FULL FIELD FOR FLORIDA DERBY A field of 10 colts and one filly was entered Wednesday for Saturday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park. James Tafel's Vicar (Wild Again), winner of the Feb. 20 GI Fountain of Youth, drew post position five and was installed the 3-1 morning-line favorite. In his final prep for Saturday's \$750,000 event, Vicar worked five furlongs Tuesday at Gulfstream in 1:00 4/5. After the move, trainer Carl Nafzger proclaimed, "We're ready. We'll have no excuses come Saturday." The second choice in the field of 11 is Overbrook Farm's Cat Thief (Storm Cat), who will be starting from post position two. The colt, third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, most recently ran second to Vicar in the Fountain of Youth. The lone filly entered in the race, Three Ring (Notebook) may not make into the gate. "The outside post position certainly doesn't enhance her chances," trainer Eddie Plesa, Jr. said after his charge drew post position 10 yesterday. "I'll talk it over with owner Barry (K.) Schwartz and we'll decide whether we want to run her in the Florida Derby or scratch her from the race." No filly has ever won the Florida Derby. Trainer T.V. Smith sent his Florida Derby hopeful Grits'n Hard Toast (Bates Motel) out for a half-mile work yesterday at Gulfstream. The GIII Holy Bull S. winner completed the work in :48 3/5 and breaks from the eight hole Saturday. Valid Trefaire (Valid Appeal) worked a half mile at Calder Tuesday in :49 2/5. A front-running winner of a seven-furlong allowance in his last start, Valid Trefaire drew post one for the Florida Derby. Scheduled post time for the 48th running of the Florida Derby is 5:41 p.m. and the race will be televised live on ABC-TV as part of the "Road to the Visa Triple Crown Challenge."



French owner-breeder Fabien Ouaki, who has a large string of horses in training in France with Philippe Demercastel and a handful with Californiabased Ron McAnally, was attacked and beaten at his home last Sunday night in front of his wife and three children. Ouaki, owner of the department store chain Tati, was tied up by seven intruders who also bound his family and one of his employees. After a prolonged ordeal, lasting approximately four hours, the burglars left the house with a quantity of jewelry and cash. The Ouaki family are in a state of shock as local police continue their investigations. McAnally trains GSW Bonapartiste (Fr) (Kendor {Fr}) for Ouaki.

Jump jockey Dean Gallagher and his Flat counterpart Ray Cochrane were released yesterday without charge and cleared from Britain's long-running police investigation into horse doping and alleged race fixing, while trainer Graham Bradley has been re-bailed. Meanwhile, British police charged five men, including professional gambler Glen Robert Gill, with conspiring to defraud bookmakers and gamblers by the "interference with the fair running of horses in horse racing by the administration of a performance-inhibiting drug." The quintet were released on bail to appear at Bow Street Magistrates Court later this month. The stewards of the Jockey Club are to consider whether to take any action against the five charged, which could mean excluding them from all racecourses and training yards.
