Cal Tracks to Offer Simulcasting Extravaganza:

California's Thoroughbred tracks and satellite wagering facilities have announced plans for an all-day "simulcast extravaganza" set for Wednesday, Feb. 17. The 62-race program will begin with the first from Aqueduct and include the cards from Gulfstream, Turfway, Turf Paradise and Australia, as well as six races from Hong Kong. Because they will have held live programs that Monday for President's Day, the California tracks will be dark Feb. 17. "This will provide us with a good test of how much interest racing fans have in seeing out-of-state simulcast races on dark days," the announcement, from Santa Anita's Clifford Goodrich and Bay Meadows' F. Jack Liebau, stated. Bill Oppenheim Joins Forces With Swedes:


Bill Oppenheim, racing journalist and publisher of Racing Update from 1979-95, has been named parttime advisor to the Swedish Jockey Club for 1999. Bjorn Eklund, deputy secretary-general of the Jockey Club, said, "We've been very impressed with the breadth of (Oppenheim's) knowledge and international contacts, and we're very much looking forward to working with him on projects which we hope will improve our industry and enhance our stature in the international racing community." Oppenheim, who conducted seminars in Stockholm and Malmo last May, said, "On the whole, the racing program in Sweden and the rest of Scandinavia is pretty good. We feel there is a lot of scope for attracting good horses from outside Scandanavia to race in Sweden. But the breeding sector has lagged behind the racing, and we're looking at developing a series of sponsored races for fillies and mares to try and attract better mares to race and breed in Sweden."

South African Guineas Winner Takes on Elders:

Sixteen runners will line up for today's G1 J & B Met H. over a 1 1/4 miles at Kenilworth in The Cape, but all eyes will be on Harry and Bridget Oppenheimer's colt Horse Chestnut (SAf) (Fort Wood {Ire}), who will be attempting to become the first three-year-old since 1947 to win one of South Africa's most prestigious races. Trained by Mike De Kock and ridden by Weichong Mawing, Horse Chestnut, clear winner of last month's G1 Cape Argus Guineas, is the only member of his generation in the field. He faces some stiff opposition, which includes the 1997-98 Horse Of The Year Classic Flag (SAf) (Allied Flag), but the three-year-old has only 112 pounds to shoulder and has drawn a perfect post position of seven in the full field. Bookmakers are taking no chances with this outstanding colt, offering odds of only 7-10.
