CAPE CANAVERAL OUT OF DERBY PICTURE

Overbrook Farms' Cape Canaveral (Mr. Prospector), the undefeated winner of the GIII San Miguel S. at Santa Anita Jan. 9, has been diagnosed with a stress fracture to the right front shin and he will be out of training for several months. Overbrook General Manager Ric Waldman said, "It's doubtful that he'll need surgery," but added that there is no chance the Wayne Lukastrained colt would be ready for the May 1 Derby. The colt's connections are not the only interests directly affected by the injury. Cape Canaveral had been betting interest number three in the new Kentucky Derby Future Book Wager that opened yesterday at noon, and news of the injury broke after \$388 had already been bet on the colt. Churchill officials said there will be no refunds on money already bet, but no more wagers will be accepted.

NATIONAL JOCKEY CLUB MEET BEGINS TODAY

Patrons arriving at Sportsman's Park for the first day of the National Jockey Club meet today will get a big surprise: No racing. Instead, they will have to go to Hawthorne Racecourse, where the NJC meet is being held this year as renovations and the addition of an auto racing track take place at Sportsman's. Racing will take place Friday through Tuesday during the 95-day meet, which ends June 30. The marquee event of the meet takes place Saturday, May 8, with the running of the \$500,000 GII Illinois Derby. The NJC's other graded races are the May 15 \$300,000 GIII Sixty Sails H. for fillies and mares going nine furlongs and the \$200,000 GIII National Jockey Club H. for older horses going nine furlongs May 29.
