RUPTURED ARTERY CLAIMS HARLAN Ten-yearold Harlan (Storm Cat--Country Romance {Halo}) died Saturday of a ruptured aorta while in the breeding shed, according to a release from Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky. The possession of W.T. Young and Stone Farm owner Arthur Hancock, the Kentucky-bred earned \$403,174 and recorded the most important of his eight lifetime victories in the 1994 GI Vosburgh S., upsetting that year's Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Cherokee Run in the process. Harlan entered stud at Stone Farm in 1995. He had eight two-year-old winners from his first crop to race in 1998, including the promising Menifee, who was undefeated in two starts and bested Fountain of Youth runner-up Cat Thief and subsequent GI Futurity winner Lemon Drop Kid in his second appearance, an Aug. 21 Saratoga allowance. With progeny earnings of \$289,098 to date, Harlan will be represented by 17 two-year-olds of 1999. He is to be buried on the grounds of the farm where he stood. Hancock said, "We are all saddened by this loss."

FIRST KENTUCKY DERBY FUTURE WAGER POOL CLOSES The first of three wagering pools for the inaugural Kentucky Derby Future Wager closed Sunday with total handle reaching \$267,748. After betting closed, the mutuel field was the 4-1 favorite, with Exploit (Storm Cat) next at 6-1, General Challenge (General Meeting) at 11-1 and Fountain of Youth runner-up Cat Thief (Storm Cat) at 12-1. Fountain of Youth winner Vicar (Wild Again) is at 18-1. More than half of the betting occurred during the final hours before the pool closed at 4:30 p.m. yesterday. Two additional pools will be offered prior to the Derby, with Pool Two set for Mar. 11-14 and Pool Three running from Apr. 8-11. "We didn't know what to expect...but it's safe to say the results have surpassed anything we might have anticipated," Churchill Downs Senior Vice President and General Manager Alex Waldrop said.

Three Ring dominated the final two distaff legs of the Florida Stallion S. series last year, including the My Dear Girl division at a mile and a sixteenth Oct. 17, and gave a good account of herself in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in a third-place finish to Eclipse champion Silverbulletday. The chestnut returned to the races in the Jan. 27 GIII Forward Gal S. and rallied late to finish second, beaten just a head. Trainer Eddie Plesa decided to add blinkers for this effort and his charge responded well to the equipment change. Jockey John Velazquez put Three Ring on the engine right from the start and was able to control the pace from the rail, accelerating away from the field after six furlongs and having as much fun through the stretch as a kid at the circus for the impressive victory. Velazquez commented of his trip, "Today she broke out of there and she grabbed the bit. We expected (Jerry Bailey and) Gold From The West and I to be on the lead, but then he took back and it made it easier for my horse." Plesa indicated that the GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 16 is a strong possibility for a next start and added that Three Ring is nominated to the Apr. 3 GI Ashland at Keeneland and will be nominated to the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks. With the heavy favorite finishing first and 8-5 Gold From The West running third, there was a minus show pool of \$6,477.70 for the race.
