Sussex S. Continues to Entice Entries:

Goodwood hopes to enhance the international appeal of the G1 Champagne Lanson Sussex S. by offering, for the first time, travel grants for overseas runners taking part in the prestigious mile event. The new travel grant initiative follows the recent announcement of Champagne Lanson's three-year backing of Goodwood's top event, to be run Wednesday, July 28. Prize money for the race has been increased substantially this year, from \$256,835 to \$414,250, making it the second most valuable all-aged mile championship race in Europe, following Ascot's G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. The size of the travel grants will be at the discretion of Goodwood Racecourse, which will also extend prize money in the Sussex S. to fifth and sixth place. The closing date for the race is May 26.

George Strawbridge Jr., American steeplechasing's leading owner with more than \$5 million in career earnings, has been appointed president of the National Steeplechase Association. Strawbridge succeeds Bill Pape, who had held the post for 18 of the last 21 years, but resigned last summer. Strawbridge was NSA president from 1988-90, but stepped down for health reasons. His father headed the organization in the mid-1970s. In related news, William Gallo, Jr., the NSA racing secretary/handicapper since 1984, was promoted to the new position of director of racing.
