FASIG-TIPTON CALDER SALE STARTS TODAY With a catalogue that offers 347 juveniles by such outstanding sires as A.P. Indy, Danzig, Deputy Minister, End Sweep, Gone West, Gulch, Mr. Prospector, Seattle Slew, Seeking the Gold, Storm Cat and Woodman, the Fasig-Tipton Calder Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale gets underway in Miami today. Highlights of the auction include Hip #93, the only Storm Cat in the catalogue, who worked two furlongs in a bullet :21 1/5 during the Feb. 21 Under Tack Show at Calder. From the Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds consignment, the colt is out of MSP Real Jenny (Valid Appeal), making him a half-brother to MGSW Ifyoucouldseemenow (Tunerup) and stakes winners Doyouseewhatisee (Barachois) and Novi'veseenitall (Exuberant). Hip #152, a colt by Deputy Minister out of Take Lady Anne (Queen City Lad) should also attract attention. Consigned by M.W. Miller III, agent, the dark bay is a full brother to GISW Salt Lake and a half to MSW and GISP Bold Lady Anne (Bold Josh). Hip #171 is the first foal from GISW Two Altazano (Manzotti) by Seeking the Gold, also from Hartley/DeRenzo Thoroughbreds. Seattle Slew is represented by four colts and two fillies, including Hip #221, a half brother to GISW Spectacular Tide (Tsunami Slew) from Wycombe House Stud, John Woelfel, agent; and Hip #251, a half brother to GISW Well Chosen (Deputy Minister) and GSW In Contention (Devil's Bag) from Niall Brennan Stables, Inc., agent. The lone Mr. Prospector sells as Hip #291. Consigned by M.W. Miller III, agent, the filly is out of SW and MGISP Dream Touch (Riverman). Attracting attention yesterday with their workouts was hip #138, a colt by Danzig out of the graded stakes winning mare Statuette (Pancho Villa) who went an eighth in :10 2/5 and hip #50, a colt by End Sweep out of multiple stakes winner Nany's Appeal (Valid Appeal). That one went a quarter in :21 3/5 and is a half sister to stakes winner Our Dear Ruth (Baldski). Bidding for Monday's opening session, Hips #1-100, begins at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday's second and final session starts at noon, with Chip (Norquestor), a graded stakes winner of \$448,032, selling prior to the session. The six-year-old, who is being offered as a racing or broodmare prospect, last won the Feb. 14

As they rounded the far turn, Banshee Breeze advanced to engage Glitter Woman two furlongs out, then drew away easily leaving the eighth pole and cruised to victory. Attesting to the easy of the win, Jockey Jerry Bailey said, "I never cocked my whip. She's awesome." The future for Glitter Woman, who is booked to be bred to Storm Cat, is up in the air, according to trainer Shug McGaughey. Nafzger said the winner will go in the Apr. 9 GI Apple Blossom at Oaklawn.

All horses are bound to encounter a few rough trips, but few in their entire career will experience as much adversity as Desert Hero had to overcome to win yesterday's San Rafael S. Add to that it was only his second career outing, his first start around two turns, and his first in stakes company, and the colt's victory over some highly regarded Derby contenders looks even more impressive. Desert Hero's first start came only three weeks ago, when he took a 61/2-furlong Santa Anita maiden by two lengths. The 10-1 fifth choice, the son of the 1993 Kentucky Derby winner tracked the leaders in fourth while saving ground early and, entering the far turn, was just looking for a gap to shoot through. As the pacesetters collapsed, the colt was forced to check sharply at the eighth pole, was yanked to the far outside while losing precious ground and then came on with a late surge to just nip Prime Timber at the wire. Jockey Corey Nakatani said, "I was taking a chance trying to go through there, and the hole just closed up. But I just moved him to the outside and he put in a big kick like I thought he would." Trainer Wally Dollase said that Desert Hero's belated start was caused by an infection in his toe that took three months to clear up. "I felt he could be a Derby horse because he does everything right. He's a fast, intelligent horse that's bred to go long. I think if he'd have had a cleaner trip, he would have won fairly handily." Runner-up Prime Timber was four wide on both turns and did well to finish second. Favored Honest Lady (Seattle Slew) pressed a fast pace and was only beat a length.

Redoute's Choice Wins G1 Blue Diamond S.:

Three-time Australian champion sire Danehill's name has been less ubiquitous in Australia's emerging list of top autumn two-year-olds, but the grand stallion reclaimed centrestage yesterday with his colt Redoute's Choice winning the G1 Blue Diamond S. (6f.) at Melbourne's Caulfield racetrack. Danehill two-year-olds have easily dominated in recent seasons but this year he's had to contend with the first crops from a plethora of classy shuttle newcomers. The Rick Hore-Lacytrained colt had been suffering from shin soreness and did not make his race debut until only a week ago when he won the 5½-furlong Veuve Clicquot S. Hore-Lacy predicted the colt would be the best he'd ever train--a big statement considering he prepared the brilliant two-year-old Canny Lad. Coming from the outside barrier in the 15-horse field, the 8-1 Redoute's Choice was on the pace throughout to beat 2-1 favorite Testa Rossa (Red Ransom) by two lengths with Dangerous (Danehill) a further 1 1/4 lengths away in third. Redoute's Choice is the first foal out of Shantha's Choice (Dancing Show), who is a three-quarter sister to the outstanding previous Blue Diamond winner Hurricane Sky (Aus) (Star Watch {Aus}) and a half-sister to Umatilla (NZ) (Miswaki), both successful sires. Redoute's Choice has firmed from 20-1 to 4-1 favouritism for the six furlong Golden Slipper on March 27 ahead of Catbird (Danehill), who is listed at 7-1. In Sydney, Easy Rocking (Barathea (Ire)) firmed from 150-1 to 20-1 after winning the 5½-furlong Kindergarten S. impressively from odds-on favourite Align in a shock result. "It was a bit of an ask to throw him into the deep end like this but he's come through very well," said trainer Ron Quinton, who rode Align's dam Twiglet (Twig Moss {Fr}) when he was a jockey. He confirmed Easy Rocking will target the Slipper but added, "You never know with two-year-olds, they're here one day and gone tomorrow. If he shows me he's not going to cope we'll have to have a rethink."
