**NUMBER 6,000 FOR DELAHOUSSAYE** Jockey Eddie Delahoussaye became only the 14th rider in North American racing history to win 6,000 races after he piloted even-money Sweetcakesanshakes to a 4 1/2-length victory in the third race at Santa Anita yesterday afternoon. Delahoussaye, 47, has been riding for 31 years. The Louisiana native picked up his first winner, Brown Shill, at Evangeline Downs in his home state June 29, 1968, and has since captured five Triple Crown races, including the 1982 Kentucky Derby with Gato del Sol and the '83 "Run for the Roses" with Sunny's Halo, and seven Breeders' Cup events. He was elected to the Hall of Fame in 1993. A regular on the Southern California circuit since 1979, Delahoussaye said, "Santa Anita has been great to me over the years and I hope it continues for at least another year for me. I wouldn't trade my career with that of anybody else."

**1999 TRIPLE CROWN ATTRACTS 396** A total of 396 three-year-olds have been nominated to this year's Visa Triple Crown Challenge, including 21 from trainer D. Wayne Lukas, 16 from trainer Bob Baffert and 12 from trainer Todd Pletcher. Baffert, whose nominees are headed by the undefeated winner of Saturday's GII San Vicente S., **Exploit** (Storm Cat), and likely juvenile filly champ **Silverbulletday** (Silver Deputy), is bidding for his third straight Kentucky Derby after taking the '97 edition with Silver Charm and the '98 running with Real Quiet. Frank Stronach tops the list of owners with 11 nominees, followed by Prince Ahmed Salman's The Thoroughbred Corp. with 10. The Godolphin Stable of Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum and the partnership of Michael Tabor and John Magnier each have eight nominated, while Dogwood Stables and Golden Eagle Farm have seven apiece. **Answer Lively** (Lively One) will try to become the first Breeders' Cup Juvenile winner to go on to a Triple Crown race victory. The seven fillies on this year's list include Baffert's **Excellent Meeting** (General Meeting), the Phipps Stable's **Oh What A Windfall** (Seeking the Gold) and the undefeated **Honest Lady** (Seattle Slew). Storm Cat leads all sires with 12 nominees, followed by Seattle Slew with 10 and A.P. Indy and Forty Niner with nine each. This year's Triple Crown begins with the Kentucky Derby May 1, followed by the Preakness May 15 and the Belmont S. June 5. A horse sweeping all three races will win a \$5 million bonus sponsored by Visa.

Free House had not been out since running second to Silver Charm in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 17, but had prepped with a series of strong workouts and was bet down to 7-10 facing three tough rivals. Allowed to set a leisurely pace, the nearly white horse was dogged by Malek nearly every step, but showed his grit in the stretch drive to take the photo. "There was no pace," said co-owner John Toffan. "He had to go. You can't just dawdle forever, so he went. Chris said he had to run pretty hard the last three-eighths. He'll be better off this race. He's about 20 pounds heavier than he was last year, and he's definitely matured. I think he's more relzxed. So we're hoping he goes on from here. Hopefully, the Big 'Cap is next." Trainer Paco Gonzalez agreed with Toffan's assessment, saying, "He's a different horse now. He's more kind, he takes everything easier. He doesn't just go-go-go." Jockey Chris McCarron added, "Paco knows how to bring a horse over here fit. This will set him up fine for the Big 'Cap." The winner will meet Malek, last year's Big 'Cap winner, in this year's edition Mar. 6. "We'll run in the Santa Anita H. and then maybe Dubai if he comes out of this one all right," trainer Richard Mandella said. Malek was fourth in last year's Dubai World Cup.

After suffering her only loss in the 1 1/4-mile GI Alabama S. at Saratoga last August, Manistique was sent to the bench for three months, returning to take the 1 1/16-mile GII Bayakoa H. at Hollywood Dec. 6 and the GII El Encino S. at the same distance over this track Jan. 17. The odds-on choice to run her winning streak to three, the ultra-consistent bay shadowed Magical Allure through six furlongs in 1:11 1/5, put a head in front at midstretch and drew clear late under jockey Gary Stevens. "She warmed up good, was really focused, relaxed good early on and came home really strong," Stevens said. "David (Flores) made about three different moves (aboard Magical Allure) at three different times trying to sneak away from her, but my filly clung to her like glue." Added trainer John Shirreffs, who was saddling his sixth consecutive winner at the meet, "I still think she's learning the game. This was only her seventh start. We've asked a lot of her. I think this filly is going to be better over a longer distance. She's got that kind of stride that carries speed over a long distance. We'll point for the Santa Margarita H. (GI, Mar. 7, 1 1/8 miles)."

**SILVER CHARM SHARP AT SANTA ANITA** Hitting the work tab for the first time since his third-place finish in the GI Donn H., **Silver Charm** (Silver Buck) drilled three furlongs in :34 1/5 under jockey Gary Stevens yesterday at Santa Anita. "He loved it out there," said trainer Bob Baffert. "He smoked around there." The five-year-old is possible for the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 6, where he could face a trio from trainer Richard Mandella. Mandella, who will be going for his third straight in the race, plans to send out **Event Of The Year** (Seattle Slew), Donn winner **Puerto Madero** (Chi) (Gallantsky) and last year's hero **Malek** (Chi) (Mocito Guapo {Arg}). It had been expected that Puerto Madero would go straight to the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup, but Mandella said, "He's doing so well I don't think we need to wait. He's feeling so good we can't keep his feet on the ground."

**OUT OF PLACE FILLY TOPS OBS-CALDER**

**WORKS** A two-year-old filly by Out of Place--Rapt Attention (Iron Ruler) zipped a quarter mile in :21 3/5 at Calder yesterday, the fastest workout at the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Under Tack Show for Tuesday's Sale of Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training at the track. Selling as Hip #65, the gray is consigned by Shadybrook Farm (Michael Yates), agent, and is a full sister to graded-stakes winner Premier Property. Four juveniles shared the quickest time for a one-furlong breeze, going the distance in :10 1/5. They are: Hip #61, a filly by Twining named Tugger; Hip #133, a colt by Sultry Song; Hip #119, a filly by Gilded Time; and Hip #144, a filly by Tabasco Cat named Burningwood. The lone horse to go three furlongs was Hip #116, a colt by End Sweep named Timeless End, who went in :34 3/5. All of the workouts were videotaped and will be available for viewing at the Calder sales grounds Tuesday. Bidding for the one-day auction gets underway at 10:30 a.m.

**AVERAGE INCREASES AT FASIG-TIPTON WINTER MIXED SALE**

The average price at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Winter Mixed Sale, held yesterday in Timonium, Maryland, was \$5,885, up 17 percent over the figure of a year ago. A total of 149 horses brought an aggregate \$876,900, with 14 listed as not sold. Last year's sale saw 180 hips sell for \$904,400, an average of \$5,024. The sales topper was Sylvester Questor (Norquestor), a six-year-old gelding who finished third in last year's Maryland Million Sprint H. and has earned \$160,098. Consigned by Crown Valley Stable (Phase I of Dispersal), Summer Wind Farm, agent, the dark bay brought \$46,000 from Danielle Bishop Stables. The two high-priced mares went for \$37,000 apiece. Seven-year-old Aaron's Terms (Private Terms), in foal to Two Punch, was consigned by Marshall W. Silverman, agent and bought by Hart Farm. Nine-year-old Java Jade (Java Gold), in foal to Silver Ghost, was consigned by Chanceland Farm, agent, and purchased by Hector Alcalde.

**The Very One H. cont.**

On Tuesday, November 10, 1998, a then four-year-old filly was led into the Keeneland sales ring as hip number 720, ultimately going for a bid of \$550,000. That investment in multiple group-winning Delilah returned a quick dividend with her victory in The Very One H. The bay distinguished herself during her 15-race career in Europe for renowned trainer Michael Stoute, accounting for a pair of Group 3 events, including the Park Hill S. last Sept. 9 at Doncaster, and was also a good third in the G1 Irish St. Leger at The Curragh just 10 days later. A true stayer, the only question mark was how she would handle a firm turf. Jockey Jerry Bailey assumed a stalking position from three wide as the front-runners went through moderate fractions for the opening six furlongs. As the cadence quickened around the far turn, Bailey edged his mare out four wide, engaged Starry Dreamer leaving the eighth pole and wore down that rival late to score the victory in stakes-record time. Bailey admitted that the triumph did not come easily. "She didn't have a real quick turn of foot," he said. "Starry Dreamer got by her turning for home, but once she got her full stride in the stretch, she drew away." The Irish-bred's next start could come in the GII Orchid H. here Mar. 7.

6th-GPX, \$36,000, Alw, 4yo/up, f/m, 6f, 1:09 3/5, ft. **SCOOT YER BOOTS (f, 4, Seeking the Gold--Whirl Series, by Roberto)** debuted a winner here just a year ago and rattled off two subsequent victories, her last coming June 19 at Belmont Park. Away from the races since then, the bay trained forwardly at Payson Park for her return to indicate all systems were "go" for this effort. The 1/2 to 1992 GI Jerome winner Furiously (Danzig), GISW, \$457,228, sat just off the lead while three wide down the backside, took control once in the stretch and scooted away to win by 5 1/4 lengths while in hand as the 3-10 favorite. Brushing Up has done very well wintering in the Big Apple, accounting for half of his career victories and well over 50 percent of his lifetime earnings here. His come-from-behind running style leaves him at the mercy of pace, but the venerable gelding has managed to cash checks in each of his last two outings, both graded stakes, including a runner-up finish in the GIII Aqueduct H. Jan. 16. The six-year-old got a dream pace scenario in this spot as four horses went out for the lead, which allowed jockey Shaun Bridgmohan to bide his time towards the rear and wait for just the right moment to ask his mount for run. Still last with three furlongs to run, Bridgmohan angled Brushing Up to the outside and the bay responded with a determined rally to hit the front inside the final sixteenth and score the victory. An elated winning trainer Victor Simone commented, "I couldn't be happier with this horse. The jock rode him perfectly, just as expected." The Mar. 6 GIII Grey Lag H. is next on the dance card for the winner, a race which he captured in 1998.

**WHAT A DIFFERENCE A DAY MAKES**

Three months ago, everybody wanted to talk to Sonny Hine. Like they say on the backstretch, when you've got the big horse, the whole world wants to be your friend.

Three months ago, Hine had the big horse, Skip Away. The five-year-old son of Skip Trial was poised to overtake Cigar as the all-time money winner, to become the first \$10 million horse. Not bad for a \$22,500 birthday present he picked up for his wife, Carolyn, in 1995, back when he was just another slightly flawed two-year-old, a roll of the dice.

Three months ago, Skip Away finished sixth in the Breeders' Cup Classic. There were those who felt he hadn't handled the racing strip at Churchill Downs, just as he hadn't handled it in the 1996 Derby, when he finished 12th. Then there were those who thought his poor showing at Belmont four weeks early, in the Jockey Club Gold Cup, had been a clear indication that he was no longer himself.

Unbeaten since the Jockey Club Gold Cup the year before, Skip Away had traveled far and wide to rattle off nine straight wins, seven of them in Grade I races.

So on Nov. 7 he finishes sixth in the Classic, and 45 minutes later Hine's sitting in a dark, dingy, airless room at Barn 36, alone, watching replays of Awesome Again's triumph on an old 20-inch television set with a wire coat hanger for an antenna.

One week from now, barring a monumental injustice, Sonny Hine will reach the top of the heap. After 51 years on the racetrack, at age 68, he will finally be able to say that he once trained a Horse of the Year. Some might even say a two-time Horse of the Year.

But that's a week from now, at the Eclipse Award dinner.

Today, Sonny Hine has eight horses in his barn at Gulfstream Park. Six of them can run a little, one of them is just a horse, and the other one doesn't want to pick up a hoof.

Two weeks ago, his biggest owner, Roger King, took 11 horses away from Hine and gave them to California trainer Steve Young. While Sonny says he has no hard feelings toward King, he was rather surprised at how the whole thing went down. One day the horses were in his barn, the next day they weren't.

When this all happened, on Jan. 23, Hine had to sit down and make some tough decisions. With only a handful of horses left, he couldn't very well keep 17 employees on the payroll. So he had to let 10 go.

"We were overstaffed as it was," he said. "But now, by 7:30, we ain't got nothin' to do. I get to take a nap when I want to now."

Now, one week from the night they hand him the big award at the Eclipse Awards dinner, Sonny Hine has seven guys tending to eight horses at Gulfstream, with a couple of two-year-olds on the farm up in Ocala.

He's got Chip, the stakes filly his wife adores, and Riveter, last year's Valentine's Day present, and Cozzene's Affair, last year's birthday present, and Spendable, the present from the year before, and a couple of three-year-olds, and really, that's about it.

"Nobody calls much anymore," Sonny said.

And to think, just three months ago, everybody wanted to talk to Sonny Hine.
