RECORD OPENING NIGHT FOR FASIG-TIPTON

CALDER The bull market for Thoroughbred auctions continued in south Florida yesterday, as record numbers were posted at the first session of the Fasig-Tipton Calder Two-Year-Olds In Training Sale. Gross receipts skyrocketed 69 percent from last year, the average figure was up 66 percent and the median checked in on the upside by 61 percent. "We had every expectation that the sale would go well," reported Fasig-Tipton Director of Marketing Terence Collier, "But it would have been impossible to predict it would be up this much. It was very solid, particularly as the buybacks were down." Topping the first session was a colt by Unbridled out of the multiple stakes winning mare Remarkably Easy (Regal Remark). Signing the ticket for \$950,000 were Bob and Beverly Lewis, who were accompanied by trainer Bob Baffert. "I really like this horse," said Baffert. "He's got the goods and he's a classic type of horse." Team Valor, headed by Barry Irwin, went to \$800,000 for a colt by Kris S. out of Patchiano (Fappiano). "This is the most expensive horse we ever bought. We really liked the way he moved," said Irwin. The colt, whose dam is a half sister to leading sire Broad Brush, will be sent to New York to be trained by John Terranova. "He's a nice, big colt. Classy looking," said Terranova, "He has a lot of maturing and growing up to do." Today's final session begins at noon with the sale of Chip (Norquestor) as a racing or broodmare prospect.

Florida Derby Happenings:

Trainer Manny Tortora has declared his GIII Spectacular Bid S. runner-up Valid Trefaire (Valid Appeal) a likely starter in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 13. The bay rebounded from a poor effort two back with a sharp 7 3/4-length victory in a seven furlong allowance Feb.12. Tortora said, "I worked him last Saturday and he went a mile (at Calder) in 1:40 2/5. It was a dynamite work and it looks like he wants to go a distance of ground." A pair of other Derby contenders worked out yesterday. GI Fountain of Youth second Cat Thief (Storm Cat) drilled five panels in 1:02 and third-place finisher Certain (Out of Place) went the same distance in 1:02 2/5 over the Calder strip. Trainer John Kimmel indicated that Successful Appeal (Valid Appeal), fifth in the Fountain of Youth, will ship back to New York for the GIII Gotham Mar. 21, instead of running in the Florida Derby.

On the Gulfstream Backstretch:

GI Hopeful S. winner Lucky Roberto (Belong To Me), sixth to Valid Trefaire in his return to the races Feb. 12, continues to train forwardly for an appearance in the GIII Swale S. at seven furlongs on the Florida Derby undercard. The New York-bred went six furlongs yesterday in 1:14 3/5 with jockey Mike Smith aboard... Trainer Elliott Walden is hoping for a solid return performance from Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance) in Wednesday's third race. "He's been working very well. He's always run well off a layoff. The only thing that might get him is the distance (1 1/6 mile)." Plans call for the 1998 Belmont winner to contest the Mar. 28 GI Dubai World Cup in his following start.... Frisk Me Now (Mister Frisky), who passed on last weekend's GI Gulfstream Park H., will run in Sunday's GIII New Orleans H., confirmed trainer Bob Durso. "The timing of the race is good and 'Frisky' is doing great. He was very tough on the track this morning.

A census report by the United States Department of Agriculture ranked Marion County, Florida as the top in the nation for 1997 by number of horses in ponies on its farms. A total of 17,205 horses and ponies were counted. "We have long called ourselves the horse capital of the world and this just validates that," said Richard E. Hancock, executive vice president of the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders and Owners Association.

In these days of larger books of mares, many popular stallions cover 80 or mares per season and Woodman has even exceeded the 170-mare mark. In such a climate it is easy to forget that not all stallions have been allowed this type of advantage, one notable example being Pleasant Colony, the Champion Three-Year-Old of 1981. In his early years at Buckland Farm, this very tall son of His Majesty covered books of only 40 mares until the limit was raised to 50 in the 1990 season. Consequently, Pleasant Colony had only 468 foals of racing age by the time he turned 20 last year. Compare this figure to the 759 foals sired by Danzig, who retired to stud only one year earlier, and you get some idea of the numerical disadvantage Pleasant Colony has labored under.

Fortunately, the quality of Pleasant Colony's offspring has more than made up for his comparative lack of numbers and he added another Grade I winner to his account when Behrens finally returned to winning form in the Gulfstream Park H. last Saturday. The five-year-old Behrens follows St. Jovite, Pleasant Tap, Pleasant Stage, Colonial Affair, Sir Beaufort, Pleasant Variety, Colonial Waters, Shared Interest, Roanoke and Cherokee Colony as Pleasant Colony's 11th Grade I winner in a major country. The Lane's End resident has over 60 stakes winners to his credit, a figure which puts him among the top ten U.S. sires in order of percentage of stakes winners.

These achievements have provided the perfect answer to the breeders who originally questioned whether Pleasant Colony had what it takes to develop into a leading sire. Of course, there were no doubts about his ability as a racehorse. He had come close to completing the Triple Crown, but there were concerns about his plain and leggy physique and his pedigree, which was noticeably lacking in fashionable names. We now know that it has been Pleasant Colony's outcross pedigree which has been one of his main assets, allowing him to sire a large number of foals from mares by Northern Dancer line stallions. He sired Cherokee Colony, Colonial Affair and Risen Colony from daughters of Nijinsky II, St Jovite and Lac Ouimet from a daughter of Northfields and Colonial Minstrel from a mare by The Minstrel, plus other graded stakes winners from mares by Sovereign Dancer and Northern Baby.

Behrens is another of his good winners out of a granddaughter of Northern Dancer, but his broodmare sire, Mari's Book, isn't nearly as well known as the likes of Nijinsky II and The Minstrel. Mari's Book never managed to win a stakes race in a 17-race career, but the Northern Dancer phenomenon earned him his chance at stud. Mari's Book succeeded in siring several animals better than himself, including Double Booked, one of the leading turf performers of 1991 with five graded stakes victories, and Behrens' dam Hot Novel.

Hot Novel won a couple of Grade III events at around seven furlongs in California and one of her finest efforts was her second to Open Mind in the 1989 GI Acorn S. at one mile. Behrens' second dam, Quite Honestly, and third dam, Tesao, never raced but his fourth dam, Cam Axe, was a smart juvenile, winning the Golden Rod S. in 1972.

In selecting Pleasant Colony as a mate for Hot Novel, Joanne Nor created 3 \times 5 inbreeding to the mighty Ribot, through His Majesty and Maribeau. Sir Beaufort, the GI Santa Anita H. winner, is another son of Pleasant Colony inbred 3 \times 5 to Ribot and Midway Lady, winner of the 1000 Guineas and Oaks in England, is also inbred to Ribot with one of the legs coming through His Majesty.
