VICTORY GALLOPS IN RETURN GI Belmont S. winner Victory Gallop (Cryptoclearance) easily handled four foes to win yesterday's third race at Gulfstream. It was the four-year-old's first race since finishing fourth in last year's Breeders' Cup Classic. Victory Gallop was the first horse to finish in front of 1997 Horse of the Year Favorite Trick while winning the GII Arkansas Derby and went on to run second to Real Quiet in both the Kentucky Derby and the Preakness before turning the tables on that rival with a narrow win in the Belmont. The bay Canadian-bred trailed the field in yesterday's 1 1/16-mile allowance, angled out four wide entering the backstretch and, after taking charge at the top of the stretch, drew off under a hand ride to win by 2 3/4 lengths. "You always worry a little bit when a horse is coming off a layoff," explained trainer Elliott Walden after the win. "This is not his best distance, but he has always run well for me." Walden said Victory Gallop would ship to Dubai on Mar. 14 in anticipation of the Mar. 28 G1 Dubai World Cup.

FLAMINGO HIGHLIGHTS HIALEAH SEASON

The \$250,000 GIII Flamingo S. is among seven graded events which decorate Hialeah Park's \$1.655 million 1999 stakes schedule. The 68th renewal of the Flamingo is scheduled for Apr. 3 and the race will be broadcast live on ABC Sports. The 1998 juvenile champion Answer Lively (Lively One), Breeders' Cup runnerup Aly's Alley (Alwuhush) and GI Champagne S. victor The Groom is Red (Runaway Groom) are among the 56 early nominations for the nine-furlong Flamingo. The \$100,000 Gill Everglades S. will be run Mar. 20 and the \$200,000 GII Hialeah Turf Cup will be run Apr. 17. The remaining graded stakes are, the Apr. 10 \$200,000 GII Black Helen H., the Mar. 20 \$200,000 GIII Widener H., the Mar. 28 \$100,000 GIII Bougainvillea H. and the May 1 \$75,000 Royal Palm H. The Florida track's 60day racing season runs from Mar. 17 through May 22.

American Spirit, third in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. last November, finished second in his turf debut in the Feb. 19 Pirate Cove S. last time out. Rated in third while racing along the hedge, the colt began challenging for the lead from the inside at midstretch and held on determinedly for a narrow victory. "He broke sharply, but the two speed horses ran away from us early and it set up very nicely for us," explained winning rider Emile Ramsammy. "We had a chance to sit and wait until we crossed the dirt and then pick it up from there. Approaching the stretch, I was contemplating going out and around them, but when those two horses went out, it was perfect and my horse just dived right in there, and from there he was very game to the wire." Winning trainer Bob Baffert added, "I've been here 10 years and that's the first stakes I've won down this hill. At least we've found out he likes the turf."

Valenzuela Arrested for Robbery:

Former jockey Patrick Valenzuela was charged Tuesday with robbing a cab driver of \$150 at gunpoint, according to the Associated Press. Valenzuela, 36, who currently lives in El Monte, California, was arrested by Los Angeles County sheriff's deputies Friday, two days after he allegedly held up a taxi driver in Rosemead, the AP reports. If convicted, he faces a maximum of 16 years in prison, six for the robbery and 10 for the handgun-use allegation, the report stated. In 1989, Valenzuela tested positive for cocaine. The following year, he was suspended for six months by the California Horse Racing Board for refusing to take a drug test. He also underwent substance abuse rehabilitation as a condition of returning to racing in 1991. He was arrested in October, 1997 for investigation of spousal abuse against his third wife, and has not ridden since 1997.

HANDING OVER THE REINS? By Bill Handleman

Herb McCauley is not kidding himself. He's watching all the big three-year-old races, he's seeing other riders come back from injuries, he's getting antsy, he's feeling the tug. But he's not kidding himself.

McCauley turns 42 the day after the Kentucky Derby this year. Not old, but not young either, not for a guy in his line of work.

Seven months ago, on July 10, the filly he was riding in the fourth race at Monmouth Park got cut off going into the clubhouse turn. McCauley could see it coming. He tried to warn the apprentice on the other filly, the one who was cutting him off, but she kept angling in, taking away his path. Soon it was too late. His filly stumbled, pitching him forward, sending him flying through the air, tumbling and twisting, until finally he came crashing down to earth, landing in a whole new world of pain.

This can happen to 110-pound men who ride 1,000-pound horses. Even men who've been in the business for 25 years, like Herb McCauley, men who've ridden in over 23,000 races and won more than 3,000 of them. One day an apprentice loses control of her mount, the next day an old pro is lying in the hospital, his leg smashed from knee to ankle, his body battered and bruised beyond anything he had ever known.

"I got beat up pretty good at Aqueduct in 1991, broke nine ribs and punctured a lung," he recalled a few days later from his hospital bed at Monmouth Medical Center. "This just updated me on how much pain you could be in."

Meanwhile, the orthopedic surgeon who operated on him, Dr. Chris Johnson, called this "the type of injury that can sometimes result in the loss of a leg."

Now, seven months later, after 2 1/2 months of intense rehabilitation, McCauley "can walk around without hardly any limp at all...that was a major concern of mine, that I might not be able to walk properly again."

The old flexibility is no longer there, though. He's back to 70-75 percent, he says, but that's not good enough to even begin thinking about race riding.

Then there's the weight problem. McCauley got up to 150 during his recovery. After 2 1/2 months of rehab he's down to 135. But most of the added weight remains in his legs. Therein lies the dilemma: If he loses the weight in his legs, he can't compensate for the loss of flexibility, which would mean he could no longer walk properly.

"When I weighed 110 I was nothing but a stack of bones, basically," he says. "To be 5-6 and weigh 110, you have to be nutritionally deprived, that's all there is to it."

Yet that's how it has to be on the racetrack, where the slightest slip-up by an apprentice can put a man in the hospital. On the racetrack you have to have it both ways, strength and flexibility.

The last couple of weeks, for the first time in 25 years, McCauley has been thinking about what it might be like, not being a jockey anymore. He is a natural for racetrack management, being one of those rare modern athletes who always understood the importance of public relations. That's one fall-back position. Another is the course he's taking in April, out in California, to get his certification to become a steward.

But he still has to get through all those Derby preps, watching Gary Stevens return after knee surgery, hearing about Nick Santagata coming back from a broken leg.

All the while remembering how he got Coax Me Chad up for second behind Swale in the 1984 Derby...how War, who got put up in the Blue Grass, had such a horrible trip in the 1987 Derby, Alysheba's year...how Lost Mountain, making his move, was forced into the rail in the 1991 Derby, the year Strike the Gold ran them all down.

Herb McCauley's not kidding himself, though.
"When you have a true love for what you do, it's
hard to think about never doing it again," he says.
"But right now I'd have to say there's more chance
that I won't be riding again than there is a chance
that I will be."
