BINT ALLAYL DEAD Last year's top European juvenile filly, Bint Allayl (GB) (Green Desert) has been euthanized after suffering a complete spiral fracture of her left fore humerus in a routine gallop in training on Monday. The Sheikh Ahmed al Maktoum-owned filly was trained by Mick Channon to win the National S. at Sandown, followed by the G3 Queen Mary S. at Ascot and the G2 Peugeot Lowther S. "On behalf of Sheikh Ahmed, I would like to thank all of the vets, Mick Channon who trained the filly so well, Candy Morris who rode her and dedicated lass Alwena Jones," commented the sheikh's racing manager Anthony Stroud. The filly won three of four starts, her only loss coming in a runner-up finish in her debut, and earned \$143,084.

Running Stag Possible for Winter Derby Trial:

The English Press Association reports that Running Stag (Cozzene) is now only "50/50" to start this Saturday in the Lingfield Winter Derby Trial, and instead could be trained up to a start in the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup. Trainer Phillip Mitchell told the Press Association, "I don't want to give him an unnecessarily hard race on Saturday when he is only about 90-percent ready." Running Stag would be asked to shoulder 145 pounds against as many as nine other rivals. The five-year-old, third in the GI Woodward S. at Belmont Park last September, may return to the U.S. later this year to contest the GII Massachusetts H. May 29.

Devil's Cup Subpoenas Issued:

Jockeys Joe Bravo, Shane Sellers and Jerry Bailey will be served subpoenas for depositions, along with trainers Bill Mott, Scotty Schulhofer and Pat Byrne in the Devil's Cup lawsuit filed against Gulfstream Park. Gold Spur Stables, owner of Devil's Cup, initiated the suit last March against the track for a figure in excess of \$1 million. Attorney Joel Fass said he would also depose Gulfstream President Doug Donn, Director of Operations Dennis Testa and former General Manager Rick Relicke. Devil's Cup was injured in the GIII Ft. Lauderdale H. on March 15, 1997. He was euthanized on October 23, 1997.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES by Alan Porter

It appears that the current crop of three-year-old fillies has the potential to be a truly outstanding one. Silverbulletday and Excellent Meeting, the first and second highweights on the Experimental Free Handicap for Two-Year-Old Fillies are both being seriously considered as Kentucky Derby candidates and last weekend Three Ring, who finished third to Silverbulletday and Excellent Meeting in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and was awarded co-third highweight on the Experimental, ran off to win the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Park by almost 15 lengths.

Three Ring is something of a triumph for regional breeding programs. Not only is she a Florida-bred, but her sire Notebook is a New York-bred. Notebook used his state-bred status to garner five restricted black-type events at distances from six to nine furlongs. He also showed himself to be a more than capable sprinter/miler in open company, winning the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at two and the GIII Best Turn S. at three. Retired to Ocala Stud Farm, Notebook has established himself as one of Florida's leading sires with 14 stakes winners in his first six crops.

Three Ring's immediate family has also done sterling work in Florida. Her dam, My Nichole, is a stakes winning half sister to Solono (granddam of at least six Florida-bred stakes winners, including the graded stakes winner Blazing Sword (Sword Dance (Ire)). Her granddam Solo Voyage (Admiral's Voyage) is out of Pretty Pat, ancestress of a number of good stakes winners--most bred by Fred Hooper--including the graded scorers Classic Value (Copelan), Class Kris (Kris S.) and Roman Envoy (Roman Diplomat). The family goes back to illustrious roots, too. The sixth dam is Neolight, a half-sister to the brilliant Tudor Minstrel and herself a winner in England of two races which now have Group 1 status, the Cheveley Park S. and the Coronation S.

Three Ring's pedigree shows an intriguing brother/sister inbreeding which appears in at least two other stakes winners sired by Notebook. Cap and Bells (Tom Fool--Ghazni, by Mahmoud), the granddam of Notebook, was a useful performer who earned a black-type placing when second in the Arlington Lassie S. She had a more talented brother in the shape of Dunce, who took the American Derby, Arlington Classic and Stars and Stripes H. Three Ring's broodmare sire Cutlass is out of a mare by Dunce, so Three Ring has Cap and Bells/Dunce 3 x 4. The Cap and Bells/Dunce combination also appears in Notebook stakes winners Culinary Delight and Biblionic. This represents 21 percent of Notebook's stakes winners to date and, unless at least 51 of his 246 foals of racing age have Dunce in the dam, the cross is outperforming opportunity.

Oddly enough, the Cap and Bells/Notebook combination appeared in another good 1998 two-year-old, this time in Europe. Leading European Miler Lahib (Riverman) is out of a mare by Cutlass, and thus carries Dunce in his third generation. Lahib has not lived up to expectations as a sire, but was represented by Mus-If (Ire), winner of the GI Aga Khan Studs National S. Mus-If's dam is by Dancing Brave, who in turn is out of a mare by Drone, a son of Cap and Bells. Thus, Mus-If has Dunce/Cap and Bells 5 \times 5. Incidentally, this pattern has been around a while. Back in 1992, Drummond Lane took the GIII Roseben H. to become the only graded stakes winner for his sire, Spanish Drums. Spanish Drums was out of a mare by Drone, and Drummond Lane out of Cutlass mare, so Cap and Bells/Dunce appeared 4 x 4.

There is certainly enough evidence to support further attempts to combine Cap and Bells and Dunce. As we've mentioned, Cap and Bells is dam of Drone (who is found in Dancing Brave, Cherokee Run, Wild Rush and Grindstone) and granddam of Notebook. She is also dam of Sir Wimborne and granddam of the successful young stallion El Prado (Ire). Dunce, in addition to being broodmare sire of Cutlass, appears in the young stallions Souvenir Copy, Gold Tribute and Friendly Lover.

Vicar (c, 3, Wild Again--Escrow Agent, by El Gran Senor) burst onto the Kentucky Derby scene this weekend with a win in the GI Fountain of Youth S. Vicar's sire, Wild Again is a son of Icecapade and his broodmare sire El Gran Senor is a son of Northern Dancer, which means that Vicar has the three-quarters related Icecapade and Northern Dancer (both by Nearctic out of Native Dancer mares) 3 x 3. The combination had first home run with Champion Izvestia, who was by Icecapade out of a daughter of a Northern Dancer mare, and since then Icecapadeline stallions have sired at least another 13 stakes winners out of Northern Dancer line mares, six by Wild Again, including, in addition to Vicar, other graded stakes winners Wild Event, Wild Syn, Wild Zone and Wildly Joyous.

The reverse Northern Dancer/Icecapade cross is found in New Zealand filly Dantelah (NZ) (f, 5, Volksraad (GB)--Frosting, by Icecapade), who defeated colts to claim the GI Oakleigh Plate at Caulfield, Melbourne. Her sire is a grandson of Danzig (by Northern Dancer) and she is out of Icecapade mare.

Blarin Speed (f, 3, Senor Speedy--Cissy Blair, by Dallasite) became the second stakes winner for her sire when winning the Valdale S. at Turf Paradise. Blarin Speed has an unusual pedigree as she owns inbreeding to Gold Digger through her sons, Mr. Prospector (grandsire of Senor Speedy) and Yukon (sire of Blarin Speed's second dam). There have been two other unrestricted stakes winners with a double of Gold Digger. One was Man the Shipp (Cryptoclearance), featuring Mr. Prospector and his brother Red Ryder, and the other was Bee My Vision (Silver Ghost), having Mr. Prospector and his brother Search For Gold.
