favour of a Japan Cup preparation later this year. Trainer Brian Jenkins said Jezabeel's owners agreed to give the mare another Australian campaign this spring, but added that the six-year-old's chances of becoming the first mare to win two Melbourne Cups hinge on whether she is invited to the Japan Cup. He said Jezabeel's initial target would be the Caulfield Cup.
