OBS TWO-YEAR-OLD SALE AT CALDER

TODAY A total of 242 juveniles will be offered at Calder today at the 1999 Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Calder Selected Two-Year-Old in Training Sale. Twenty-seven OBS-Calder graduates have gone on to become stakes winners, including champions Skip Away and Favorite Trick. A filly by Out of Place, selling as Hip #65, had the fastest breeze at the Under Tack Show Feb. 7, getting a quarter mile in :21 3/5. A colt by 1998's record-breaking freshman sire End Sweep, named Swept Overboard and selling as Hip #77, topped the workouts at the Under Tack Preview at the Florida track Feb. 2, going the quarter in :21 2/5. He is one of nine End Sweep two-year-olds in the catalogue, which also includes juveniles representing top sires such as Belong to Me, Black Tie Affair (Ire), Carson City, Chief's Crown, Clever Trick, Crafty Prospector, Dehere, Gilded Time, Holy Bull, Marquetry, Meadowlake, Phone Trick, Rahy, Red Ransom, Relaunch, Riverman, Runaway Groom, Silver Hawk, Unbridled and Woodman; and this year's freshmen Cherokee Run, Distant View, French Deputy, Go for Gin, Mr. Greeley, Tabasco Cat and You And I. Bidding is set to start at 10:30 a.m., and can be heard live on the OBS website, www.obssales.com, via RealAudio.

◆ PEDIGREE INSIGHTS ◆

GULFSTREAM PARK BREEDERS' CUP H.-GI, \$200,000, GPX, 2-6, 3yo/up, 1 3/8mT, 2:10 3/5 (NCR), fm. 1--YAGLI, 121, h, 6, by Jade Hunter

Predicting which surface will best suit a racehorse isn't always straightforward. Although Mr. Prospector's stock have gained roughly three-quarters of their earnings on dirt, the decision was made in 1985 to send his \$700,000 son out of Jadana to be trained by Henry Cecil at Newmarket. The reasoning no doubt went along the lines that Jadana had a largely European pedigree and was a three-parts sister to Monteverdi (Ire) (Lyphard), Britain's champion two-year-old of 1979. However, the Mr. Prospector colt, named Jade Hunter, disappointed in three juvenile starts on turf in Britain and was quickly returned to the States. The change of location--and of racing surface--had the desired effect. Jade Hunter gained six wins and three seconds from 11 starts and showed he stayed pretty well for a son of Mr. Prospector. His best efforts came early in 1988 when he pulled off a Grade I double at Gulfstream Park, carrying lenient weights to victories over Cryptoclearance in both the Donn H. over nine furlongs and the Gulfstream Park H. over 1 1/4 miles.

Now Jade Hunter's story has been reversed by his high-class son Yagli. Beaten over 15 lengths on dirt on his first appearance, this Allen Paulson homebred has since done extremely well on turf. Thanks to his win under top weight in last Saturday's GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., Yagli now has the proud record of eight wins, six seconds and two thirds from 17 turf starts. Like Jade Hunter, he has improved with age and last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf runner-up looks set for another very rewarding campaign.

With his earnings now standing at \$1,145,070, Yagli has provided Allen Paulson with a belated dividend on the \$2,100,000 he invested in Yagli's dam as a yearling in 1984. I suppose that anyone who pays such a sum for a yearling has a right to be optimistic and Paulson gave Yagli's dam the extravagant name of Nijinsky's Best--a blend of the names of her parents, Nijinsky II and Best In Show. The filly never got a chance to live up to her name on the racecourse and she was looking very expensive until Yagli gained his first stakes win last year. Her change of fortunes could well continue, as she has a two-year-old son from the first crop by Diazo and a yearling colt by Jade Hunter. Diazo, winner of the GI Pegasus H. and GI Strub S., ranks alongside the GI Santa Anita H. winner Stuka as one of Jade Hunter's two previous Grade I winners.

Yagli is the latest in a very long line of important winners descending from Best In Show, 1982's Broodmare of the Year. Although Best In Show's sons included the high-class European colts Malinowski (Sir Ivor) and Gielgud (Sir Ivor), it has been her daughters who have made a lasting impact at stud, with Minnie Hauk (Sir Ivor), Sex Appeal (Buckpasser), Monroe (Sir Ivor), Show Lady (Sir Ivor), Blush With Pride (Blushing Groom {Fr}) and Nijinsky's Best leading the way.

Minnie Hauk's descendants have won Group events from six furlongs to 2 1/2 miles, with Ashford Stud's GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Spinning World (Nureyev) among them. Sex Appeal, of course, produced the champion colts El Gran Senor (Northern Dancer) and Try My Best (Northern Dancer), and Monroe is the dam of Xaar (GB) (Zafonic), Europe's champion two-year-old of 1997. The name of Northern Dancer is a fairly constant thread running through this exceptional family and this great stallion appears twice in Yagli's pedigree, in the fifth and third generations.
