HOUSE ARRESTS BIG 'CAP, BECOMES CO-LEADER OF FOX SERIES A small but strong field was assembled for the second leg of the NTRA Champions on FOX series, the 62nd running of the GI Santa Anita H. It included FOX point leader and GI Donn H. winner Puerto Madero (Chi) (Gallantsky), Donn third Silver Charm (Silver Buck) and the up and coming fouryear-old Event of the Year (Seattle Slew). In the end, though, it was the oft-overlooked Free House (Smokester) who was left wearing the blanket of flowers as the winner of the Big 'Cap. Chris McCarron, aboard Free House, took advantage of what turned out to be a jockey's race, as he set a fairly comfortable pace along the rail and had enough left for the drive to hold off Event of the Year and Silver Charm. McCarron said of his trip, "He broke a bit in the air and settled into a canter as we went by the sixteenth pole for the first time. We went :23 and :47, but it felt like :50." The 20 points earned by Free House for his victory tied Puerto Madero for the lead in the Champions series. Silver Charm is in second with a total of 16 points and Event of the Year gained 12 points for his second-place finish to claim third in the series. The Apr. 3 Gl Oaklawn H. is next up in the 10-race series, with the June 27 Gl Hollywood Gold Cup the next "Champions" race.

REAL QUIET SET TO MAKE SOME NOISE
TODAY Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner Real
Quiet (Quiet American) will make his first start since
last year's GI Belmont S. when he runs in the GIII New
Orleans H. at Fair Grounds today. The four-year-old is
best remembered for his courageous stretch run in the
Belmont, where he missed winning the Triple Crown by
a nose to Victory Gallop. Owner Mike Pegram told Daily
Racing Form, "I'm just happy he's back on track. Now
we just have to make back some of that \$5 million we
missed." Pegram was referring to the \$5 million bonus
his horse would have received if he had won the Triple
Crown. If all goes well here, Real Quiet could earn
himself a ticket to Dubai for the G1 World Cup.

Free House returned from a four-month rest to take the GII San Antonio H. over this track Feb. 7, his only prep for this event. Taking advantage of moderate fractions, jockey Chris McCarron put Free House on the lead and nursed the pace as Event of the Year followed three wide with Silver Charm tucked in fourth. As they entered the stretch, Free House was on cruise control along the rail with challengers coming on the outside. However, the San Antonio winner was always in front and able to hang on to the wire. Winning trainer Paco Gonzalez said, "The horse was going easy. I was a little worried when Event of the Year made that move. But he was so relaxed out there. He is really tough in the lane." Gonzalez indicated that he would see how Free House came out of the race before making a decision on a next start. Silver Charm's trainer Bob Baffert said, "He had no place to go. Every time he tried to get out, they'd close it up on him. That happens. We'll see how he comes out of it before we decide what's next." Of Silver Charm's performance, jockey Gary Stevens said, "(Chris McCarron) dictated the pace and played cat and mouse with us throughout the race. He ran his race...l mean, he was still coming at the end and he's got a great will to win. We just couldn't get there soon enough." GI Donn H. winner Puerto Madero put in a puzzlingly poor effort, running fifth. "He broke, ran for 40 yards, got into a canter and stayed in one," reported jockey Kent Desormeaux. Trainer Dick Mandella added, "It didn't look like he had his mind on his job early in

Unite's Big Red is one of those horses that is always hanging around versus top company and sometimes, when things go right, he pulls off an upset. Such was the case when he took the GIII Tropical Turf H. by a nose at Calder three starts back Nov. 28. He came back to run third in both the GIII Canadian Turf H. Jan. 23 and the Gl Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. Feb. 6. Racing in perfect position behind the fast pace being set by Deep Dive (Manila) and African Dancer, the chestnut gelding angled three wide at the top of the stretch, closed gamely in the lane and edged away to Eclipse Buck's Boy's track record time. "(Trainer) Randy Mills told me he hadn't had him any better," said jockey Mike Smith. "He told me after that last race that he's really training good." Jerry Bailey, rider of the runner-up, said, "My horse was going along comfortably, but I couldn't let a quality horse like Deep Dive go off alone on the lead. I had to go with him."

The first major turf mile event of the year on the left coast drew a solid field, including 1998 GI Breeders' Cup Mile runner-up Hawksley Hill and California's top grass Three-Year-Old of last year Ladies Din. Lord Smith, on the other hand, was something of an unknown commodity. The winner of six of eight starts in Europe for Martin Pipe, the four-year-old has really come to hand in his two 1999 outings, taking a Jan. 2 down-the-hill event by a nose and following that effort with a hard-fought, wire-to-wire victory at this trip Jan. 29. As the gates opened, jockey Garrett Gomez was able to secure a spot on the rail, some six lengths behing dueling front-runners for the opening four furlongs. As the field reached the top of the stretch, Lord Smith loomed into contention with Hawksley Hill breathing down his neck. The two ran on to the wire, with Hawksley Hill puting a head in front, but Lord Smith responded courageously and ended up a head better. "When I asked this gelding to dig, it took a lot for him to dig, get his momentum and get by that other horse. He really gave me 100 percent," said winning jockey Garrett Gomez. Neil Drysdale, trainer of the runner-up, said, "(Hawksley Hill) ran super. He got a little tired in the last few jumps, but this will help him for his next race. We'll run in the (Mar. 28, GIII) Explosive Bid at the Fair Grounds."

Big Jag finished second to Kona Gold in their first start of the year, the El Conejo H. Jan. 3, then came back to get a head win last time in the GII Palos Verdes H. Jan. 30. With Kona Gold and Dramatic Gold setting a slow pace early, Big Jag assumed a stalking position on the outside. The six-year-old gelding bid three deep and got bumped coming out of the turn, gained a short lead in midstretch, bumped lightly with Kona Gold late and prevailed by a half length. Following an inquiry, it was determined that Dramatic Gold caused the bumping on the turn and the incident in deep stretch was deemed insignificant. "This horse, he actually could probably be on the lead if I let him, but that would take something away from his run at the end," said jockey Jose Valdivia, Jr. "I'm still in awe of what he does."


