WHITNEY TOWER DEAD AT 75 Whitney Tower, one of the most influential voices in American Thoroughbred racing, died at his home in Saratoga Springs, New York, Thursday due to complications from a stroke he suffered nearly a year ago. He was 75. Tower started his career as a sports writer for the Cincinnati Enquirer in 1948. Six years later he was hired to head the racing division for Sports Illustrated and during his 22 years at SI won a pair of Eclipse Awards, in 1976 and 1977. The native New Yorker made his biggest contribution to racing at the end of that tenure, however, as a co-founder of the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in Saratoga Springs. He served as the Museum's president for eight years and as chairman for 10 years. Tower is survived by his wife, Lucy, and six children. A memorial service will be held at 3 p.m. Tuesday, Feb. 17, at St. James Episcopal Church on Madison Ave. in New York City. Following the service, there will be a gathering for his friends at the Knickerbocker Club at Fifth Avenue and 62nd St.

SILVERBULLETDAY TO FAIR GROUNDS The Daily Racing Form reports that trainer Bob Baffert has changed gears with his likely juvenile filly champ Silverbulletday (Silver Deputy). The three-year-old will head to the Fair Grounds for the Feb. 20 \$125,000 GIII Davona Dale S., facing fillies instead of the colts she would have taken on in the Feb. 28 GII San Rafael S. at Santa Anita. "I've got to run her," Baffert told the Form. "I can't keep her on the ground any more." Silverbulletday, off since her victory in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, is scheduled to breeze today and ship to New Orleans tomorrow.

In any other year, Excellent Meeting would be the talk of the town. After all, she has now won four graded stakes, three of those of the Grade I variety, and is currently the same odds in the Kentucky Derby Future Wager (15-1) as Answer Lively, the winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Unfortunately, she isn't even the best filly in Bob Baffert's barn, a role that goes to her half-length conqueror in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Silverbulletday. But Excellent Meeting has done nothing wrong since that loss, winning the GI Hollywood Starlet Dec. 13 in overpowering fashion and closing from fourth to easily defeat an overmatched field here. The 1-10 favorite just sat through a half in :45 4/5, moved effortlessly to the lead and drew off while ridden out. "I just encouraged her to be in the race," said winning jockey Kent Desormeaux. "Within 100 yards, I'm just slowing her down until inside the three-sixteenths pole. From there, without much encouragement, she did the rest on her own." "She's still fast," said Baffert, "hasn't changed a bit. We would have had to load her backwards to get her beat today. We'll run her in the Santa Anita Oaks (GI, Mar. 14). It'll be a good race between her and (Bobby) Frankel's filly (undefeated Honest Lady)." She'll likely meet secondplace Tout Charmant in the Oaks, yet another Baffert trainee. Will Excellent Meeting and Silverbulletday meet again any time soon? "We're thinking about the cable rights for that one," Baffert joked. "I'm going to call my agent."

Bidding for her fourth consecutive victory after taking an optional claimer in November, an allowance race in December and the Jan. 3 Francis Scott Key S., all at Laurel, Passeggiata settled near the back of the pack through honest early splits, came wide around the field as they raced through the far turn and wore down odds-on Catinca after a heated battle to earn the narrowest of wins in the very last jump. "When we hit the top of the lane, I thought I could get by (Catinca), but she sort of spurted off again," said winning jockey Mario Pino. "My filly dug down one little notch there at the end just to get the nod. I'm glad I won because I had to reduce to do the weight. I didn't even want to be a pound over in such a tough contest." Added winning trainer A. Ferris Allen, the current leader at Laurel, "We bought this horse privately from West Coast trainer Richard Cross after he claimed her from Bob Baffert for \$80,000." The winner's stablemate, MSW Palette Knife (Broad Brush), fourth in this event this vear after running second in '98, will be retired. With eight wins and \$316,400 in earnings to her credit, she will be bred to Awesome Again. Passeggiata will race the rest of this year and join the broodmare band next season. The runner-up, winner of four straight including the GII First Flight H. and GII Top Flight H., was back after a 2 1/2-month layoff and just missed.

Frisk Me Now hadn't worked on the turf since just before his shocking 105-1 upset in the 1997 GII Hutcheson S., but after a pair of subpar efforts--seventh in the GIII Broward H. and ninth in the GI Donn H. last out Jan. 30--trainer Bob Durso decided to shake up the five-year-old and sent him a half on the grass four days ago. The longest shot on the board turning back to a sprint for the first time since running second in the Deputy Minister H. over this track just over a year ago, the bay was bumped at the break, sat fourth down the backstretch, then rallied four wide on the far turn to take over in deep stretch and hold on in a photo. "Working him on the turf seems to work," said Durso, who broke an 0-for-22 skid with this victory. "He was a little reluctant around the turn, but when (jockey Eddie King, Jr.) Got into him, he responded. Eddie knows the horse exceptionally well and Frisky runs for him." The winner goes next in the GI Gulfstream Park H. at 1 1/4 miles Feb. 27. Will he work on the turf before the race? "Definitely!" said Durso. The 13-10 favorite Cowboy Cop (Silver Deputy) pressed the pace and tired badly to be sixth.

According to the *Daily Racing Form*, three-year-old Incurable Optimist (Cure the Blues) will not be making the trip across the Atlantic for the Irish 2000 Guineas after suffering an injured tendon while training at Gulfstream Park. "He came back from a gallop and cooled out just fine," trainer Dave Donk told the *Form*. "But shortly thereafter we noticed some inflammation in the tendon, which he must have rapped somewhere along the line, and in horsemen's terms any injury to the tendon is considered a bow. Whatever you call it, this is going to put him out of commission for quite a while. He probably won't be back until next winter or spring." Undefeated in four turf starts with wins in the GIII Pilgrim and GIII Generous S., Incurable Optimist has earned \$271,309 to date.

Gulfstream Race Times Questioned:

Officials at Gulfstream Park suspect that the times of anywhere from 20 to 60 races run at the current meet, which began Jan. 3, may be incorrect. The problem was first brought to Gulfstream's attention in two columns by Washington Post racing writer Andy Beyer. Teleview Racing Patrol President Ron Sellitto, the company responsible for the timing equipment and its operator, said during a press conference yesterday, "We are going to retime 20 races to check the times." Sellitto said he and Gulfstream's Director of Operations Dennis Testa became aware of a problem Jan. 20, when Beyer inquired about suspected times. After testing all the timing equipment and finding no problem, they looked at human error. Sellitto said the person operating the equipment manually overrode the automatic equipment, causing the false timings. He expects to complete the retiming of the races in question by Thursday, Feb. 18. While only 20 races will be retimed, Daily Racing Form clocker Jim Escarcega, who helped the track work on the problem, said he suspects at least 60 races are in question. Timed by a clocker, the press conference took 45 minutes and 3/5 seconds.

Bay Meadows Raises Purses:

Fatal Virus Claims Another Aussie Victim:

A mare who died last month in the far north of Queensland in Australia had contracted the fatal equine morbillivirus, Queensland's Primary Industries Department said in a statement yesterday. Equine morbillivirus claimed the life of horse trainer Vic Rail and 14 horses and brought Brisbane racing to a standstill in September of 1994. The following year, another north Queensland man died from the mystery disease. It is still unknown how the virus spreads to horses, but it is common in flying fox colonies where it causes no harm.
