DERBY WINNERS WORK TOGETHER Trainer Bob Baffert sent out both of his Kentucky Derby winners to work in company yesterday. The '97 Derby winner Silver Charm (Silver Buck) and the '98 victor Real Quiet (Quiet American) worked one mile in company in 1:37 1/5 at Santa Anita Wednesday. Silver Charm, with Gary Stevens up, starts next in the GI Santa Anita H. on Mar. 6. Real Quiet, with Dana Barnes in the irons, makes his first start since last June's Belmont S. in the Mar. 7 GIII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds. Real Quiet broke off slightly ahead of his stablemate in front of the grandstand and maintained a half-length to a length advantage over Silver Charm while setting splits of :12 1/5, :24 2/5, :36 4/5, :49 1/5, 1:01 2/5, 1:12 4/5 and 1:25 2/5. The Derby winners hit the wire as a team. "It was a real good work for both of them," said Baffert. "They relaxed well and finished good."

THREE RING TO FLORIDA DERBY? Coming off a sensational 14 3/4-length win in Sunday's GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream, Three Ring (Notebook) may make her next start against colts in the Mar. 13 GI Florida Derby, owner Barry Schwartz said yesterday. "I'm certainly going to take a look at the Florida Derby," Schwartz said. "She's certainly competitive with the horses who ran (a day earlier) in the (GI) Fountain of Youth. She ran faster than they did." Schwartz said that he was impressed by the 105 Beyer speed figure given to Three Ring in her race, which was far better than the 96 figure given to Fountain of Youth winner Vicar (Wild Again). Three Ring is not yet a Triple Crown nominee but Schwartz said he will supplement her if she shows she belongs in the Kentucky Derby. "I'm going to talk it over with (trainer) Eddie (Plesa Jr.)," Schwartz said. "Our original plan was to run her back in the Bonnie Miss and then go for the Kentucky Oaks. We could go in the Florida Derby and the Oaks or, if she were to run well in the Florida Derby, we'd have to seriously think about the Kentucky Derby." Three Ring, third in last vear's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, was wearing blinkers for the first time in the Davona Dale.

RECORD BREEDERS' CUP FOAL NOMINATIONS

A record 14,062 foals were nominated to the Breeders' Cup program last year. That 1998 total tops the previous year's high of 12,751. Breeders' Cup Ltd. officials also announced that 1,232 stallions were nominated to the Breeders' Cup for the 1999 breeding season, the highest in five years. The 14,062 foals by Breeders' Cup and European Breeders' Fund nominated stallions represent a 10.28-percent increase over 1997 and a 33.3-percent increase since 1995. It was the sixth consecutive year that the number of foals nominated has increased from the previous year. "We are extremely pleased with our record-setting season and the sustained growth in both foal and stallion nominations," said D.G. Van Clief, Jr., president of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "Nomination is essential to fund the purses for the Breeders' Cup Championship and the National Stakes program as well as the marketing and television initiatives which Breeders' Cup underwrites. We extend our thanks to breeders and owners around the world for their continued support."
