Puerto Madero (Gallantsky) has done everything right in his last two starts. He proved himself clearly the best in the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Dec. 20, winning by an easy 21/2 lengths, then scored a commanding win over Behrens in the GI Donn at Gulfstream Jan. 30. Behrens subsequently came back to take the GI Gulfstream Park H. last Saturday. Event of the Year (Seattle Slew) has gradually improved with every start since coming back in December from an injury which left him short of Derby glory. The four-year-old most recently attended a scorching pace then drew off to a 2 3/4-length victory in the GII Strub S. Feb. 6. Silver Charm (Silver Buck) has been on a long campaign, without a break since September. He began 1999 with a strong closing victory in the GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita Jan. 10, then finished third from the far outside post in Puerto Madero's Donn H. He was as sharp as a horse can be in his most recent workout, blazing five furlongs in :57 Mar. 1. Free House (Smokester) came back off a 31/2-month layoff to defeat Malek (Chi) by a neck in the GII San Antonio H. Feb. 7. The winner of the GI Pacific Classic last year, he's won four of seven races at Santa Anita and has as good a chance as anyone here.

Deep Dive (Manila) has finished first or second in all 11 of his career starts. He won the Woodchopper S. at Fair Grounds three back, finished a troubled second in the GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream Jan. 23 and most recently won a Feb. 21 allowance at Gulfstream Feb. 21. African Dancer (Nijinsky II) is also remarkably consistent, with six wins from 11 starts, and has never finished out of the money. The seven-year-old is coming off a nine-month layoff. In three 1998 starts, he finished second to Buck's Boy in last year's running of this race, won the GIII Elkhorn at Keeneland in April and was second in the Louisville H. at Churchill in May. Panama City (El Gran Senor) struggled last year, finishing out of the money in all of his five starts. He began 1999 on a high note, however, with a 4 1/4-length score in the GIII Mac Diarmada H. at Gulfstream Jan. 10.

Hawksley Hill (Rahy) finished an agonizingly close second to Da Hoss in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile two back, but most recently fizzled in the GII Citation H. at Hollywood Nov. 28, making a mild move and finishing seventh. He appears to be the classiest member of this field, but bettors should heed trainer Neil Drysdale's words. "He hasn't been cranked up at all," Drysdale told Daily Racing Form. Should Hawksley Hill be slightly short, Ladies Din (Din's Dancer) might be able to get his four-year-old season off to a winning start. The bay gelding won nearly every important turf stake for sophomores in California last year until coming up short over a yielding course in the GI Hollywood Derby, where he finished fourth. Laid off since that effort, Ladies Din has been training up to this event well over the Santa Anita main track.

On his final outing, he was unplaced in the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud. With reference to his last start of the season, Head admitted, "I should not have run him as he was not at his best. You should see a different horse when he runs in the Listed Prix Montenica for three-year-olds (at Maisons-Laffitte, March 24)."

WRITERS UP

SAVORING THE MOMENT by John Lee

If any of the high-end handicappers assembled for the Sports Haven Handicapping Challenge back on Feb. 6 had managed to come up with the #9 horse in the first Aqueduct race of the contest, they could have taken the rest of the weekend off. A winning ticket on the third-time starter Barrier Free paid \$338, the highest win payout in New York since a \$434 mutuel in 1943.

"It's unbelievable he paid that much," said Barrier Free's trainer, Sue Duncan. "In his first race he broke greenly and then was down inside. His second start was on a very sloppy track."

That being said, it's not as if she was planning a trip to the winner's circle.

"Going in, I would have been happy to be fourth or fifth," she said.

Barrier Free's win was bracketed by victories from the other two horses in her tiny stable, Wallpaper on Feb. 3 and Not Exactly Monday on Feb. 10, all of which proved therapeutic for Duncan, who was coming off a career low. Her stable stalwart, Petersfield, had suffered a fatal injury in the opener at Aqueduct Jan. 27.

"He was only a \$25,000 claimer, but he was the best I had. He was a runner, one of those teeth-grabbers," she said. "I was totally devastated."

After that, Duncan admitted, "I've found this is not a game for boys in short pants."

But it seemed like a game to a young English girl who grew up around horses. Racing gave her a ticket to tour the world. First stop, France and the Shangri-La of training centers, Chantilly.

"When I was 18 I worked there for Jack Cunningham, who trained for Bunker Hunt and Jacques Wimpfheimer. I'd rub three and ride three. I was one of the first girls to work at Chantilly. The training grounds there are spectacular," she recalled.

After her stint in France she decided to cross the pond.

"In '72 or '73, in the winter, I went to work for Barry Ryan in Aiken," she said. "It was so nice--I could just ride horses and not have to muck out stalls."

With the spring would come her first taste of Belmont Park. She did make a foray into California one winter to work for Bobby Lake, who was there with Alfred Vanderbilt's horses, but most of her U.S. education came at the hands of East Coast trainers such as T.J. Kelly, Peter Howe, P.G. Johnson, Dick Destasio, and Stanley Hough, who helped her get another stamp in her passport.

"I went over to Japan with him in 1982 for the Japan Cup," she explained. "Some other American horses were invited, but couldn't go, so Half Iced was next on the list. The Japanese do a great job. There was no pressure. It was very relaxed."

At least it was until race day.

"The walking ring was surrounded with so many people, it was like going into a room with black-dotted wallpaper," she recalled.

Her memories of Japan gained added luster when Half Iced won the ultra-rich event at odds of 30-1.

The next step on Duncan's journey was to become a trainer, a career move she hadn't planned to make.

"Stanley Hough went to Florida, but left horses with me. Then I got a couple from Joe Cantey to take care of, but I found out you couldn't run horses for two trainers," Duncan said. "What could I do? They said, 'looks like you'll have to take out a trainer's license, Sue.'"

Was it the right road to take? When the off ramp leads to the winner's circle, as it did after Madame Adolphe took the 1996 running of Aqueduct's GIII Next Move H., the answer is a resounding yes. The victory was the highlight of a very good year for Duncan; with only a small string, she earned more than \$270,000.

But times have been lean lately, with only four winners over the next two seasons. The death of her pet Petersfield was nearly the end of the road.

"I was ready to pack it in," she said. "It has been terrible for the last two years."

Then came the winners. Only two months into 1999, Duncan's horses have earned more than they did during all of '98.

And no matter how many potholes she hits, there are moments that make it all worthwhile.

"You have to really like horses, you have to be truly dedicated and you have to savor the moment," she said. "No matter how bad things are, just to come in every morning, to look at the horses for the first time each day--it picks your head up."
