The sire of champions in six different countries--Kooyonga (Ire) and Perfect Imposter (Ire) (Ireland), Bold Arrangement (GB) (France), Ventiquattrofogli (Ire) (Italy), Cloud Inspector (Ire) (Switzerland), Wavy Kris (Ire) and Primer Amor (Sp) (Spain), and Bold Pilot (Tur) (Turkey)--Persian Bold sold as a yearling for 18,000 Irish guineas (\$28,330) at the '76 Goffs Sale. He earned \$105,670, winning six of 16 starts as a two- and three-year-old. He placed second in the G1 William Hill Middle Park S. in 1977 as well as the 1978 G2 St. James' Palace S. Other major runners sired by Persian Bold include Group 1 winner Persian Heights (GB) and English and American stakes winners Anshan (GB) and Brave Act (GB).

"I was very pleased with the effort," trainer Martin Wolfson said. "He's training very well. I only hope the track plays this year the way it did last year. If it does and there's a decent early pace, he has a chance of winning." The six-year-old, off the board in his two starts this year, was second to Skip Away in this event last year.

Frisk Me Now (Mister Frisky), who bounced back after a couple of off-the-board efforts to take the Feb. 13 GII Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup Sprint Championship, will not make his next start in Saturday's Grade I feature. #### Trainer David Vivian Held Blameless:

Trainer David Vivian, who was fined after a second, more sensitive test revealed the presence of flunixin (Banamine), a class 4 anti-inflammatory analgesic, in the urine of one of his runners, has had the fine rescinded. Vivian's horse, Princess Maggie, was third in a race at Calder Jan. 1. Her urine was analyzed using Thin Layer Chromatography by the University of Florida's College of Veterinary Medicine. The test came back negative, but indicated there might be traces of Acepromezine, a class 3 medication. A second, more sophisticated test, Gas Chromatography-Mass Spectrometry, didn't find Acepromezine, but it did detect a trace of Banamine. Florida statute stipulates that TLC testing alone should be utilized when screening for class 4 and 5 medications, but Debbie Miller, director of the Division of Pari-Mutuel Wagering, handed down a ruling to the stewards which fined Vivian anyway. The stewards heard the case yesterday. After reading the statute and listening to Vivian and his vet, Dr. Bob O'Neil, they decided on "No Ruling," meaning they disagreed with Miller's interpretation of the regulation and would not enforce any penalty.

By siring over 13 percent stakes winners from foals, El Gran Senor has repeatedly made everyone wonder what peaks he might have reached had his fertility been normal. And now this handsome son of Northern Dancer is making such an impact with his broodmare daughters that we can only regret there aren't more of them.

A brilliant winner of seven of his eight starts, El Gran Senor had only a handful of fillies in his first crop, born in 1986, but among them was Escrow Agent, the mare responsible for Vicar, winner of last Saturday's G1 Fountain of Youth S. There weren't many fillies in the stallion's second crop, either, but they included Plume Bleu Pale, whose first foal was French Group 1 winner Poplar Bluff (GB), and Bright Candles, a mare who has been very ably represented by the dual Grade I winner Grand Slam. And the fillies in his 29-strong fourth crop were headed by Toussaud, a Group 1 winner now making a tremendous impression through her first two foals, Chester House (G1SP in England) and Honest Lady, the much talked-about winner of the GII Santa Ynez S.

El Gran Senor's prowess as a sire of broodmares is no accident. He is by Northern Dancer, the broodmare sire of well over 200 stakes winners, and El Gran Senor himself ranked alongside Easy Goer, Miswaki, Polish Precedent, Private Account, Seeking The Gold, Slew o'Gold, Touch Gold, Wavering Monarch, With Approval and Woodman as one of the many important winners out of mares by Buckpasser. It could pay to keep an eye on the broodmare daughters of some of the other young stallions out of Buckpasser mares, such as Seeking The Gold.

Vicar's dam, Escrow Agent, was a fair performer. A winner over seven furlongs at two in Ireland, she progressed to be placed in a couple of minor stakes at around a mile in the U.S. Vicar isn't her first graded-stakes performer, as her Woodman filly Mama Dean finished a creditable second in the GIII Bed o'Roses H. over a mile and third in the GIII Vagrancy H. over seven furlongs. Another of Escrow Agent's daughters, the Easy Goer filly Sheepscot, gained her first stakes win in last year's Lady Mannequin S. over six furlongs. Both Mama Dean and Sheepscot are inbred 3x4 to Buckpasser, whereas Vicar is inbred 3x4 to Nearctic.

Vicar still has a few questions to answer. For instance, is he good enough to beat his old rivals Exploit, Cat Thief and Certain at level weights? Does he have enough stamina in his make-up to go further than the Fountain of Youth's mile-and-a-sixteenth?

At first glance stamina does not look a problem, as Escrow Agent is by the winner of the Irish Derby over 1 1/2 miles and out of a daughter of the Triple Crown hero Secretariat. However, stamina has not been a noticeable asset of Vicar's female line in recent generations. His second dam, Viva Sec, took after her dam, the high-class sprinter Viva La Vivi, more than Secretariat, as she showed with her wins over six furlongs in the Dark Mirage S. and Grey Flight S.

Hopes of Vicar proving to be suited by 1 1/4 miles must rest primarily on the shoulders of his very successful sire Wild Again, who gained both his Grade I wins--the Breeders' Cup Classic and the Meadowlands Cup H.--over that distance. However, high-class winners by Wild Again over distances beyond nine furlongs are much rarer than his winners at up to nine furlongs.
