#### SILVERBULLETDAY TO TAKE ON BOYS IN SAN

RAFAEL Likely Two-Year-Old Filly Champion Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy) will kick off her threeyear-old campaign against males in the Feb. 28 Gll San Rafael, but trainer Bob Baffert said yesterday he still intends to point the filly towards the Kentucky Oaks and not the Kentucky Derby. "I just wanted to give her a run at a mile and I didn't want to put her on the road to run her there. I want to get a race into her and then get her ready for filly races like the Ashland and Kentucky Oaks. Right now, I'm not thinking Derby with her. I'm not ready to make that call, but it will be nice to see what she can do against a horse like Prime Timber (Sultry Song)." Prime Timber, one of at least four Baffert colts being aimed for the Derby, will also start in the San Rafael. Exploit (Storm Cat), considered Baffert's top Triple Crown threat, will wait for the Mar. 14 GII San Felipe.

LIL'S LAD BACK IN TRAINING Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff), winner of last year's GII Fountain of Youth S., arrived back in trainer Neil Howard's barn at Gulfstream Tuesday morning. The four-year-old had been training in Aiken, South Carolina. "He shipped in well," Howard commented. "We have no firm plans for him at this time." Lil's Lad finished first in last year's GI Florida Derby, but was disqualified and placed second for interference. Knocked off the Triple Crown trail by injury after a second-place finish in the GII Toyota Blue Grass S., the bay colt returned after a five-month layoff and was unable to hit the board in two New York allowance races last September.

The two-day Select Colts sale at Karaka in Auckland, New Zealand this week recorded growth in gross, average and median. A total of 297 colts were sold for a gross of NZ\$6,384,000 (US\$3,423,056) and an average of NZ\$21,495 (\$11,525), up eight percent from the 1998 average of NZ\$19,924 (\$10,683). The median was up 12.5 percent from last year's NZ\$16,000 (\$8,579) to NZ\$18,000 (\$9,651). The sale topper, at NZ\$75,000 (\$40,214), was Chequers Stud's Deputy Governor (Southern Jewel {NZ}). The colt was sold to English-based agent Richard O'Gorman, acting on behalf of Malaysian clients. At last weekend's New Zealand Bloodstock Ltd's one-day Select Fillies yearling sale, 152 fillies were sold for a total of NZ\$3,006,000 (\$1.6 million) and an average of NZ\$19,776 (\$10,604). The average was down slightly from last year's average of NZ\$20,805 (\$11,155). The median rose from 1998's NZ\$16,000 (\$8,579) to NZ\$18,000 (\$9,651). The sale topper, at NZ\$95,000 (\$50,938), was Westbury Farm's filly by Gold Brose (NZ)--Sarah's Melody (Aus) (Bluebird), bought by David Ellis. With only the Summer Sale at Karaka tomorrow to come, the 1999 National Yearling Sales series has so far grossed NZ\$46,452,500 (\$24,907,507), up 7.5 percent on the NZ\$43,199,900 (\$23,163,485) grossed at all four sales last year.
