Behrens, winless in seven starts since taking the GII Pegasus H. in September, 1997, had shown flashes of his old self as of late with a pair of second-place finishes in his last two outings--the GIII Broward H. Jan. 9 and the GI Donn H. Jan. 30. Sent off the crowd's 7-5 choice here off those efforts, the five-year-old stalked frontrunner TRULUCK (Conquistador Cielo) early, took command on the far turn and edged clear in the stretch for the popular score. It was the first Grade I victory for Behrens, who during his three-year-old campaign won the Pegasus, the GII Dwyer S. and missed Grade I glory by a nose to Deputy Commander in the GI Travers. "He's been so close (to a Grade I victory)," said winning trainer Harold James Bond after yesterday's event. "Today was his day. I know he's a good horse. I just don't think he got the respect he deserved as a three-year-old. I knew he was coming around." When asked what's next for Behrens, Bond responded, "We'll consider the (GI, \$750,000) Oaklawn H. (April 3) or the (GI) Pimlico Special (May 8). He's had three races here and he won't go in both of those races. He loves this track and our main goal is to be here for the Breeders' Cup (Nov. 6)."

Tuzla, a winner of six of her last nine races, was looking for her second straight after polishing off her '98 season with a win in the Dec. 13 GII Dahlia H. at Hollywood Park. Always near the leaders, the French-bred mare loomed up three wide at the top of the stretch and drew off under a hand ride for an authoritative win. After the victory, trainer Julio Canani commented, "She is a good filly and a great miler. She's lightly raced for a five-year-old, so I'm going to try and pick some good spots for her in the future." Canani is unsure of Tuzla's next start. "We're going to play it by ear. We don't have to run too much early in the year, you don't want to cook them this early. Besides, this filly likes time between races," he said. Winning rider Corey Nakatani added, "She's a special filly and Julio has done such a great job with her. Early in her career, she was really high-tempered and tough to rate, but I've worked her a lot and tried to get her to rate, but one of the big things is Julio has taken so much time with her, and I think she'll definitely be the top turf mare in the country."

Newly crowned 1998 Champion Three-Year-Old Filly **Banshee Breeze** (Unbridled) makes her first start here since a nose defeat in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Nov. 7. The four-year-old was seventh in her career debut in June, 1997, and has not finished off the board in 10 starts since, including a 12-length romp against her elders in last October's GI Spinster S. and a six-length triumph in the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga last August. She will have a very speedy filly to catch in the Rampart, however, in rising star **Harpia** (Danzig). The five-year-old mare came to the U.S. from France at the beginning of her 1998 campaign, and has won all five of her stateside starts in wire-to-wire fashion. In her stakes debut last out, Harpia took the Feb. 3 GII Shirley Jones H. over seven furlongs. The Rampart will be her first try over a mile. **Glitter Woman** (Glitterman), winner of four graded stakes in 1997, showed flashes of brilliance once again with a handy 6 1/4-length allowance win at Gulfstream Jan. 18 in her only outing this year. The five-year-old mare was third after setting the early fractions in last year's Rampart.

Honest Lady (Seattle Slew), the only filly in the field, is lightly raced but has showed unlimited potential in winning her only two career starts. In her last outing at Santa Anita Jan. 24, the dark bay bobbed at the start before being ridden out to win the seven-furlong GII Santa Ynez S. in 1:21 3/5. **Aristotle** (Two Punch) established himself as a major contender on the three-year-old scene when he gamely dueled undefeated Exploit down the stretch in the Feb. 6 GII San Vicente S., only to be defeated by a neck. Trainer Bob Baffert's sophomores can never be ignored, and **Prime Timber** (Sultry Song) is no exception. The Florida-bred colt has three starts under his belt. After breaking his maiden at first asking, he went on to an allowance victory in his next outing and then finishing second, beaten only a half-length, in the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 12. The bay has not started since that effort, but has posted a series of bullet works in preparation for his three-year-old debut.

LEMON DROP KID (c, 3, Kingmambo--Charming Lassie, by Seattle Slew), winner of the GI Futurity S. at Belmont Sept. 20, had not started since his fifth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs Nov. 7. The bay posted a pair of bullet works in preparation for his three-year-old debut and was heavily favored at 4-5 to win his return. He was well-placed behind the pacesetters early, reached even terms with the leaders on the far turn then drew away through the stretch while jumping over the gate tracks en route to a 3 1/2-length victory. After the race, trainer Scotty Schulhofer said Lemon Drop Kid would likely race next in the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland April 10 before a Run for the Roses in the May 1 Kentucky Derby. The winner is 1/2 to Sovereign Sage (Sovereign Dancer), SP, \$166,550; and Brulay (Rubiano), GSW, \$178,060. Lifetime Record: GISW, 7-3-2-1, \$242,469.

WHAT'S DOING DOWN UNDER

Melbourne's autumn racing carnival, with 10 Group One races worth Aus\$4.4 million (US\$2,692,778) in total, is in full swing while Sydney's carnival launch will take place Monday.

For the first time the Australian Jockey Club--which runs Randwick and Warwick Farm and has nine Group 1 races worth Aus\$5 million (\$3,059,976)--and the Sydney Turf Club will combine forces. The generally more progressive STC, which runs Rosehill and Canterbury, has as the centerpiece of a vibrant program its signature Aus\$2.5 million (\$1,529,988) Golden Slipper on Mar. 27.

The long-awaited and rather obvious move to promote racing in the Olympic city under one banner of "Sydney Racing" comes as a result of a new marketing focus in the face of dwindling raceday crowds and on-course betting turnover.

This year, there is no shortage of exciting two-year-olds with the first crops of shuttle stallions such as Baratheia (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Brocco (Kris S.), Catrail (Storm Cat) and Dehere (Deputy Minister).

The three-year-old ranks appear to be dominated at this stage by the progeny of Zabeel (NZ) (Sir Tristram)--represented by Aus\$1.2 million (\$734,394) Australian Derby prospect Dignity Dancer (NZ)--and Danehill (Danzig), represented chiefly by Victoria Derby winner Arena (Aus).

But alas, where are our weight-for-age stars?

While Australia traditionally focuses heavily on the two-year-olds, the best of whom will complete their final mission in the last major juvenile test, the G1 Champagne S. at Randwick on Apr. 17, this year's weight-for-age crop definitely lacks depth.

Fascinating New Zealand filly Grand Archway (Aus) (Archway {Ire}) has made a meal of the opposite sex in the WFA division this campaign after claiming the VRC Oaks at Flemington last spring. Trained by Graeme Rogerson, who runs stables in Sydney and New Zealand, Grand Archway has won eight of her 14 starts. She claimed the G1 Australia Day S. before lowering highly rated Bezeal Bay (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ})'s colors in the G1 Orr S.

Bezeal Bay had his first start under WFA conditions when second to French sprinter Jim And Tonic in the International Bowl in Hong Kong in December.

With Might And Power (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ})'s campaign uncertain, promising mare Greta Hall (NZ) (Kaaestad {NZ}) sidelined with a suspensory ligament problem and General Nediym (Aus) (Nediym {Ire}) retired, grand stayer Tie the Knot (Aus) (Nassipour) is poised to dominate the major WFA tests. The four-time Group 1 winner monopolized yesterday's G1 Chipping Norton S. at Warwick Farm in his third run this campaign over a more suitable trip.

Adding weight to the argument that the ranks of older horses capable of performing at WFA over eight furlongs and beyond are alarmingly thin this season is the fact the Aus\$1.25 million (\$764,994) Australian Cup (10f, Mar. 8) has attracted seven staying three-year-olds. They'll avoid Dignity Dancer in the G1 Australian Guineas. Grand Archway, Mossman (Aus) (Success Express), Danske (NZ) (Danehill), Arena and Sky Heights (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) lead the three-year-old charge.

And the two-year-olds? Watch Catbird (Aus) (Danehill), the Aus\$400,000 (\$244,798) Easter sale graduate raced by Guam-based US businessman Ken Jones. He's the first Danehill ever to come the way of personable Canberra trainer Frank Cleary and he might prove to be the best of this year's crop by the supersire judging by his 5 1/2-length Black Opal Preview win last weekend. The last top horse Cleary prepared in Jones's colors was Clan O'Sullivan, who won the same race seven years earlier before going on to an unlucky second to Burst in the Golden Slipper S. Fellow Danehill colt Dangerous (Aus), closely related to 10-time Group 1 winner Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) via his dam Antwerp (NZ) (Sir Tristram {Ire}), can't be overlooked in Golden Slipper calculations, but it is his stablemate Align (Night Shift) who currently dominates discussion.

His immediate goal is the G1 VRC Sires' Produce S. on Mar. 13. Brocco youngster Charm Scene Land (Aus) was among the most highly rated Slipper contenders but his campaign is in doubt with a race eve withdrawal from the Blue Diamond due to a virus.
